Police investigating; Seeking information on what led to deadly shooting

(Henrico County, Va.) – On Saturday, January 8, 2022, just after 11 pm, Henrico 9-1-1 began receiving calls for shots fired around Byron Street and Bolling Road. Police arrived at the area to investigate. Within the 2700 block of Byron Street, an adult male was located inside an SUV with apparent injuries from a firearm. Jamaal Bright, 36, of Henrico County, was pronounced on the scene.

Detectives worked into early Sunday morning, attempting to learn more about the events leading up to this deadly incident. Joint investigation underway after a juvenile sustains burns

(Henrico County, Va.) - On Wednesday, January 12, 2022, Henrico Fire and Police responded to 6901 Messer Road – John Rolfe Middle School around 12:30 pm for a juvenile victim who sustained non-life-threatening burns. The victim was transported to an area hospital to receive treatment. The School Resource Officer (SRO) was on the property and responded until fire officials arrived to render aid.

The Henrico County Fire Marshal's Office is the primary investigative authority over this incident. The preliminary investigation reveals the injuries resulted from a lighter. This incident remains under investigation as officials consult with the Henrico Commonwealth's Attorney's Office.

Henrico County Public Schools (HCPS), Henrico Police, and Henrico Fire are all working together to conduct a thorough investigation of this incident. The safety and security of our students, staff are a priority.

Juvenile male charged after officials located a weapon on school grounds

(Henrico County, Va.) - On Wednesday, January 12, 2022, around 2 pm, Henrico Police was alerted after school officials at Varina High School received an anonymous report of a student having a gun in his car on school property. Henrico County Public Schools (HCPS) and the Henrico Police School Resource Officers (SROs) promptly reviewed the information and investigated the alleged tip.

A collaborative investigation between HCPS and the SROs resulted in the quick recovery of a weapon from a student's vehicle on school property. While there is no known threat to any school, these matters are not taken lightly. Police have taken a juvenile male into custody. The juvenile has been transported to the Henrico County Juvenile Detention Home and charged (on petitions) with possession of a firearm on school property and underage possession of a firearm.

Henrico Police commends those who step up for the safety of those around them, alerting appropriate people through channels created for reporting anonymous tips. Please take this time to ensure your firearms are accounted for and secure. Discuss the responsibilities and repercussions associated with possessing guns. Having these conversations today provides a safer Henrico tomorrow.

Henrico police investigate robbery and car-jacking incident

On November 27, 2021, at approximately 7:20 pm, an adult female exited a grocery store in the 7500 block of W. Broad Street and began walking towards her vehicle. She noticed three young black males following her. The victim attempted to get into her vehicle, but the three males quickly caught up and asked her for money. One of the males forcefully took her car keys and cell phone. All three suspects got into the vehicle and drove off towards W. Broad St. The car has since been recovered in the City of Richmond.

The three suspects are all described as medium-complected males, 18 – 22 years old, 5'8" to 5'10" in height, and average build. Please note that one of the suspects appears to have a large tear in his black jacket's right arm or shoulder area.

Henrico County Police seek information on the disappearance of Brittany Williams

(Henrico County, Va.) – In June 2021, the Henrico County Police Division became aware of an individual who came forward purporting to be Brittany Renee Williams, a female who went missing in 2000 at the age of 7 years old. Henrico County Police have maintained an open investigation into the disappearance of Brittany Williams since becoming aware of her disappearance.

Upon receiving this new information in June of 2021, the Henrico County Police Division, in coordination with the Henrico Commonwealth's Attorney's Office and the Richmond Division of the FBI, immediately began the process of determining whether the person who came forward was indeed Brittany Williams.

After a thorough investigation, we have concluded that the person who came forward is **not** Brittany Williams. Law enforcement came to these findings after a robust review of medical records, adoption records, consultation with Infectious Disease physicians, dozens of interviews, and DNA analysis.

The search for information related to the disappearance of Brittany Renee Williams continues, and anyone with information about her disappearance is encouraged to contact Henrico County Police at 804-501-5000. Stolen weapon recovered on school property; Juvenile male in custody

(Henrico County, Va.) - On Tuesday, February 1, 2022, just before 2 pm, Henrico Police was alerted by Henrico High School security personnel a student had a gun. Staff saw the student on the grounds, arriving late when the weapon was recovered. Henrico County Public Schools (HCPS) and the Henrico Police School Resource Officers (SROs) acted promptly, securing the weapon, and taking the juvenile male into custody.

