MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Ms. Tretina recognized Kate Mardigian, the Founder and Executive Director of Jacob's Change, a nonprofit organization that has spent more than 10 years empowering individuals with developmental, intellectual, and physical disabilities through inclusive and adventurous programs across the Greater Richmond Region. Mrs. Mardigian thanked the Board for all its support over the last 10 years, particularly for the support of an event they had recently to support the First Tee and the Richmond Flying Squirrels. She noted it was an amazing day for over 100 participants who enjoyed learning the game of golf. She shared several slides from the day and thanked all the supporters who sponsored the day and looks forward to the continued partnership with Henrico County.

Ms. Tretina noted the third annual Juneteenth Celebration was held this past Saturday, June 17, at Dorey Park. She recognized Assistant Director for Recreation Services, Torrance Archie. Mr. Archie thanked Vice-Chairman Tyrone Nelson for his continued advocacy in pushing for a signature event in the Varina District, noting the County successfully hosted over 10,000 guests in Dorey Park during the event without incident. Mr. Archie commended everyone involved in executing such an amazing event, but he shared special commendations to Heather Grubb and her special events team and planning committee. Over the past several weeks, staff has received numerous comments and praise in support of all the efforts taken in pulling off this success. The County loaded in and out over 100 vendors, 15 food vendors, various performers, and half a football field's worth of kid's zone activities. The Mighty Joshua got everyone out of their seats and took the event right into the fireworks. Some of the words and phrases used to describe the event have been safe, celebratory, well-organized, accommodating, communicative, inclusive, amazing, and spectacular. Mr. Archie shared a short video created by Public Relations that summed up the day. In conclusion, he thanked the Division of Fire, Police, Sheriff's Office, Circuit Court, Public Libraries, Schools, Public Relations, and the County Manager's Office for taking active part in the event. No one throws a party like Henrico Recreation and Parks. He encouraged everyone to join them again for the Red, White & Lights celebration on Tuesday, July 4, at Crump Park.

Ms. Tretina next recognized Trista Smith, the County's organizer and liaison for numerous federal government departments for the 2023 Juneteenth celebration. She worked with the Department of Defense, Housing and Urban Development, and the Department of Agriculture. She noted she was able to bring representatives from the United States Air Force, create STEM and STEAM based exhibitions, and organize other federal government vendors to this amazing event. Ms. Smith especially wanted to thank Julian Charity with Recreation and Parks who supported them from start to finish and helped them with their booths and tent and with all the required permits needed. He made sure they had help with off-loading of supplies. She also thanked Rai Beasley who had nothing but positive words about Henrico's Recreation and Parks, and she looks forward to working with Henrico Schools and partnering with them in some of STEAM projects.

She noted the funding would deploy infrastructure to support approximately 38 electric vehicle charging ports at seven community facilities across Henrico County. Ms. Tretina noted the County has selected seven County-owned facilities from libraries, government centers, and recreation and parks sites.

ORDINANCE — To Amend and Reordain Section 14-44 Titled "Advertisements and announcements," Section 14-53 Titled "Reserved," and Section 14-54 Titled "Reserved" of the Code of the County of Henrico to Limit Noise in County Parks and Recreational Facilities and Allow for the Publication of Park Rules and Regulations

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA:

1. That Section 14-44 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained as follows:

Sec. 14-44. Advertisements and announcements.

No person shall <u>may</u> erect or post within any park any sign, notice or advertisement of any nature, nor shall any person operate any musical instrument, radio, talking machine, phonograph, tape recorder or drum, or make any noise, for the purpose of attracting attention to any exhibition of any kind within a park, without prior <u>express</u>, written permission from the director <u>as part of an approved reservation of park or recreational property of the county</u>.

2. That Section 14-53 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained as follows:

Sec. 14-53. Reserved Noise restrictions.

No person may, within any park or recreational property of the county, use, operate, play, or permit to be used, operated, or played any radio, phonograph, television, projector, record, compact disc, tape, digital music, MP3 or DVD player, musical instrument, microphone, loudspeaker, sound amplifier, or similar device designed or used for producing or reproducing sound in such a manner or with such volume that it is plainly audible:

- 1. Outside the confines of an enclosed facility, where such device is located within the enclosed facility;
- 2. At a distance of 200 or more feet from the location of such device; or
- 3. Beyond the boundaries of the park in which the device is located.

The prohibition in this section does not apply when the source of the sound is a device used, operated, or played (i) as part of an event sponsored by the county or (ii) pursuant to the express, written permission of the director as part of an approved reservation of park or recreational property of the county.

3. That Section 14-54 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained as follows:

Sec. 14-54. Reserved Rules and regulations.

The director may publish rules and regulations to implement the provisions of this article for park amenities, including picnic facilities, playground facilities, recreation facilities, and athletic fields. Any violation of such rules and regulations is grounds for expulsion therefrom, enforceable by law enforcement.

- 4. The guidelines previously adopted by the Board of Supervisors for Antioch School Community Center, The Armour House and Gardens, Belmont Recreation Center, Deep Run Recreation Center, Dorey Recreation Center, Eastern Henrico Recreation Center, Elko Community Center, Henrico Theatre, Hidden Creek Recreation Center, Highland Springs Community Center, Hunton Community Center, The Springs Recreation Center, and Twin Hickory Recreation Center will have no further force or effect upon publication by the Director of Recreation and Parks of rules and regulations applicable to those recreation facilities. Notwithstanding the foregoing, reservations made under the previous guidelines will be honored by the Director and construed in accordance with the guidelines in effect at the time the reservations were made.
- 5. That this ordinance will be in full force and effect on and after its adoption.







- (i) the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control Board has issued appropriate and valid licenses to the event organizer and any vendors proposing to serve alcohol during the event; and,
- (ii) the event organizer and any vendors proposing to serve alcohol during the event comply with all rules and regulations for the service and consumption of alcohol published by the Director of Recreation and Parks to implement this resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. That the service and consumption of alcohol within reserved areas of County recreational facilities and parks during events subject to a valid special event agreement with the Division of Recreation and Parks is permitted provided that (a) the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control Board has issued appropriate and valid licenses to the event organizer and any vendors proposing to serve alcohol during the event, and (b) the event organizer and any vendors proposing to serve alcohol during the event comply with the rules and regulations promulgated by the Director of Recreation and Parks to implement this resolution; and,
- 2. That the resolution of this Board dated September 24, 2013, is superseded by this resolution.


