Mr. Thornton called the meeting to order at 7:04 p.m.

Mr. Thornton led recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

Father Wayne Ball, Pastor of St. John's Catholic Church (Henrico) and St. Patrick's Catholic Church (Richmond) delivered the invocation.

MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Douglas A. Middleton, Chief of Police, has been appointed to the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc. (CALEA), which was created in 1979 as a credentialing authority through the joint efforts of law enforcement's major executive associations. Chief Middleton has served since 2001 as an Assessor and Team Leader for CALEA, has long been an advocate of CALEA programs, and has used CALEA accreditation to improve public safety services within the County's Division of Police. CALEA is composed of 21 members, 11 of whom are from the law enforcement community. Mr. Vithoulkas characterized Chief Middleton's appointment to the CALEA Board as a significant honor that recognizes the Chief's talent and reputation, congratulated him on his new appointment, and thanked him for the services he offers to the County.

Mr. Vithoulkas pointed out that presentation of the *Financial Trend Monitoring System (TRENDS)* document to the Board of Supervisors marks the beginning of the County's annual budget process. The document is a historical review over an 11-year period of a number of financial and budgetary indicators. Mr. Vithoulkas recognized Management and Budget Division Director Brandon Hinton for the hours he spent compiling the document, which is available online and has been distributed to the Board of Supervisors. The County Manager's proposed FY 2016 budget will be presented to the Board on March 10.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' COMMENTS

Mrs. O'Bannon announced that she attended a special ceremony on February 8 to celebrate the Eagle Scout Court of Honor for Adam Thomas Jones, Samuel Thomas Murphy, Cabell Louis Murray, Edward Thomas Palmer, Kyle Raj Adams, and Grayson Scott Phillips. The Scouts are members of Troop 770, based at River Road Presbyterian Church. Mrs. O'Bannon expressed pride in the Scouts and remarked that they personally handled the ceremony, which was family-oriented, very well done, and the culmination of their Scouting career.

Mrs. O'Bannon mentioned the passing of her friend, Dr. Dennis A. J. Morey, on January 18. Dr. Morey was born in England, served as a "Commander for Life" in the British Royal Air Force during World War II, and was the recipient of two Distinguished Flying Crosses. After the war, Dr. Morey practiced medicine in the field of gastroenterology for 40 years and was Chief of Staff for Henrico Doctors' Hospital from 1986 to 1989. He was also an assistant professor at the Medical College of Virginia and authored 16 medical publications. As a senior navigator in the Richmond Power Squadron, Dr. Morey taught several courses and published two texts. He was instrumental in reconstructing the original Citie of Henricus and published 16 monographs about Henrico and its origin. Mrs. O'Bannon noted Dr. Morey will be very much missed by the Board of the Henricus Foundation.

WHEREAS, multiple myeloma (or myeloma), the second most common blood cancer worldwide, is a cancer of plasma cells in the bone marrow and is called "multiple" because the cancer can occur at multiple sites; and

WHEREAS, because myeloma is a rare disease, a lack of awareness among clinicians and the general public can lead to delayed diagnosis and treatment; and

WHEREAS, continued investment and innovation is critical to achieving early diagnosis, implementing effective and safe treatments, and helping myeloma patients live longer; and

WHEREAS, there is still no cure for myeloma although there have been important advances in the last decade; and

WHEREAS, the County of Henrico is committed to increasing public awareness of this disease.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED that the Board of Supervisors of Henrico County, Virginia, hereby recognizes March 2015 as Multiple Myeloma Awareness Month and encourages Henrico residents to participate in voluntary activities that will support myeloma education and research aimed at treating and curing this disease.
