MANAGER'S COMMENTS

HCTV, Henrico County Television, has been named the third best government station in the country by the National Association of Telecommunications Officers and Advisors. Although HCTV has won multiple awards for individual programs through the years, including four Emmy awards, this is the first time the station has been recognized for overall programming quality and excellence. Public Relations & Media Services Director Tamra McKinney and Television & Media Services Manager Ben Sheppard are to be congratulated for putting Henrico County in the national spotlight through this outstanding achievement.

In 2003, under the leadership of then Director Gordon Ragland, the County's Department of Social Services (DSS) started its Fatherhood Support Program. The mission of the program is to provide men with the information and support they need to build healthy relationships with their children, the mothers of their children, and the community at large. The program has been serving fathers through its year-round support and accountability groups on Monday nights. It is facilitated by DSS employee Phil White, who has led this initiative since its inception, and has been structured as a 12-week group that is both supportive and educational in nature. Thus far, 58 men have completed the program in 2013, and 436 men have completed the program since its inception. The following persons and other DSS staff members are to be commended for showing their dedication to these critical family connections that strengthen our community: Deputy County Manager for Community Services Jane Crawley (who was involved in the program as the County's prior DSS Director), current DSS Director Cindee Steinhauser, Assistant DSS Director Shawn Rozier (who was unable to be present for the recognition), and Mr. White.

Henrico County Public Library is partnering with Henrico County Public Schools and Friends of the Library for the sixth annual All Henrico Reads author event. The featured author for 2014 is Virginia native Lee Smith. Ms. Smith has an impressive catalog of books, many of which have been best sellers and have won literary awards, including the Southern Books Critics Circle Award and the Academy Award in Fiction. This annual author event will again be held at Glen Allen High School and will take place on Wednesday, April 2, at 7:00 p.m.

He recognized project architect Chuck Wray from BCWH and project manager Richard Morse from the Department of General Services. Mr. Kaechele noted that this project was reviewed by the Board in a work session two weeks earlier. responded to a question from Mrs. O'Bannon regarding one of the exterior renderings and confirmed for Mr. Glover that the library is scheduled to open in November 2015.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this item.

Mr. Glover expressed excitement at what he had seen of this proposed plan of development and commented on the great job that the Library Advisory Board and architects had done in presenting it.

WHEREAS, an application has been submitted for approval of POD2013-00371, a plan of development for Libbie Mill Library at Libbie Mill, to construct a three-story, 59,975 square foot public library with parking and related site improvements; and,

WHEREAS, the 3.32-acre site is located in the center of the 80-acre Libbie Mill property, located southwest of the intersection of Staples Mill Road and Bethlehem Road, on part of parcels 773-740-5043 and 773-739-8155. The zoning is UMUC, Urban Mixed Use District, and is located in the Brookland District; and,

WHEREAS, the County Administration, including the Department of General Services, the Department of Planning, the Department of Public Works, the Department of Public Utilities, the Division of Fire, the Division of Police, and the Office of Building Construction and Inspections, as well as the Virginia Department of Transportation have reviewed the application, and the Administration recommends approval subject to the staff recommendations and the staff plan dated November 26, 2013; and,

WHEREAS, on November 26, 2013, the Board of Supervisors held a public hearing to receive comments on the application for approval.