While there is no known threat to the school, its students, and staff, these matters are not taken lightly. Therefore, the prompt action of all personnel helps ensure our campuses remain a safe place for learning.

The juvenile has been transported to the Henrico County Juvenile Detention Home and charged (on petitions) with possession of a firearm on school property, concealed weapon, underage possession of a firearm, and possession of a stolen firearm.

Please take this time to ensure your firearms are accounted for and secure. Discuss the responsibilities and repercussions associated with possessing guns. Having these conversations today provides a safer Henrico tomorrow.

Commercial robbery, Suspect arrested following day

(Henrico County, Va.) -On Monday, January 31, 2022, shortly after 10:30 am, Henrico Police responded to the 8000 block of W. Broad Steet for a commercial robbery. Upon arrival, police confirmed no injuries and that a man entered the bank, demanded money, and left towards Parham Road.

Multiple entities within the Police Division arrived to support the investigation, including our federal partners with the FBI. A suspect was developed and identified as 34-year-old James T. Hendricks of New Jersey. Within 24-hours, Mr. Hendricks was into custody without incident. Mr. Hendricks was arrested on charges of robbery and the use of a firearm in the commission of a felony. Mr. Hendricks was transported to the Henrico County jail, where he is held without bond.

Anyone involved or a witness to a crime needs to remember as much detail as possible. For example, what color was the clothing? What is the person(s), height, weight? What type of vehicle was involved, and what direction did it go? The more information our officers have earlier in their investigation, the faster an apprehension is possible. Like yesterday, our community and law enforcement worked quickly to affect an arrest.

Juvenile in custody after firearm recovered on school property

(Henrico County, Va.) - On Thursday, February 3, 2022, before 10 am, Henrico Police was alerted by Henrico County Public School (HCPS) personnel of an incident where a juvenile brandished a handgun yesterday (February 2, 2022) at Godwin High School. Today, the Henrico School Resource Officer (SRO) and school administration were able to detain the juvenile male and investigate the allegations. A handgun and ammunition were recovered from his belongings.

While police and school administration will thoroughly investigate the brandishing incident, police have no further credible threats toward any specific school, student, or staff members. Henrico Police and HCPS maintain a zero tolerance for these actions and this behavior and is not taken lightly.

The juvenile will be transported to the Henrico County Juvenile Detention Home and is charged (on petitions) with possession of a firearm on school property, possession of a concealed weapon, underage possession of a firearm, and possession of marijuana on school property.

Henrico Police remind parents and guardians to have a conversation about the consequences of this behavior. "Firearms have no place on school campuses," says Lieutenant Matt Pecka. Please take the time to limit access to any firearms and make sure they are accounted for and secure. Taking these steps and having these conversations provides a safer community for us all.

Domestic-Related Abduction of 6-year-old Female

(Henrico County, Va.) – Henrico Police have obtained a **felony abduction warrant (18.2-47)** for **Vyolet Cirko, 51, of Central Islip, New York**. Detectives are investigating this as a domestic-related abduction in which a 6-year-old female is missing. On Tuesday, February 22, 2022, the guardian gave her mother-in-law Vyolet Cirko permission to take Ameenah Evans, 6, of Brentwood, New York, to Virginia to see family. Ms. Cirko and Ameenah were supposed to return to New York on Friday, February 25, 2022, but never did.

The mother traveled from New York to Virginia to meet Ms. Cirko to regain custody of Ameenah; however, Ms. Cirko never appeared at the agreed-upon meeting location in the 4500 block of S. Laburnum Avenue (White Oak). Attempts to locate Ms. Cirko by law enforcement and Ameenah's family have recently been unsuccessful.

Ameenah Evans is described as a fair-skinned, 6-year-old black female, 70-75 pounds, 3 ft 5 inches with brown hair and brown eyes, and a scar over her left eye. The child is suspected to still be in the guardianship of Vyolet Cirko, 51, who is last known to be operating a White Toyota Rav4 with New York license plates - GUJ-2726.

Robbery: Suspect apprehended during traffic stop

(Henrico County, Va.) - On Monday, February 28, 2022, Henrico Police responded to two robberies along Darbytown Road, one around 12:45 pm and the second occurring around 1:00 pm. Henrico Police were successful in apprehending the suspect that same day.

