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The meeting was called to order by the Chairman at 7:02 p.m. Mr. Kaechele welcomed everyone to the meeting at the new location in the east end. He noted that the Board Room at the Government Center was being upgraded with new technology and that the Board would return there after the first of the year. Mr. Kaechele further noted that the next Board meeting on December 9 would again be held at the Glen Echo Building.

Mr. Kaechele led the Board, staff, and public in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Rev. Angelo V. Chatmon, Pastor, Pilgrim Journey Baptist Church, provided the invocation.

### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mrs. O'Bannon stated that she had not received a copy of the draft minutes from the November 12, 2008 meeting and asked if a copy was available for her to read during the next few minutes pending a temporary deferral by the Board. Mr. Lawrence responded that the draft minutes were loaded on the Board's laptop computers at their seats and that a copy had been sent to members of the Board in the previous day's Board packets. He said he could not explain why Mrs. O'Bannon had not received this information. Mr. Kaechele advised that the Board could temporarily defer action on the minutes and would move forward with the agenda.

#### MANAGER'S COMMENTS

For the 27th consecutive year, the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) of the United States and Canada has awarded the County with the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting for the County's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report. This award is the highest form of recognition in the area of governmental accounting and financial reporting and is highly regarded by Moody's, Standard & Poor's, and Fitch Investors Service as an indication of good financial management. Mr. Kaechele presented a plaque from GFOA to John Vithoulkas, Director of Finance, and Clarence Daniel, Accounting Division Manager. The Accounting Division of the Department of Finance was primarily responsible for preparing the award-winning report.

For the 20<sup>th</sup> consecutive year, the County has received the Distinguished Budget Presentation Award from GFOA after the County's budget document was reviewed and rated favorably by an expert panel of independent budget professionals. This award reflects the commitment of many individuals to meeting the highest standards of governmental budgeting and also reflects the leadership and support of elected and appointed officials as well as the expertise, professionalism, and many hours of hard work by staff. Mr. Kaechele presented a plaque from GFOA to Mr. Vithoulkas; Gene Walter, Management and Budget Division Director; and Teresa Spouse, Secretary. The entire staff in the Office of Management and Budget played a key role in the development of the County's budget.

### **BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' COMMENTS**

Mr. Kaechele recognized Thomas Branin, the County Planning Commission's Three Chopt District Representative, who was in the audience observing the meeting.

Mr. Thornton noted that the Glen Echo Building is the site where the Board of Supervisors used to meet. He thanked his colleagues on the Board and Mr. Hazelett for bringing government closer to persons who live in eastern Henrico by opting to move the November 25 meeting to the Glen Echo Building. Mr. Kaechele pointed out that the Board would be back at the Glen Echo Building for its December 9 meeting.

Resolution – Appointment of Members to Board of Directors – Economic Development Authority.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Thornton, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 332-08 – See attached Resolution.

### PROVISIONAL USE PERMIT

323-08 P-16-08 Fairfield New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC: Request for a Provisional Use Permit under Sections 24-95(a)(3), 24-120 and 24-122.1 of Chapter 24 of the County Code in order to construct a 120' high internal array monopole telecommunications tower and related equipment, on part of Parcel 789-754-3978, located on the west line of Upham Drive approximately 500 feet north of its intersection with Wilkinson Road (Chamberlayne Farms Shopping Center). The existing zoning is B-2C Business District (Conditional). The Land Use Plan recommends Commercial Concentration. The Planning Commission voted to recommend the Board of Supervisors grant the request. (Deferred from November 12, 2008 meeting for decision only).

Jean Moore, Assistant Director of Planning, briefly summarized the case, advised that staff had received no information since the previous meeting, and stated that the staff report and recommended conditions remained the same as at the previous meeting. She reiterated that staff believed that the case was consistent with the County's 2010 plans for siting telecommunications towers and recommended approval.

