TABLE 7.03 Division of Fire, Chronological History: 1900 to 2011***Prior to the establishment of the Henrico County Division of Fire***

Early 1900's	<p>Fire protection was provided by fire brigades, community hose reels and the City of Richmond.</p> <p>The Ginter Park Community Hose Reel established a Board of Fire Commissioners and built a fire station on Chamberlayne Avenue. This area was annexed by the City of Richmond in 1914.</p>
1920's	A private ownership hose reel located on Libbie Avenue was owned by John Dicks who received calls on his personal telephone and responded from his garage.
1927	The Windsor Farms Community Fire Department was formed with one man on duty 24 hours per day. This formation was used as a marketing tool to sell homes in the community.
February 19, 1930	A subscription service was established with the Royal Fire and Water Service Company to provide fire protection out of a station located on Williamsburg Road. The subscription rates were \$0.50 per month for subscribers and \$50.00 per call for non-subscribers.
September 11, 1930	Station 1 (corresponding with sanitary district 1) was established at Maple Avenue near Patterson Avenue. This station was known as the Westhampton Station and was staffed by 3 paid firefighters and 25 volunteers.
March 1934	The General Assembly provides for the establishment of fire zones within the counties and levying of taxes to support fire departments.
1934	An agreement was reached with the City of Richmond to provide fire protection to portions of the County at a rate of \$50.00 per response for the first hour and \$25.00 for each additional hour.
1936	Taxes were levied in Westhampton, Fulton Hill, and Ginter Park to support firefighting efforts.
July 1941	Station 5 begins operations out of the converted Lakeside Presbyterian Church on Lakeside Avenue.
August 1941	A Sandston-Highland Springs station opened at the intersection of Nine Mile Road and Holly Street.
January 1942	The City of Richmond annexed the Westhampton Station on Maple Avenue. This station became City fire station 19.
September 27, 1943	P. L. Burnett was named as the Acting Chief of all Henrico County fire departments working under the Road Department. At this time, two fire stations were providing all county fire protection with assistance from the City of Richmond in particular areas.
1948	The Glenwood Farms Volunteer Fire Department was organized on Mechanicsville Turnpike.
1949	The Glenwood Farms fire station was annexed into sanitary district 7 and 2 paid firefighters were hired.
October, 1949	The Tuckahoe Fire Department was organized in sanitary district 8. The station was built on Patterson Avenue. *This was the first facility in the county built for use as a fire station.

TABLE 7.03 Division of Fire, Chronological History: 1900 to 2011

1951	P. L. Burnett became the first Fire Chief for Henrico County Fire Department. At that time, there were 13 paid firefighters and approximately 100 volunteers.
1952	The Henrico County Division of Fire was established and removed from the supervision of the Road Department.
<i>After the establishment of the Henrico County Division of Fire</i>	
August 1956	The Eastover Gardens Fire Department opens on Cambrai Avenue as station 16. This station later becomes station 6 and the fire maintenance shop.
1961	The first fire prevention position is established within the Henrico County Division of Fire.
May 19, 1962	Fire Station 10 opened.
July 1, 1962	A County-wide fire department is established abolishing the sanitary districts.
September 14, 1962	One telephone number is established going to Dabbs House to report all fires.
November 1, 1962	R. C. Gilman is appointed as Fire Chief. Chief Burnette becomes the Civil Defense Coordinator.
1964	Fire Stations 4, 7, 9 and 11 are built and staffed.
1969	Fire Station 6 is built on Laburnum Avenue.
1970	Fire Station 1 is built on Carolina Avenue.
1971	Fire Station 2 is built on Darbytown Road.
December 3, 1971	Walter Stickel is appointed as Fire Chief.
1971	Mutual aid agreements are established with neighboring jurisdictions.
1972	Fire Station 12 is built on West End Drive.
1976	Henrico County fire trucks become lime green in color.
December 28, 1983	John A. Bowes is appointed as Fire Chief.
1985	Fire Station 13 is built on Church Road
1987	Fire Station 14 is built on Memorial Drive.
1987	The Office of Emergency Services was established within the Division of Fire to provide for disaster preparedness and SARA Title III compliance.
July 1, 1988	The Division of Fire begins significant EMS response as a part of its primary mission.
1988	Fire Rescue 6 is placed in service at fire station 6 as a BLS unit. Fire Rescue 5 placed in service at fire station 5 as a BLS unit.
1989	Fire Station 15 is built on Mountain Road.
1992	Fire Station 16 is built on Shady Grove Road. Fire Station 17 is built on Gaskins Road.
August 1994	Mark W. Light is appointed as Fire Chief
1994	Fire Medic 6 and Fire Medic 5 begin responding as ALS units.
1997	Fire Medic 7 placed in service at fire station 7.
2000	Ronald Mastin is appointed as Fire Chief.
2000	Fire Medic 14 is placed in service at fire station 14. Fire Medic 16 is placed in service at fire station 16.
