## Materials:

Scissors

Googly eyes

Plastic bottles

Small Styrofoam balls

Tempera paint

Pipe cleaners

Bottle caps

## Prep:

Gather supplies

## Instructions for Ladybugs:

1. Cut off the bottom half of the water bottles.
2. Paint the outside different colors with dots like a ladybug.
3. Paint a Styrofoam ball for the head.
4. Once dry, glue Styrofoam head to bottle body.
5. Glue google eyes to head.
6. Cut small pipe cleaner bits and stick in head for antennas.



## Instructions for Pigs:

1. Use small plastic bottles and glue four extra caps on the bottom of the bottle for the four feet of the pig.
2. Paint the pig, the nose, and the feet whatever color you would like.
3. As it dries, cut ears out of construction paper for ears. Cut a pipe cleaner in half for the tail.
4. After it dries, glue the ears where the bottle starts to slope into the neck. Glue the pipe cleaner to the back of the bottle. Glue googly eyes on the front of the bottle.