Mr. Kaechele pointed out that this case was heard for approximately an hour and a half at the Board's previous meeting and that Mr. Thornton had needed a little more time to explore some issues. The Board agreed not to have open discussion again on this item because everyone had an opportunity to express their thoughts at the last meeting.

Mr. Thornton provided a statement regarding his perspective on the case. He commented on the essence of communities and mentioned that the proposed communication tower was being requested for location in a community setting. While acknowledging the importance of communication towers and stating respect for both sides of the issue, Mr. Thornton expressed his view that it was not the propitious moment for this tower in this particular setting. He thanked the members

of the Planning Commission, Ms. Freye, and others for their work on the case. Mr. Thornton remarked that he was recommending denial of the case because of concerns expressed by citizens residing in surrounding neighborhoods and in the general area. He noted that he could not base a motion for denial on concerns about health effects of the tower, but could base this motion on being the voice of the community in this case. Mr. Thornton concluded that although in the future this might be a good venue for a communication tower, at the present time it is not.

On motion of Thornton, seconded by Mrs. O'Bannon, the Board did not follow the recommendation of the Planning Commission and denied Agenda Item No. 323-08 (P-16-08).

## **PUBLIC HEARING ITEMS**

Resolution - Condemnation - 0.885+/- Acre - Vent Station Site - Elizabeth Ellen Bowyer - Varina District.

In response to questions from members of the Board, Assistant Director of Real Property Steve Price stated that the owner of this site owns and currently resides on an adjoining parcel and that negotiations with the property owner have not been successful.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this resolution.

On motion of Mr. Donati, seconded by Mrs. O'Bannon, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 333-08 – see attached Resolution.

334-08 Resolution – Signatory Authority – License Agreement for Installation of Drainage Pipe – Shurm Group Home – Varina District.

In response to questions from Mr. Kaechele, Mr. Price and Mr. Hazelett confirmed that the drainage pipe would be installed on the site of the group home and would serve an adjoining subdivision.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this resolution.

On motion of Mr. Donati, seconded by Mrs. O'Bannon, and by unanimous vote, the

Board approved Agenda Item No. 334-08 - see attached Resolution.

## PUBLIC COMMENTS

A. R. Goodwin, a resident of the Varina District, expressed concerns regarding the threat of land consumption and sprawl to the County's remaining historic resources and the need for protection of these resources in the County's comprehensive planning process. Ms. Goodwin referred to a study she undertook during the past three years of the recent history of historic preservation policy in Henrico in which she included a list of historical sites and structures reported lost as of 2006. She commented that the County Planning Department's comprehensive plan outreach methods since 2004 have not sufficiently promoted public knowledge of the comprehensive plan and have resulted in limited citizen input. Ms. Goodwin asked that the Board and administration not continue to allow development to take place without the inclusion of simple historic preservation tools within the 2026 comprehensive plan draft.

## GENERAL AGENDA

Introduction of Resolution – Receipt of Requests for Amendments to the FY 2008-09 Annual Fiscal Plan: December, 2008.

In response to a question from Mr. Thornton, Management and Budget Division Director Gene Walter and Mr. Hazelett explained the County's obligation for the repayment to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) of Housing Opportunities Made Equal (HOME) program funds previously provided to the Interfaith Housing Corporation.

In response to questions from Mr. Glover, Mr. Walter elaborated on the proposed amendment to appropriate \$452,680 of funds collected under the Circuit Court Clerk's Technology Trust Fund. Mr. Walter confirmed that the purpose of the funds is to put property records on line. Mr. Hazelett and Mr. Walter clarified for Mr. Glover the level of information that is recorded and made available. Mr. Glover stated that he thought it was ridiculous and a waste of money to put land records on the Internet when the public can get this information by coming to the County's records room and asking for it. In reference to further questions from Mr. Glover pertaining to the Clerk's acceptance and use of these funds, Mr. Hazelett said he would be more than happy to set up a work session with the Clerk to answer Mr. Glover's questions. Mr. Glover thinks that people are not necessarily interested in knowing that their records are made public on the Internet. Mr. Walter and Mr. Hazelett clarified for Mr. Kaechele that all property transactions are now recorded electronically. Mr. Glover said his understanding is that the Clerk is not obligated to post land records on the Internet unless she accepts these funds. indicated he would try to clarify before the next Board meeting the level of property records information that is contained in the property transactions put on the Internet by the Clerk. There was further discussion of this matter by Mr. Glover, Mr. Kaechele, and Mr. Hazelett.

