Contestants choose their own topic and prepare an original speech. Some facts and figures may be quoted; however, it is not a technical talk, but rather your viewpoint on a particular topic. For example, you might speak on "Why I am Proud to Be An American," "How Football Changed My Life," or "Who Benefits Most, Horse or Owner." Cloverbuds are welcome to participate but will not be scored by the judges—they receive a participation ribbon and comments only. Three by five note cards may be used to help insure that main ideas are covered. Please do not read your speech! Remember speeches need to have an Introduction, a Body and a Summary. You will be judged on delivery, composition and your response to two questions asked by the judges.

- Cloverbuds & Juniors: speeches **2 to 5** minutes.
- Intermediates: speeches **3 to 6** minutes.
- Seniors: speeches **5 to 7** minute speech.

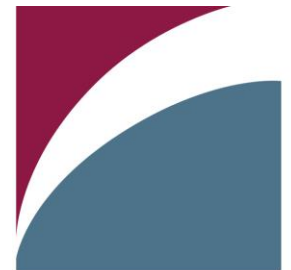
