Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by the Chair, at 10:00 a.m.

Approval of last meeting minutes-March 6 & 11

Public Comments

Geoffrey J. McVeigh- Did the board review the article regarding fraud in the election system? There needs to be an investigation into the election system. Mr. McVeigh read a statement regarding the 2020 Election. He stated there's corruption in the election system and fraud in the election results.

Thomas O'Keefe-stated it's not fair that the board is not addressing the questions during the board meeting. He has not received a response to how the ballots are collected from the drop boxes. During a board meeting an Election Official stated that (3) Absentee ballots with the same name were surrendered. The Registrar in the last meeting stated that was not the case. Mr. O'Keefe would like this matter investigated a little further. He's requesting to have the board meeting times changed to an evening schedule. The overtime incentive for county employees can allow staff to attend the meetings outside their normal work schedule.

Karen Sowers-questions the outside ballot drop boxes in Henrico County. During her research on the 2020 Election fraud and watching the "2000 Mules" documentary – security camera footage showed vandalism with outside drop boxes. She requests that Henrico County remove all outside drop boxes before the next upcoming election. The security cameras are not a deterrent.

Douglas Clark- has requested a separate meeting with the Electoral Board member, Mr. Cobb, III. It has not yet happened. Mr. Clark has provided additional typed information for the board to review to amend the minutes. He also included a (7) page copy of a lawsuit happening in Maryland for the board to review. Mr Clark stated that Henrico County is subject to a lawsuit in violation of the law regarding ES&S software- access to hardware/software inspection.

Ken Vande Vrede-Will not be happy with Elections until they are safe and secure. He has studied the Election System with federal elections. He is retired and has devoted his time to review Election Integrity. He requests time to show evidence of election fraud in Virginia.

Serena Moser -has researched experts on voting machines and how the election is being stolen. She requests that the electoral board review the two documentaries: "Let My People Go" & "2000 Mules". After working as an election official, she did not feel comfortable signing the election forms to certify the election. She stated, the board's salary is paid by the citizens, and they request that you all watch the documentary.

Mr. Cobb, III, stated the electoral board doesn't control the Voter Registration list. The State Board of Elections controls this list. He will not schedule a meeting with Mr. Clark and himself. Mr. Cobb, III, has directed Mr. Clark to contact John O'Bannon, SBE Chairman, to set up a group meeting. Mr. Cobb, III, also stated that the "2000 Mules" documentary did not support any claims regarding 2020 Election fraud and this was proven in Georgia's court system. Mr. Cobb, III, stated he will not meet to discuss "2000 Mules" and if he was going to watch fairytales it would be with his Grandchildren.

Approval of the ballot order-June 2024, Primary Election-Ms. Middlesworth

There will be 1,032 (852-workers, 90-Chiefs, 90 Assistant Chiefs) Election Officers working for the June 2024 Primary Election. The Registrar will order 60% of ballots for the June Primary. Ms. Middlesworth asked the Electoral Board to make a motion to allow 10- election workers for the Dual Primary precincts & 9 election workers for the Republican precincts and for the Registrar's office to order 60% ballot for the June 2024 Primary Election.

On a motion by Mr. Cobb, III and seconded by Mrs. Woodson and unanimous vote the electoral board approved the 1,032 election workers for the June Primary: 10-election workers for the Dual Primary precincts, 9-election workers for the Republican precincts and the ordering of 60% ballots for the June 2024, Election.