In response to questions from Mrs. O'Bannon, Mr. Walter explained how citizens can voluntarily donate funds to the Spay and Neuter Foundation on their Virginia tax returns and clarified that the funds received by the County from the Governor's Office of Substance Abuse Prevention for promotion of an underage drinking prevention program were from a grant for which the County applied. Fire Chief Ed Smith clarified for Mrs. O'Bannon that the replacement van funded by the Virginia Department of Emergency Management under the 2007 Homeland Security Program will be used to transport equipment. In response to a further question from Mrs. O'Bannon, Mr. Walter explained the seized asset forfeiture funds received by the County on a regular basis and used by the Commonwealth's Attorney or Division of Police for law enforcement projects.

On motion of Mr. Thornton, seconded by Mrs. O'Bannon, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 335-08 – see attached Introduction of Resolution.

336-08 Introduction Of Ordinance – Property Tax Exemption – Richmond Residential Services, Inc.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Thornton, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 336-08 – see attached Introduction of Ordinance.

Resolution - Receipt of Audited Annual Financial Report for Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 2008 and Acknowledgement of Discharge of Duties and Responsibilities by Audit Committee.

Director of Finance John Vithoulkas recognized external auditors Tim Conner and Kim Edwards from KPMG and County Director of Internal Audit Gary Martin who were in the audience. In response to a question from Mrs. O'Bannon, Mr. Vithoulkas commented on the positive audit received by the County. Mrs. O'Bannon noted that it was the County's best audit since 1991. Mr. Kaechele extended congratulations to all the individuals involved with the audit, including the County's Audit Committee.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 337-08 – see attached Resolution.

338-08 Resolution - Acceptance of Gift from American Family Fitness.

In response to questions from Board members, Chief Smith and Mr. Hazelett commented on where the equipment will be installed, how it may be used, and the value of the equipment. He clarified for Mr. Kaechele that some public safety personnel can use American Family Fitness in an on duty capacity at no charge if they do not have access to County fitness facilities. Mr. Thornton suggested that some of this equipment could be put at the new County recreation center that will be coming on line not too far in the future.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Thornton, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 338-08 – see attached Resolution.

339-08 Resolution – Signatory Authority - Amendment to Contract for Architectural and Engineering Services – Fire Station #8.

In response to questions from Mr. Kaechele, Director of General Services Paul Proto clarified that this contract is primarily for site planning and that a recycling operation currently at this site would not be part of the redesigned site. Mrs. O'Bannon commented that the recycling center currently on this site is used more than any other general recycling center in the County and that it could not be accommodated on the redesigned site.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 339-08 – see attached Resolution.

Introduction of Ordinance – To Amend and Reordain Section 21-124 of the Code of the County of Henrico Titled "Rates" by Increasing the Taxicab Rate for Each Succeeding One-Fifth Mile from \$0.40 to \$0.50 and by Changing the Waiting Time Rate from \$0.30 for Each One Minute of Waiting Time to \$0.50 for Each Eighty Seconds of Waiting Time.

Mr. Hazelett advised that the County was shooting for an effective date of January 1, 2009 for the ordinance and that in order to make this deadline the ordinance had to be advertised in the morning newspaper in advance of this meeting and prior to the ordinance's introduction. In response to questions from Board members, Chief of Police Henry Stanley clarified that the ordinance is scheduled to take effect in all of the participating jurisdictions on January 1, Mr. Hazelett and Mr. Kaechele reviewed the membership and meeting schedule of the Capital Region Taxicab Advisory Board, Mr. Hazelett and Col. Stanley explained how the Division of Police licenses and controls the County's 147 taxicabs, and Mr. Hazelett clarified that the public hearing would be held at the December 9, 2008 Board meeting.

