STRAWBERRY PLANTS – All varieties are vigorous, free of pests, and freeze well. A bundle of 25 bare-root plants is enough for a 40' row. Strawberry season runs from mid-May to mid-June.

BLACKBERRY PLANTS – These bare-root plants are thornless, semi-erect, and bear very heavy, large fruit with excellent flavor. Blackberries ripen mid-June and bear for 3 weeks or more.

RASPBERRY PLANTS – Plants are bare-root, hardy, ever-bearing, and produce red fruit which are very good for fresh consumption or for freezing. Always popular, this variety bears fruit in its first year, producing a light crop in spring and then a heavy crop in fall.

BLUEBERRY PLANTS – *NEW!!* Four-year-old POTTED plants. Plants produce 25 quarts of fruit when mature from late June until August. New Hanover variety is self-fruitful and high yielding. Three plants are rabbit-eye varieties (R-E), **two or more plants of different varieties** planted no more than 100 feet apart **are needed to ensure good pollination.**

ASPARAGUS PLANTS – Plants are hardy perennial vegetables that will live from 12-15 years. Comes as a bundle of 10 bare-root plants. Asparagus is usually harvested in the spring starting the third year.

HANDY CAMEL GIANT BAG CLIP: Put a handle on bags and carry, pour and store with ease! This handy clip reseals any large bag up to 50 lbs of pet food, kitty litter, animal feed, bird seed, fertilizers, potting mix, BBQ smoker pellets, etc. Clip is white with a 4-H clover. 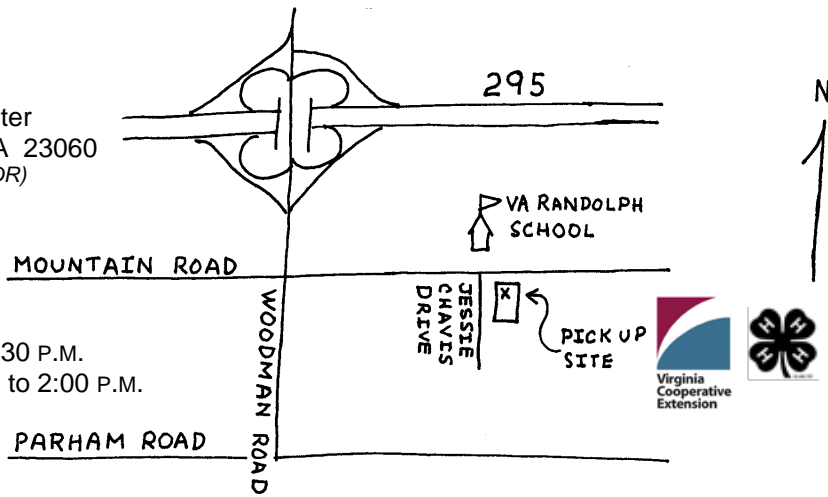

Planting Site: All listed plants grow best in full sun in well-drained soil. They need a minimum of 6 hours of direct sunlight daily during the growing season. Strawberries, blackberries, raspberries, and asparagus grow best when the soil pH is 6.0 to 6.5 and blueberries grow best in a soil pH of 5 to 5.5. The Henrico Extension Office has soil testing kits available.

Strawberries - Little space is required. You'll love them all!

Blueberries - Can serve as ornamentals, either free standing or as a hedge. They require little work.

*****Two or more blueberry plants of different rabbit-eye varieties planted no more than 100 feet apart are needed to insure good pollination.*****

Asparagus - Jersey Night hybrid has good rust and crown rot resistance. Purple Passion is a sweeter, novelty-type cultivar that is purple in color.
