WHEREAS, the Board wishes to amend the Annual Fiscal Plans by transferring (1) \$11,024,800 in available funds to the Vehicle Replacement Reserve fund for the replacement of police vehicles, fire apparatus and school buses and (2) \$12,100,808 in available funds to the County's fund

WHEREAS, the available funds originally budgeted for public safety expenses may be transferred because those expenses were funded through the federal CARES Act; and,

WHEREAS, the Board also wishes to appropriate funds for expenditure in the fourth quarter of FY 2020-21.

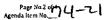

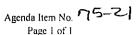