On motion of Mr. Donati, seconded by Mrs. O'Bannon, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 340-08 – see attached Introduction of Ordinance.

Resolution – To Accept the GOSAP-UADO9 Grant Award to the County of Henrico, Division of Police, for Underage Drinking Prevention Efforts.

Mr. Hazelett clarified for Mr. Kaechele that the acronym GOSAP is for the Governor's Office of Substance Abuse Prevention.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Thornton, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 341-08 – see attached Resolution.

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Resolution - To Accept the Target Stores Community Relations Grant Award to the County of Henrico, Division of Police, for Community Police and Evidence Recovery Equipment.

In response to questions from Board members, Col. Stanley stated that this grant award was from a local Target store but that no representatives of Target were attending the meeting.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 342-08 – see attached Resolution.

343-08 Resolution – To Accept the Wal-Mart Stores Community Relations Grant Award to the County of Henrico, Division of Police, for Community Policing Equipment.

Mrs. O'Bannon advised that at her town meeting a few weeks ago on the budget and the economy a citizen asked whether money can be donated to the County. In response to a question from Mr. Donati, Col. Stanley noted that businesses making donations to the Division of Police are sent a thank you letter, have a close relationship with the agency, and also see police personnel on almost a daily basis involving issues within the stores. He clarified for Mrs. O'Bannon that this donation was not from a specific store but was made from the company's regional aspect or all stores located within the County.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 343-08 – see attached Resolution.

344-08 Resolution - Signatory Authority - Acquisition of Real Property - 1303 Mormac Road - Tuckahoe District.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board deferred this item to December 9, 2008 – see enclosed copy of Resolution.

Resolution - Signatory Authority - Award of Construction Contract - Pouncey Tract Road Water Main - C. D. Hall Construction Co., Inc.

In response to questions from Board members, Director of Public Utilities Art Petrini and Mr. Hazelett explained where the proposed pipe crosses under I-64, noted that the engineer's estimate for the project was a little over \$5 million, stated the project's estimated completion date is June 2010, and clarified that the pipe would terminate on Shady Grove Road at Mason Park subdivision.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 345-08 – see attached Resolution.

Resolution - Signatory Authority - Award of Construction Contract - Standby Power Facility for the Three Chopt Water Pumping Station - Master Electrical Services, LLC.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Thornton, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 346-08 – see attached Resolution.

In response to a question from Mrs. O'Bannon, Mr. Petrini noted that the engineer's estimate was \$1.3 million.

347-08 Resolution - Amendment to Construction Services Agreement - Glenwood Gardens Water System Improvements - Godsey & Son, Inc.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 347-08 – see attached Resolution.

In response to questions from Mrs. O'Bannon, Mr. Petrini and Mr. Hazelett clarified that the water main for the Pouncey Tract Road Water Main contract awarded by the Board will be constructed of ductile iron, commented on the expected life of iron pipe, explained preventative measures currently used by the County to minimize pipe corrosion, reviewed new policies developed by his agency to test for acidic soils prior to installation of new pipes, and identified the different types of pipe materials that have been used historically within the County.

Resolution - Award of Construction Contract - Tuckahoe Park Drainage Improvements, Phase 1B from Merrick Road to Mayland Drive along Dancer Road and Rudolph Road (approximately 2,030 linear feet). Project #2111.50701.28004.00678 (formerly Project #502005-709-306-03). Three Chopt District.

In response to questions from Board members, Assistant Director of Public Works Tim Foster clarified the location of Tuckahoe Park subdivision addressed by this resolution, confirmed that this contract would tie in with Phase IA of the project, and advised that the lowest responsive bid for the project was 50 percent less than the engineer's estimate.

On motion of Mr. Thornton, seconded by Mr. Glover, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 348-08 – see attached Resolution.

349-08 Resolution – Acceptance of Roads.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Thornton, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 349-08 – see attached Resolution.

