Final Update to Investigation Involving Potentially Hazardous Materials

(Henrico County, Va.) – The incident is now stabilized after the home has been cleared by EOD officials. Resources are breaking down the perimeter and condensing operations to the immediate house under investigation. However, a portion of the **7200 block of Durwood Crescent** will continue to be closed while investigators wrap up the remainder of their investigation. This will not impact any significant traffic flow, and residents will be able to return to the neighborhood and their homes by 6:00 pm.

Records show **forty-seven (47)** calls for service to the Durwood Crescent address over the past **five (5)** years 01/01/2017 – 03/18/2022. Of that 47 calls, 20 reports were made.

The successful operation was made possible with the help of **Henrico Fire, Virginia State Police, ATF, Richmond-FBI**, and their **EOD teams**. On behalf of all these agencies involved, Henrico Police would like to thank the community and residents impacted by this incident for their patience and understanding during this extended operation.

As we conclude today's operations, officials involved with the investigation advise several credible items have been seized from the property due to their hazardous nature. Multiple agencies will continue their joint investigation, and updates will be provided as they become available.
