Mock Drill Alert– Your Response Matters!

On June 19, Henrico and Chickahominy MRC volunteers responded to the quarterly mock drill alert. Mock drills are important because they show volunteers how they will be alerted from the health department in case of a real emergency. 140 volunteers responded to the drill! We reached our goal with a **80% response rate!** Thank you to everyone who responded!

It is important for us to familiarize ourselves with this form of communication. If you do not have time to participate in day-to-day opportunities, that is okay. However, it is a volunteer responsibility to respond to the quarterly mock drills. A response to the mock drill is either considered "I'm Available" or "I'm Not Available".

Tuberculosis Investigation

In April, MRC Volunteers, **Mounika Bazar, Deneen Harris, Susan Bennett, and Sonia Salmon** helped continued efforts with the tuberculosis investigation from last quarter. In February, there was a confirmed active case of tuberculosis (TB) disease affiliated with a local high school. Volunteers helped interview individuals at the school and provided administrative support.



REVIVE! Training

On June 5th, **Don White, Ernest Fornaris, and Syreen Goulmamine** attended REVIVE! training at the Richmond City Health Department. The training was provided to the MRC Volunteers of Richmond City, Henrico, and Chickahominy Health Districts. This training helps individuals recognize and respond to opioid overdoses. Naloxone nasal spray was provided to all participants at no cost.