On motion of Mr. Donati, seconded by Mr. Thornton, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved adding to the agenda an Emergency Ordinance numbered 350-08 and titled "Emergency Ordinance to

Amend and Reordain Section 23-283 of the Code of the County of Henrico Titled "Installment payments" to Change the Interest Rate and to Amend and Reenact the Enactment Clause of Agenda Item 113-08 to Change the Effective Date for Connection Fee Increases From October 1, 2008 to January 1, 2010."

Mr. Kaechele noted that the Board did have an opportunity to review this ordinance in a work session just prior to this meeting. He commented that the ordinance was a significant opportunity and challenge to help homeowners and homebuilders in the County by rolling back connection fees to where they were before the October 1 increases for a period of 14 months and to lower the interest rate from twelve percent to approximately five percent. In response to a question from Mr. Kaechele, Mr. Hazelett advised that the public hearing on this ordinance would be scheduled for January 13, 2009.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Thornton, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 350-08 – see attached Emergency Ordinance.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:20 p.m.

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the County to acquire 0.885 +/- acre as shown on a plat dated May 30, 2006, last revised December 26, 2006, a reduced size copy of which is attached and marked Exhibit "A" (the "Vent Station Site") for the construction of the Four Mile Creek Trunk Sewer Rehabilitation, Yahley Mill Vent Facility Project (the "Project"), being a portion of the land in the Varina District owned by Elizabeth Ellen Bowyer (the "Owner"); and,

WHEREAS, after having been provided a copy of the County's appraisal in the amount of \$11,400, the Owner rejected the County's bona fide offer to acquire the property for this amount and supplied the County with her own appraisal in the amount of \$78,141; and,

WHEREAS, after receiving the Owner's appraisal, the County received a letter from its appraiser updating his original appraisal and estimating the just compensation due the Owner to be \$15,775, and a copy of this letter was sent to the Owner's counsel; and,

WHEREAS, during negotiations with the Owner's counsel, the County offered to acquire the property for \$15,775, but this bona fide offer has been rejected by the Owner; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Henrico County, Virginia (the "Board") desires to exercise authority granted by §§ 15.2-1990, et seq. and 25.1-300, et seq. of the Code of Virginia (the "Code") to acquire title, to enter upon and take possession of the Vent Station Site and to construct the Project before the institution of condemnation proceedings; and,

WHEREAS, after advertisement in the Richmond Times-Dispatch, a public hearing was held by the Board pursuant to §15.2-1903 of the Code, at which time the Board declared its intent to enter upon and take possession of the Vent Station Site for the Project, being a portion of the Owner's property.

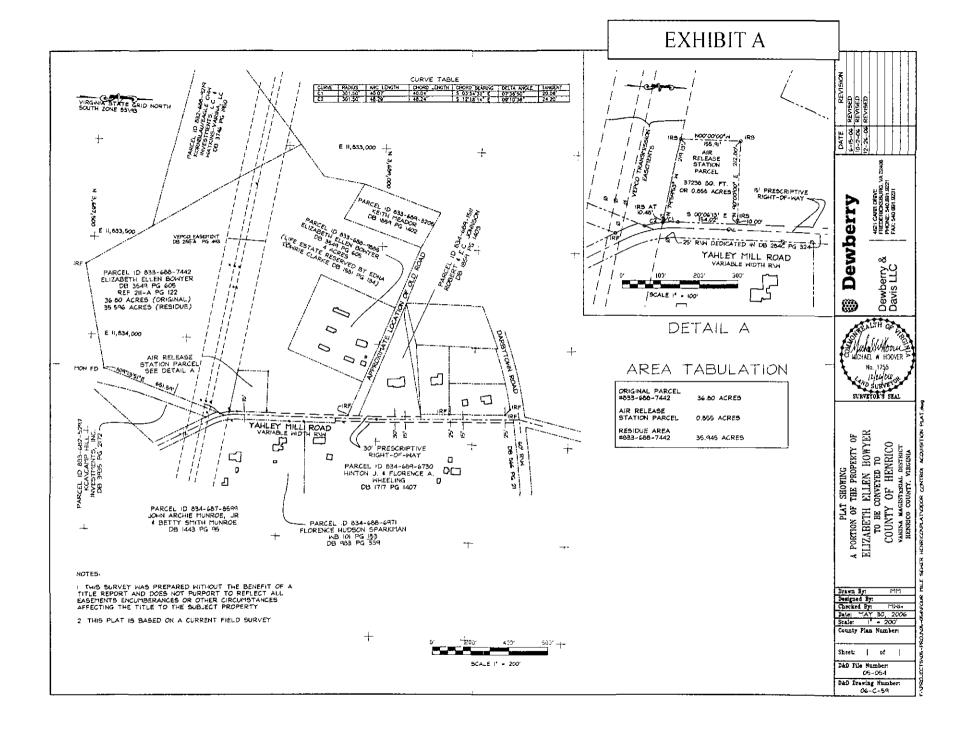
#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

