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AN ORDINANCE to amend and reordain Section 11-20 of the Code of the County of Henrico titled "Possession, sale, storage or use of fireworks prohibited" to remove references to a section of the Virginia Statewide Fire Prevention Code

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA:

1. That Section 11-20 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained as follows:

Sec. 11-20. Possession, sale, storage or use of fireworks prohibited.

- (a) This section is adopted pursuant to authority granted localities by Code of Virginia, § 27-97, and Virginia Statewide Fire Prevention Code section 101.5 to adopt fire prevention regulations that are more restrictive than the Virginia Statewide Fire Prevention Code.
- (b) No person shall store, possess, offer for sale, expose for sale, sell at retail or use or explode any fireworks, as that term is defined in <u>the</u> Virginia Statewide Fire Prevention Code section 3302.1, except that a person may conduct a supervised public display of fireworks pursuant to a permit granted by the fire marshal.
- (c) Applications for permits shall be made in writing at least 60 days before the date of the supervised public display of fireworks. The sale, possession, discharge and distribution of fireworks for such display shall be lawful only under the terms and conditions and for the purpose set forth in the permit. Appermit shall not be transferable nor extend beyond the date or dates set forth therein.

- (d) For purposes of this section, the term "fireworks" shall include "permissible fireworks" as that term is defined in **the** Virginia Statewide Fire Prevention Code section 3302.1.
- (e) For purposes of this section, "fireworks" shall not include automobile flares, paper caps containing not more than an average of 0.25 grams (16 mg) of explosive content per cap, or any toy pistols, toy canes, toy guns, and other devices using such caps.
- 2. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect on and after its passage.

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WHEREAS, the County, the Henrico County Economic Development Authority ("EDA"), and McKesson Medical-Surgical Inc. ("McKesson") have negotiated a performance agreement that provides for an appropriation of \$1 million by the Board of Supervisors to the EDA and a grant of \$1 million by the EDA to McKesson; and,

WHEREAS, in return for the grant, McKesson will make a capital investment of at least \$12,200,000 million at its new division headquarters facility located at the Deep Run III office building in the County and will maintain the existing 589 jobs in Henrico County, and in addition create and maintain at least 225 new jobs at the facility, at least 135 of which will be created by December 31, 2017, and at least 90 more of which will be created by December 31, 2019; and,

WHEREAS, the Governor's Opportunity Fund will make a \$500,000 grant to the County to support the project; and,

WHEREAS, the EDA approved the performance agreement at its regular meeting on November 20, 2014.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors that it authorizes the County Manager to execute the performance agreement among the County, the EDA, and McKesson in a form approved by the County Attorney.






# **Proposed Sidewalk on Glenside Drive**