The suspect entered the store wearing a black coat, pants, and white shoes while displaying a handgun and demanding cash from the clerk. The suspect fled on foot and later committed a second robbery where the suspect stole money before running on foot again.

Henrico Police were able to take Jaquan Rakim Roberts, 20, of Henrico County, into custody without incident after initiating a traffic stop in the area. Roberts is charged with two counts of robbery and two counts of use of a firearm in the commission of a felony. He is being held without bond at the Henrico County jail.

Second homicide; Suspect in custody same day

(Henrico County, Va.) – On Tuesday, March 1, 2022, first responders were called to the 2500 block of Bromby Street for a medical emergency just before 10:30 pm. Once on scene, responders determined this was an active crime scene and deemed it a homicide, the second homicide in Henrico County in 2022.

Ahoto Mulazim, 57, of Henrico County, was pronounced on scene by medical personnel. The family on the scene was able to work closely with police allowing for a swift apprehension of the person responsible.

Henrico Police was able to take **Shawn Keon Mickie, 38**, of Henrico County, into custody before midnight in the 100 block of Engleside Drive for his role in this critical incident. Mickie is charged with second-degree murder and the use of a firearm in the commission of a felony. He will remain in custody at the Henrico County jail without bond.

Henrico Responds to Execute Search Warrant; Prompts Joint Investigation

(Henrico County, Va.) – Henrico Police, Fire, and members of the Richmond Field Office of the FBI are now on scene along the 7200 block of W. Durwood Crescent after Henrico Police executed a search warrant around 12:30 pm today. As police entered the residence under the authority of a search warrant, items encountered within the home prompted officers to exit and secure the area.

Henrico Police have asked residents exceptionally close to the scene to evacuate the area out of caution for everyone's safety - both residents and first responders. Others within the community immediately affected have been alerted to the heavy presence of first responders by Henrico's Community Policing Unit.

The incident stems from a call yesterday where Henrico Police responded to the 9600 block of Southmill Drive to investigate an alleged domestic assault around 1:30 pm.

Police arrested Sydney Crowe, 21 of Henrico, on outstanding warrants. As a result of the ongoing investigation into that incident, Michael O. Hardy, 52 of Henrico, was taken into custody later that evening along Southmill Drive on alleged charges of strangulation and assault. Both adults have ties to the Durwood Crescent address.

Area roadways remain restricted while EOD technicians work to deem the home safe.

On behalf of all first responders working together into the evening, we appreciate the communities support and understanding, while safety is of utmost importance. Update to Investigation Involving Potentially Hazardous Materials

(Henrico County, Va.) – Crews and investigators from Henrico Police, Fire, Virginia State Police, ATF, FBI, and EOD Officials have resumed operations into a suspicious situation inside a residence located along the **7200 block of Durwood Crescent**. This operation is expected to take many hours as officials render several potentially hazardous materials safe. Some residents may have heard a loud sound in the area late last night; this sound was not an explosion but was caused by EOD technicians to render materials safe.

This incident stems from a call on Wednesday, March 16, 2022, when officers responded to the **9600 block of Southmill Dr.** to investigate an alleged domestic assault around 1:30 pm.

Police arrested **Sydney Crowe, 21 of Henrico**, on outstanding warrants. As a result of the ongoing investigation into that incident, **Michael O. Hardy, 52 of Henrico**, was taken into custody later that evening along Southmill Dr. on alleged charges of strangulation and assault. Both adults have ties to the Durwood Crescent address.

Nearby residents continue to be evacuated out of an abundance of caution due to the nature of the materials discovered in and around the home. As the investigation enters the **24-Hour** mark, officials want to ensure the community that they are handling this potentially hazardous situation with the utmost caution and would like to thank area residents displaced by this incident for their patience and understanding as the investigation continues.

Final Update to Investigation Involving Potentially Hazardous Materials

(Henrico County, Va.) – The incident is now stabilized after the home has been cleared by EOD officials. Resources are breaking down the perimeter and condensing operations to the immediate house under investigation. However, a portion of the **7200 block of Durwood Crescent** will continue to be closed while investigators wrap up the remainder of their investigation. This will not impact any significant traffic flow, and residents will be able to return to the neighborhood and their homes by 6:00 pm.

Records show **forty-seven (47)** calls for service to the Durwood Crescent address over the past **five (5)** years 01/01/2017 – 03/18/2022. Of that 47 calls, 20 reports were made.