- 1. The Director of Public Utilities shall approve the construction plans for public water and sewer prior to beginning any construction of these utilities. The Department of Public Utilities shall be notified at least 24 hours prior to the start of any County water or sewer construction.
- 2. The parking lot shall be subject to the requirements of Section 24-98 of the Henrico County Code.
- 3. The parking spaces shall be marked on the pavement surface with four-inch wide white painted traffic lines. All lane lines and parking lines shall be while in color with the exception that those dividing traffic shall be yellow.
- 4. Sufficient, effective usable parking shall be provided. If experience indicates the need, additional parking shall be provided.
- 5. Curb and gutter and necessary storm sewer shall be constructed as shown on approved plans.
- 6. The plan of development shall be revised as annotated on the staff plan dated November 26, 2013, which shall be as much a part of this approval as if its details were fully described herein. Eight sets of revised plans, including the detailed drainage, erosion control and utility plans shall be submitted by the design engineer who prepared the plans to the Department of Planning for final review. Upon notice from the Department of Planning that all comments have been addressed, 21 sets of final plans for signature shall be submitted to the Department of Planning for approval signatures.
- 7. The Department of Public Works shall be notified at least 24 hours prior to the start of any construction.
- 8. A detailed landscaping plan shall be submitted to the Department of Planning for review and approval prior to the issuance of any occupancy permits.
- 9. All ground cover and landscaping shall be properly maintained in a healthy condition at all times. Dead plant materials shall be removed within a reasonable time and replaced during the normal planting season.
- 10. Prior to the approval of an electrical permit application and installation of the site lighting equipment, a plan including light spread and intensity diagrams and fixture specifications and mounting height details shall be submitted for Department of Planning review and approval.
- All exterior lighting shall be designed and arranged to direct the light and glare away from nearby residential property and streets.
- 12. The site including the parking areas shall be kept clean of litter and debris on a daily basis. Trash container units/litter receptacles and recycling containers shall be maintained with scheduled regular pickups and shall be screened properly on all four sides. The gate(s) shall remain closed except when the receptacle(s) are being filled or serviced and shall be repaired or replaced as necessary. Details shall be included with the final site plan or required landscape plan review and approval.
- 13. Required fire lanes shall be marked and maintained in accordance with the Virginia Statewide Fire Prevention Code.
- 14. Traffic control signs shall be provided as indicated on the Planning staff plan. All signs shall be fabricated as shown in The Virginia Supplement to The Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways.


15. The assigned property number shall be displayed so it is easily readable from the street. If assistance is needed with the address, please contact the Department of Planning at 501-4284. The Planning Department must assign all property addresses.


The contractor shall have a set of plans approved by the Director of Public Works, Director of Public Utilities and the County Manager available at the site at all times when work is being performed. A designated responsible employee shall be available for contact by County inspectors.


17. The property shall be developed generally as shown on the plan filed with the case and no major changes or additions to the layout shall be made without the approval of the Board of Supervisors.

- Upon completion of the improvements and prior to the certification of the permanent occupancy permit, the engineer or land surveyor who prepared the POD plan shall furnish a statement lo the effect that all construction, including water and sewer, is in conformance with the regulations and requirements of the POD.
- 19. The developer shall provide fire hydrants as required by the Department of Public Utilifies and Division of Fire.
- 20. Insurance Service Offices (ISO) calculations should be included on the final construction plans for approval by the Department of Public Utilities prior to issuance of a building permit.
- Any necessary offsite drainage easements must be obtained in a form acceptable to the County Attorney prior to final approval of the construction plans by the Department of Public Works.
- Deviations from County standards for pavement, curb, or curb and gutter design shall be approved by the County Engineer prior to final approval of the construction plans by the Department of Public Works.
- 23. Vehicles shall be parked only in approved and constructed parking spaces.
- 24. The construction shall be properly coordinated to ensure that safe access, circulation and adequate parking is provided for the facility. A plan lo indicate the phasing of improvements and the handling of traffic (construction and employees) shall be submitted to the Department of Planning prior to the issuance of a building permit.

COMMENTS: The Director of Planning has reviewed the plans submitted by Vanasse Hangen Brustlin, Inc. and BCWH and recommends approval, and the County Manager concurs.










LIBHIE MILL LIBRARY

SITE LAYOUT










LIBBIE MILL LIBRARY SECOND FLOOR PLAN






LIBBIE MILL LIBRARY THIRD FLOOR PLAN

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
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


LIBBIE MILL LIBRARY EXTERIOR ELEVATION: SOUTH




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
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


SOUTH MECHANICAL YARD ELEVATION







WHEREAS, the Revenue Sharing Program of the Virginia Department of Transportation allocates state matching funds for local highway construction and maintenance projects; and,

WHEREAS, the County has identified four projects that are eligible for state matching funds; and,

WHEREAS, the four projects are (1) construction of approximately 630 feet of sidewalk on Beulah Road, (2) construction of approximately 6,760 feet of sidewalk on Nuckols Road, (3) construction of approximately 900 feet of sidewalk on Prince Henry Drive, and (4) construction of approximately 3,530 feet of sidewalk on Wistar Road; and,

WHEREAS, all four projects will include the installation of pedestrian ramps and curbs and gutters where needed; and,

WHEREAS, the County's cost estimate for the four projects is \$2,461,000, and the County wishes to apply for \$1,188,500 in state matching funds; and,
