Henrico 4-H sale of apples, peanuts, honey, cookbooks underway; orders due Oct. 26

The Henrico County office of Virginia Cooperative Extension is selling apples, peanuts, honey and cookbooks to benefit local 4-H youth programs.

The sale features Virginia produce and six different cookbooks, each with more than 140 recipes. The items and prices are:

- Winesap or York apples, \$20 per half-bushel, or 83 cents per pound;
- Raw peanuts, with recipes, \$10 per 2-pound sack;
- Salted or unsalted cocktail peanuts, \$15 per 2-pound sack;
- Honey, \$10 per 1-pound jar; and
- Cookbooks, \$8 apiece. The titles are "On the Grill," "Kids in the Kitchen," "Slow Cooker," "Homemade Classics," "Cookies & Bars" and "Quick Fix." Each spiral-bound cookbook measures 5½ by 4¼ inches and includes a soft cover and 150 pages.

Henrico CASA to hold 11th annual art exhibition and silent auction Sept. 16

Henrico County Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) will host its 11th annual benefit art exhibition and silent auction from 6 to 9 p.m. Friday, Sept. 16 at The Crossroads Art Center, 2016 Staples Mill Road.

Proceeds from the event will support CASA, a nonprofit organization that works on behalf of abused and neglected children before the Henrico Juvenile and Domestic Relations District Court. CASA's volunteers served 367 children during fiscal 2015-16, donating nearly 20,000 hours to their cases.

The silent auction will feature works by local artists and other items with a combined value of more than \$10,000. These include paintings, jewelry, services, gift baskets, pottery and vacation packages.

While viewing the exhibition, guests will be able to learn from artists about what inspires their work. The event also will feature live music, a magic show, free hors d'oeuvres, food trucks and a cash bar.

*Henrico to provide free showing of 'Chasing the Dragon' Sept. 21
Documentary highlights dangers of opioids*

Henrico Area Mental Health & Developmental Services and the Henrico County Drug Court will present a free showing of the documentary "Chasing the Dragon: The Life of an Opiate Addict" on Wednesday, Sept. 21 to educate the public on the dangers of opioid use and addiction.

The 45-minute film, released in February by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and the United States Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), will be shown at 7 p.m. at the Henrico Theatre, 305 E. Nine Mile Road. The event also will include a service fair beginning at 6:30 p.m. and resuming after the film. More than a dozen community service providers will be on hand to answer questions and provide information about substance use disorders.

"Chasing the Dragon" features explicit, first-person accounts of people who have either abused opioids or whose children have abused opioids with tragic consequences. The film's title refers to the cycle of addiction and users' pursuit of the so-called "ultimate" high. Viewer discretion is advised.

Opioid and prescription drug abuse is a growing epidemic in the United States. More than 46,000 people die annually from drug overdoses, with half of the deaths caused by opioids and prescription drugs, according to the FBI and DEA. In addition, the country has more deaths from drugs than from car accidents, according to the agencies.