The successful operation was made possible with the help of **Henrico Fire, Virginia State Police, ATF, Richmond-FBI,** and their **EOD teams**. On behalf of all these agencies involved, Henrico Police would like to thank the community and residents impacted by this incident for their patience and understanding during this extended operation.

As we conclude today's operations, officials involved with the investigation advise several credible items have been seized from the property due to their hazardous nature. Multiple agencies will continue their joint investigation, and updates will be provided as they become available.

Charges Served In Connection To Joint EOD Investigation

(Henrico County, Va.) – As a result of a joint investigation that included Henrico Police, Henrico Fire Marshal's Office, Henrico Fire's Hazardous Incident Team, Virginia State Police, ATF, Henrico Commonwealth's Attorney's Office, Richmond-FBI, and their EOD teams, charges have been filed against **Michael O. Juvenile in detention after firearm was recovered inside high school

(HENRICO COUNTY, Va.) - On Thursday, April 21, 2022, during the afternoon hours, Henrico County Public Schools (HCPS) personnel alerted Henrico Police after staff observed a juvenile student had a handgun at Varina High School, in the 7000 block of Messer Road. The Henrico School Resource Officer (SRO) and school administration were able to detain the juvenile male and seize the weapon.

Henrico Police and HCPS personnel work closely in any ongoing investigation. While police and school administration will thoroughly investigate the fact, there was a weapon on school grounds; there have been no credible threats toward any specific student or staff members. In addition, Henrico Police and HCPS maintain a zero-tolerance for these actions, and this behavior comes with consequences.

The juvenile will be transported to the Henrico County Juvenile Detention Home and is charged (on petitions) with possession of a firearm on school property, a concealed weapon, and underage possession of a gun. The juvenile's identity is not being released due to age.

"We want to remind parents and guardians not to wait for these direct yet important conversations about the consequences of possessing firearms," says Lieutenant Matt Pecka. "Firearms have no place in our schools nor anywhere on campus," says Pecka.

Take the time to limit access to any firearms and make sure they are accounted for and secure. Taking these steps today provides for a safer community tomorrow.



Multi-agency effort; James River search update; Body of missing woman recovered

(Richmond, VA) — At approximately 1:30 p.m. this afternoon, the body of Lauren E. Winstead was recovered from the James River just west of the Powhite Parkway Bridge, she is one of two women who went missing near Boshers' Dam in the James River in Henrico County on Monday, May 30. Next of kin has been notified and the Medical Examiner will determine cause and manner of death.

The search for Sarah E. Erway will continue and is transitioning from a search and rescue mission to a recovery operation.

The robust and thorough search involved resources from multiple agencies and included three twelve-hour operational periods over the span of three consecutive days, including the Richmond Fire Department, Richmond Office of Emergency Management, Chesterfield Fire and EMS, Henrico Fire, Henrico Marine Police, Henrico Aviation Unit, Hanover Fire and EMS, Goochland County Fire and Rescue, Virginia Department of Emergency Management (VDEM), The State Police (Med-Flight), Richmond Police Department, Richmond Ambulance Authority, Henrico County Police Division and the United States Coast Guard.

Operations were conducted in three phases with primary, secondary and tertiary searches.

Phase One - Monday May 30, 2022: The Boshers' Dam to the Z-Dam

Phase Two – Tuesday, May 31, 2022: The Z-Dam to First Break (Western portion of Belle Isle)

Phase Three – Wednesday, June 1, 2022: First Break (Western portion of Belle Isle) to the James River Bridge (I-95)

Teen Charged with Assault in Pellet Gun Incidents

(Henrico County, Va.) – On Tuesday, June 7, 2022, at 6:13 p.m. Henrico Police responded to the 5500 block of Barnsley Terrace for a reported assault. Upon arriving at the scene, officers spoke with the complainant who stated his daughter, and her friend were hit by pellets from a toy gun.

Video surveillance from the home captured the incident. The video showed the two juvenile girls start to walk down the street as the male driver of a dark gray Tesla Model S began firing a toy gun. Both juveniles suffered minor injuries but were not transported to an area hospital.

The driver of the vehicle was later identified as **Fernan Andres Chacon Gonzalez, 18, of Henrico**. Chacon admitted responsibility for driving the vehicle and shooting at random bystanders with a gel blaster pellet gun.

Meanwhile, investigators were able to link the suspect to other similar incidents in the last 48 hours.