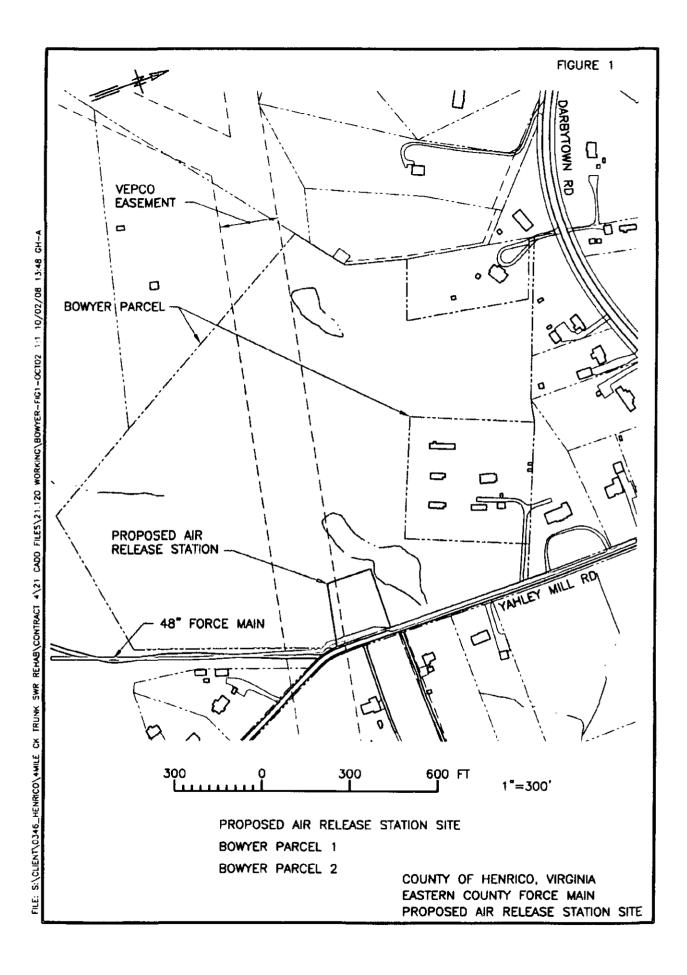
- (1) The Board finds a necessity exists to institute condemnation proceedings pursuant to the Code to acquire the Vent Station Site for the public use of constructing, operating, and maintaining the Project and to determine the amounts of compensation and damages, if any, caused by the taking, possession and acquisition of the Vent Station Site;
- (2) The Board deems it necessary to enter upon the property and take possession of the Vent Station Site in order to construct the Project prior to the time in which a condemnation case can be filed and heard in accordance with the Code;
- (3) The County Manager shall send by certified mail dated November 26, 2008, a notice advising the Owner that the County intends to enter upon and take possession of the Vent Station Site prior to the conclusion of condemnation proceedings, setting forth the compensation and damages offered by the County, and informing the Owner she has 30 days within which to contest the taking;

