#### MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Mr. Vithoulkas and Chairman Frank J. Thornton recognized a legend in the Henrico Division of Fire who has decided to pursue retirement and close out a 46-year career where he responded to countless emergencies, led generations of firefighters, and served his community with both distinction and heart. Since 1976, Chief Eugene "Cricket" Gerald has served in numerous roles as firefighter, lieutenant, captain, and district chief. He has called a number of firehouses throughout the County "home" and has served in all battalions. Cricket's commitment to excellence in fire service and his keen ability to guide others was fully recognized by the Virginia Fire Chiefs Association when they presented him with the Glenn Gaines Leadership Legacy Award in 2022. Of his contemporaries, Chief Gerald is the longest-serving member of the Division of Fire, devoting nearly 46 and a half years of his life to this community. Whether in the firehouse, in the classroom, or in the field, Chief Gerald has been a leader, a mentor, and a friend.

The Chairman bestowed upon Chief Gerald the County Manager's Medal of Honor, a prestigious award that is presented to an individual, whether a County employee or civilian, who performs courageous, life-saving actions above and beyond the call of duty, for the good of other individuals, or the entire Henrico community.

Chief Gerald thanked the Manager and the Board for the recognition. He also thanked his family for their continued support throughout his career. He stated this was a hard decision between his heart and his head on retiring. He was not sure if it was time to retire but after much deliberation and many talks with God, he knew it was time to follow his heart.

#### **PUBLIC HEARING ITEMS**

Katherine O'Donnell, Executive Vice President with Richmond Region Tourism gave a presentation on the Establishment of a Tourism District within the region. Mrs. O'Donnell noted there were four individuals from the hotel industry to speak on the proposed district.

Mark Yardis with Shamin Hotels supports the proposed district and noted all the high occupancy rates they have had within their hotels have been related to sports tourism. He feels individual business travel will not return to what it was prior to the pandemic.

John Pappa, General Manager with the Westin Richmond, noted prior to the pandemic their primary clients were business travel and right now their highest clients are tourism, and they are in complete support of the proposed district.

Robert Reid, SMI Hotel (a family-owned business) stated they own four properties within the Richmond Region and noted they were one of the main members who supported and brought forward the proposed district. He feels this will allow the Richmond Region to better compete with the surrounding regions.

J. Prista feels the proposed district will give businesses the opportunity to address the needs of the hotels in the area and fully supports the proposed district.

Mr. Newby stated, since there were no further comments, the Board can close the public hearing, and he apologized for the slides not being available.



### NATIONAL PUBLIC HEALTH WEEK

### April 3 - 9, 2023

WHEREAS, the week of April 3 - 9, 2023, is National Public Health Week, and the theme is "Centering and Celebrating Cultures in Health"; and

WHEREAS, Henrico County is one of the most diverse counties in the Commonwealth of Virginia with roughly 13% of Henrico residents immigrating from other nations and over 100 different languages spoken by County residents; and

WHEREAS, preventable risk factors such as physical inactivity, poor nutrition, tobacco use, and excessive alcohol use are leading causes of chronic disease; and

WHEREAS, public health action, together with scientific and technological advances, has played a major role in reducing and eliminating the spread of infectious disease and in establishing today's disease surveillance and control systems; and

WHEREAS, Richmond and Henrico Health Districts (RHHD) provide critical preventative and responsive public health services and programming for County residents across three different sites with 112 staff and cooperative funding from both the Commonwealth and County; and

WHEREAS, in 2022, RHHD held 130 community testing events for COVID-19 and flu and distributed over 24,000 at-home test kits; and

WHEREAS, in 2022, RHHD held 70 vaccination events for COVID-19 and flu in Henrico and 15 childhood immunization events in collaboration with Henrico County Public Schools and administered over 3,000 vaccines, including 204 doses through 70 in-home visits to homebound County residents; and

WHEREAS, in 2022, RHHD processed 125 applications for new or replacement onsite sewage disposal systems and 92 applications for new, replacement, and abandonment of private wells to improve water quality for Henrico residents and worked in coordination with Virginia's Department of Environmental Quality, federal Environmental Protection Agency, and County officials to investigate and coordinate response to potential polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) in the White Oak Swamp to protect environmental and human health; and

WHEREAS, in 2022, RHHD investigated 774 incident reports from Henrico Animal Protection to evaluate for potential exposure to the rabies virus; and

WHEREAS, in 2022, RHHD navigated 209 families to maternity care with our regional health systems and served more than 160 pregnant clients with Henrico's investment in a Doula Program to improve maternal and infant health; and

WHEREAS, in 2022, RHHD served 5,130 participants in the Women's Infants and Children (WIC) nutrition program, permitted 1,161 food establishments, and distributed 240 boxes of lifesaving naloxone to reverse an opioid overdose.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Supervisors of Henrico County, Virginia, does hereby proclaim the week of April 3 - 9, 2023, as National Public Health Week 2023 in Henrico and calls upon residents to help families, friends, co-workers, and leaders to strengthen opportunities for all Henrico residents of every culture and tradition to improve the health of our neighbors.



child's early development and long-term success, this brings it all full circle for me personally and professionally.


I've truly enjoyed my time serving on the board, learning about the needs of our communities, and contributing my voice to the conversations.

- 6. The County Manager is authorized and directed to retire credits owned by the County for the purpose of offsetting the basic sewer connection fee and local sewer facilities fee that would otherwise apply for an existing single-family dwelling served by an individual septic system. This authorization is limited to dwellings to be served by sewer lines constructed pursuant to the County's ARPA Infill Program. The amount of credits retired must be equal to the amount of the basic connection fee and local facilities fee that would otherwise be imposed under Sections 23-360(b)(2) and 23-360(c) for the existing single-family dwelling served by an individual septic system. The retirement of credits necessary to offset the fees will relieve the connector of any obligation to pay the basic sewer connection fee and local sewer facilities fee under Section 23-360. The authorization provided in this clause will expire on December 31, 2026, and is subject to the availability of credits owned by the County. The Board finds that the use of the County's credits for this purpose will benefit the public by reducing the negative environmental impacts associated with individual septic systems.
- 7. That this ordinance will be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2023, as provided by law and the following provisions: Charges set forth in Sections 23-361 and 23-362 will be pro-rated to apply the old and new charges to that proportion of water supplied and sewage collected prior to and after the effective date of the new rates. Such pro-rated charges will be calculated based on average daily use of service supplied.
