Mr. Schmitt called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Steve Boots, Chaplain for the Henrico Police Division, delivered the invocation.

MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Todd Pugh, Division Director for Public Safety Wireless Communications working alongside our radio project team and representatives from Motorola Solutions, recently devised a creative and practical method to accelerate the critical testing phase of the new radio system. In 2007 Henrico County led an effort on behalf of the region to create a new high-tech region-wide wireless network to link the various EOC's of each jurisdiction. As part of the project we received a \$ 3 million Federal grant to build the Richmond Area Microwave Interoperability System, or RAMIS. Mr. Vithoulkas stated Todd devised a method to use RAMIS to begin testing the new radio "core" computers and the newly acquired regional network equipment, last week the first radio transmission on the new system was made – it was a voice conversation between Todd and our Motorola project manager, David McConnell. The Manager commended Todd and his team and our partners from Motorola for this innovative and successful step forward.

Mr. Vithoulkas recognized Alec Oughton, Chief for the Division of Fire, noting as part of Henrico's commitment to the community, many agencies participate in third-party assessments or outside evaluations of the work we do. The Division of Fire participates in two third-party assessment processes — accreditation through the Commission on Fire Accreditation International and public protection classification through the Insurance Services Office (ISO). Chief Oughton noted the Fire department's score represents only about half of the possible points used to determine a PPC of Class 1, the Department of Public Utilities water distribution systems accounts for about 40%, and the Henrico Police Emergency Communications Center accounts for the remaining 10%. He noted it is truly an evaluation of how the community staff and infrastructure work together to protect Henrico County, and all three agencies play a key role. Chief Oughton explained Henrico is one of only 388 Class I communities in the nation to hold this classification.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' COMMENTS

Mr. Thornton noted he and several members of the Board attended an historical event on Monday, May 24 the Re-Opening of Belmont Golf Club, noting the new type of golf course instead of 18-holes we have 12-holes. Mr. Schmitt echoed Mr. Thornton enthusiasm for Belmont's reopening and noted the history of Belmont and looks forward to what it will offer the community and our youth and our School system.

Mrs. O'Bannon noted the passing of Lt. Colonel Roger Lee Foster who passed away on May 12 following a long brave battle with cancer. She noted the most important things in life to him was friends, family and faith; he was a graduate of Hermitage High School, he served in the Virginia National Guard and attended VCU and graduated with the 110th class of FBI National Academy in 1977. He retired in 1988 from the Division of Police with the rank of Lt. Colonel; she noted what she will remember him most for was his help with the 2007 NACo convention held in the County.

WHEREAS, they are now recognized as the most successful justice system intervention in our nation's history; and

WHEREAS, during May 2021, the Henrico County Drug Court will celebrate the program's 18th anniversary and 252nd graduate; and

WHEREAS, the Henrico County Drug Court is a collaborative effort of the 14th Judicial Circuit, the Commonwealth's Attorney's Office, the Sheriff's Office, Henrico Area Mental Health and Developmental Services, the Police Division, the Community Corrections Program, and the Probation and Parole District 32 Office of the Virginia Department of Corrections.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA:

1. That subsections (c) and (d) of Section 17-58 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained as follows:

Sec. 17-58. Charges.

. . . .

- (c) Charge for residential refuse collection. The bimonthly charge for county refuse collection shall be \$30.00 \$36.00 per single-family residential unit, regardless of the number of Supercans or privately-purchased containers used at the residential unit.
- (d) Other premises. Businesses or other establishments receiving county refuse collection service must use Supercans to dispose of refuse, and they may obtain an unlimited number of Supercans from the county for their use. The bimonthly charge for their refuse collection shall be \$30.00 \$36.00 per Supercan.

. . . .

2. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect on and after July 1, 2021, as provided by law.