A woman reported a man inside a dark gray Tesla had shot pellets at the complainant on June 6, 2022, in the 11300 block of Nuckols Road. The woman suffered minor injuries. Additionally, on June 7, two other incidents were reported in the 4900 block of Hickory Meadows Court and 5900 block of Dorrington Circle. Minor injuries were sustained in the Hickory Meadows Court incident, no injuries were reported on Dorrington Circle.

Gonzalez faces four counts of simple assault and one count of malicious shooting into an occupied moving vehicle. He is currently booked at Henrico Jail West.

Henrico Police urges its citizens to be aware of their surroundings and remind folks about the repercussions of using toy guns in a dangerous way.





Two Males Arrested in Connection to Vehicle Thefts Across Metro-Richmond

(Update 2)

(Henrico County, Va.) – On Friday, July 1, 2022, two males wanted in connection to several auto thefts in the metro-Richmond area were arrested in Florida by the Hollywood Police Department.

Sincere Price, 20, of Richmond and a juvenile male, of Chesterfield, were arrested on stolen weapons charges. Price was also charged with resisting arrest. Both individuals are currently being held at correctional facilities in Broward County, Florida.

Update 2:

Henrico Police have identified the deceased man in Wednesday's officer-involved shooting as **Malachi Lavar Carroll, 20, of Henrico**.

Despite a large police presence in the Highland Springs neighborhood through much of the overnight hours, this remains a very active and ongoing investigation.

After speaking with witnesses inside the residence, detectives have determined that while officers were inside, Carroll attempted to assault an individual and an officer with a knife. It was at that time the officer discharged their weapon.

The officer involved in the incident has been employed by the Division since June 2020. She has been placed on an administrative assignment, pending a complete and thorough investigation.

The Officer-Involved Investigations Team investigates any discharge of a firearm by a Police Division member. The officer's body camera footage is being reviewed, and the Division is working closely with the Henrico Commonwealth Attorney's Office.

"This is a difficult situation for all involved, and our team is working hard to determine the facts of what happened last night," said Chief of Police Eric D. English.

This was an isolated incident within a residence. Henrico Police is committed to transparency and accountability in all situations.

The Division has a responsibility to ensure not only the parties involved in the incident are safe and taken care of, but also those in the neighborhood who are dealing with the influx of first responders on scene.

We are committed to ensuring information is released to the public in an accurate and timely manner, while also respecting those who are working the investigation alongside the family involved.



Man Apprehended in Connection to String of Armed Robberies

(Henrico County, Va.) – On Wednesday, November 30, 2022, Henrico Police took into custody a Henrico man wanted in connection to a string of armed commercial robberies across the county.

These robberies, dating back to October 8, primarily occurred in the West End of the county. In each of these incidents, investigators noted similarities between the subject of each robbery; **Hassan Malik Rogers, 32, of Henrico**, was later developed as a suspect.

Over the course of the last two months, multiple units within the Henrico County Police Division were able to utilize resources to take Rogers into custody.

He was arrested on Nov. 30 following a pursuit into the City of Richmond where his vehicle was involved in a crash. Rogers then fled on foot but was later apprehended. He faces charges of robbery (x2), use of a firearm in the commission of a felony (x2), possession of firearm by a convicted felon (x2), abduction, operating a vehicle on a revoked license and eluding police.

“This arrest is a prime example of the teamwork that makes up Henrico County Police,” said **Henrico Chief of Police Eric D. English**. “This was a tremendous operation, collaboration and arrest of a dangerous individual which ultimately led to clearing multiple cases.”

Henrico Police Investigates Fatal Train vs Pedestrian Incident

(Henrico County, Va.) – On Tuesday, December 20, 2022, at approximately 7:35 a.m., Henrico Police responded to the railroad crossing near Hungary Road and Purcell Road after a person was fatally injured on the railroad tracks. An Amtrak passenger train was involved in the incident and remained on the scene pending an investigation.

Multiple resources from Henrico Police are on the scene, including Crash Reconstruction Investigators, Patrol Bureau, and Criminal Investigations. Henrico Police is working closely with Amtrak regarding the investigation which has released the following statement:

Today, the Amtrak Northeast Regional train 174 was traveling from Richmond to Boston. At approximately 8 a.m., an individual who was trespassing on the track came into contact with the train. There have been no reported injuries to passengers or crew onboard. Service has been temporarily halted. Trains traveling through the area will experience delays. Amtrak is working with local law enforcement to investigate the incident. I'll provide updates as new information becomes available.