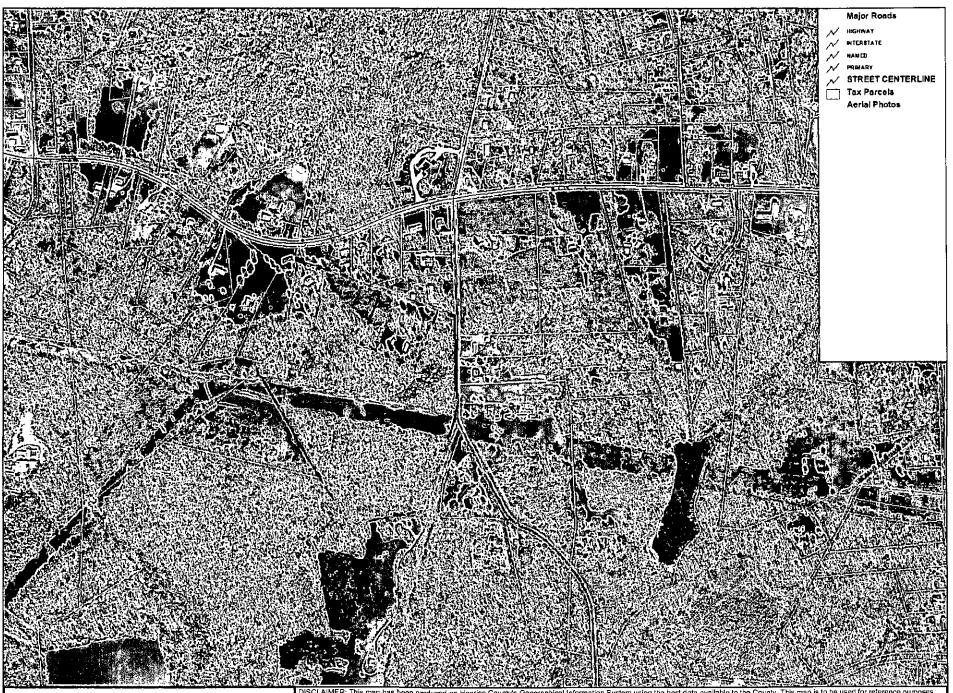

This AGREEMENT made this <u>30.</u> day of October, 2008, by and between MILENKO MILANOVIC AND IZABELA MILANOVIC, husband and wife ("SELLER") and COUNTY OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA ("PURCHASER").

WHEREAS, PURCHASER has decided to acquire the property on Mormac Road, in Tuckahoe Magisterial District, Henrico County, Virginia, which property is owned by SELLER; and,

## Sec. 23-283. Installment payments.

Upon written request, any owner may pay basic connection fees and local facilities fees in installments subject to the following provisions:

(1) Basic connection fees may be paid in up to 36 monthly installments and local facilities fees may be paid in up to 120 monthly installments. Interest at the rate of 12 percent per year shall be charged on the unpaid balance.

Interest based upon the Wall Street Journal Prime Rate in effect on the date of the contract plus one per cent shall be charged on a per annum basis on the unpaid balance.

- 2. That the remaining provisions of Section 23-283 of the Code shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.
- 3. That the last sentence of the enactment clause in paragraph 7 of Agenda Item No. 113-08 approved by the Board of Supervisors on April 22, 2008 shall be amended and reenacted as follows:

The connection fees set forth in Sections 23-311 and 23-312 shall not take effect until October 1, 2008 January 1, 2010. The Director shall refund all connection fees collected between October 1, 2008 and January 1, 2010 that exceed the connection fees in effect on September 30, 2008.

4. That this Ordinance is adopted on an emergency basis pursuant to Virginia Code § 15.2-1427(F), shall take effect immediately, and shall be readopted within the next 60 days pursuant to and as required by that section of the Virginia Code.

COMMENTS: The Director of Public Utilities recommends approval of this Board paper, and the County Manager concurs.