No traffic is affected as the train had cleared the crossing between Old Staples Mill Road and Purcell Road. Police are working to identify the victim, an adult male, notify next of kin and work with Virginia's Office of the Chief Medical Examiner during this death investigation. In addition, Henrico Police works alongside it's federal partners (i.e.: NTSB, FRA, CSX Police, and Amtrak Police).

As new information is received, Henrico Police and Amtrak will provide updates. This fatal incident is tragic for everyone as we near the holidays, and we appreciate the passengers' patience and understanding during this investigation.

Police Seeking Additional Details Into Early Morning Homicide

(Henrico County, Va.) – On Tuesday, December 20, 2022, at approximately 1:12 a.m., Henrico Police responded to the **2700 block of Byron Street** for the report of a shooting.

First responders arrived and rendered aid, ultimately transporting two adults, one male and one female, to the hospital for treatment. The male, **39-year-old Jamey Ramon Kidd**, later died at the hospital. Detectives will continue to work with the State's Office of the Medical Examiner on the exact cause of death.

Jamaika Michele Whitehurst, 29, was treated for non-life-threatening injuries, released, and served one count of second-degree murder. Whitehurst is at the Henrico County Jail, held without bond.

Henrico Police Partners With Project Beloved on Soft Interview Room

(Henrico County, Va.) – The Henrico County Police Division is proud to announce that it has opened a new soft interview room for survivors with the assistance of Project Beloved: The Molly Jane Mission.

Project Beloved is a nonprofit organization that focuses on empowering sexual assault survivors. It was started by a mother who lost her daughter to sexual assault violence. The organization strives to provide survivors with resources to help them through the process of finding justice, including backpacks with essential items to be given after rape kits are performed, and the creation of soft interview rooms. Soft interview rooms are a component of trauma-informed care that allows survivors to feel safe and comfortable when talking to law enforcement about the incident that occurred.

Each soft interview room features three comfortable chairs: one for a law enforcement officer, one for the survivor, and one may be used by a second officer or an advocate for the survivor. The rooms are softly lit, and feature wall photographs taken by a sexual assault victim who was an amateur photographer before her death. Soft interview rooms typically include decorative pieces, weighted blankets, comforting scents, and other items that can help a survivor feel safe while telling their story.

Henrico Police's soft interview room is the 58th room that Project Beloved has installed in the United States, and the third in Virginia, with others located at Virginia Military Institute and the Charlottesville Commonwealth's Attorney's Office. It will be used for survivors only, while those suspected of committing crimes will continue to be interviewed in traditional interview rooms.

Henrico Police takes sexual assault cases very seriously, and encourages survivors to come forward and report any incidents. If you're a survivor of sexual assault violence, please know there is help available. Police Seeking Answers; Juvenile Homicide Investigation Underway

(Henrico County, Va.) – On Sunday, December 25, 2022, at approximately 11:13 p.m., Henrico Police responded to the 100 block of Engleside Court for a shooting. Upon arrival, first responders located a male outside the apartment with an apparent gunshot wound and rendered aid until EMS officials arrived. The male was transported to the hospital, where he later died.

The victim was identified as a juvenile male; therefore, his name is not being released publicly. In addition, detectives will continue to work closely with the State's Office of the Chief Medical Examiner as part of the ongoing investigation.

Police have a person in custody as this investigation continued into the morning hours on December 26, 2022. Kamonte Ali Noble, 20, was located nearby as police responded to another suspicious call for service, also in the 100 block of Engleside Court. Noble has been charged with second-degree murder and is being held without bond on this offense, among others related to both incidents. Police Make Arrest in Langley Drive Homicide

UPDATE 1

(Henrico County, Va.) – Henrico Police has made an arrest in connection to the December 27 homicide which occurred in the 8100 block of Langley Drive.

Upon arrival, officers located **Andre Leonard Malmberg** inside a residence with apparent stab wounds. He was pronounced deceased at the scene.

During the course of the investigation, a suspect was identified. On December 28, a warrant for 2nd degree murder was obtained for **Jermaine Lee Branch, 47, of Henrico**. Branch was a known individual to Malmberg.

Branch was located at a residence within the Richmond city limits and taken into custody with the assistance of Richmond Police. He was later transported to Henrico County.

Henrico Police continues to work with the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner which will ultimately determine a cause and manner of death.
