

Henrico Police - Crash Team Detectives, have identified a person of interest and a vehicle involved in the fatal hit-and-run crash along Laburnum Avenue. While this is an essential component of any investigation, Detectives are still conducting a thorough investigation. Confirmed Rabies Case, First in 2020

On January 24, 2020, Henrico Police Animal Protection responded to the 7800 block of Meherrin Road in the Tuckahoe District for a rabies exposure. It was reported to officers that a dog had fought with a raccoon in the owner's yard. The injured raccoon escaped and died from its injuries on an adjoining property.

The raccoon was recovered and submitted to the State Lab for rabies testing. The raccoon tested positive. The dog that was involved received rabies boosters and will be quarantined at the owner's home. There were no additional animal or human exposures reported. This is the first confirmed rabies case in Henrico County in 2020.

Three Vehicle Crash – Byron Street and Austin Avenue

At 9:46 a.m., on January 30, 2020, Henrico first responders were dispatched to a three-vehicle crash at the intersection of Byron Street and Austin Avenue. Responders from police and fire arrived and jointly worked to investigate and tend to the injured. There were three vehicles involved, a van, and two sedans. There were five passengers among the three cars. Two were injured and transported to an area hospital, one driver was treated and remained on scene, and two related adults were fatally injured.

Today, two members of our community were lost, and our thoughts are with the family during this difficult time. Ms. Miranda Tyler and her son, Teon Tyler, of Henrico County, were both fatally injured.

Second Positive Rabies Case in Henrico


Wanted:

Traffic Crash: Staples Mill at Bethlehem Road

On **Friday, February 14, 2020**, just after 6:00 a.m., Henrico 9-1-1 received a call for a pedestrian struck by a car near the intersection of Staples Mill Road and Bethlehem Road. First responders arrived quickly and rendered aid, transporting the victim to an area hospital with critical injuries. The driver immediately stopped and is working with Crash Team Detectives during their investigation. The preliminary investigation indicates that speed nor alcohol were factors in this crash.

Today, the Crash Team Detectives were notified the pedestrian has succumbed due to the injuries she received. The victim, **Ms. Shelly Johnson, age 41**, is a resident of Henrico County. The preliminary investigation reveals Ms. Johnson was walking from the 4000 block of Bethlehem Road towards the convenient store located at the corner of the intersection and a Hyundai sedan was traveling eastbound on Staples Mill Road when the crash occurred. At 9:32, on March 2, 2020, Henrico police responded to the intersection of Glenside Drive at Cloverdale Street, near the entrance to the Park & Ride for the report of a two-vehicle crash. The preliminary investigation reveals a white Ford and a blue Toyota sedan collided in the intersection.

Officer-Involved Incident While Assisting in Warrant Service of Carjacking Suspect

On Thursday, March 5, 2020, at approximately 8:47 p.m., Henrico Police responded to the 2300 block of Strangford Court to assist the Richmond Police Department in locating a wanted subject. Officers located and made contact with the wanted subject in the driveway, who then fled inside the private residence. As officers approached the house, they observed the male subject assaulting a female victim, stabbing her with a knife. A Henrico Police officer, who was positioned closest to the attacker, discharged his service weapon, striking the adult male.

Aid was rendered to the adult male and adult female; both were transported to area hospitals. The adult female victim sustained multiple stab wounds but is reportedly in critical but stable condition. The adult male died as a result of his injuries. His identity will be released upon notification of his next-of-kin.

Henrico Police can confirm there was a 3-year-old in the residence at the time of the event; fortunately, the child was not harmed by the attacker. The child is currently being cared for by family members in the Richmond area.

The adult male suspect was being served an arrest warrant for a carjacking that occurred February 25, 2020 in the City of Richmond.

“Our thoughts and prayers are with all those involved in this traumatic event. This incident underscores the difficult decisions law enforcement officers are faced with on a daily basis. Sworn to serve and protect, our officers are trained to use deadly force as an absolute last resort. However, initial details in this incident suggest the actions of the officers saved the life of the female victim being violently attacked – had they not acted more swiftly, more lives may have been tragically lost. I continue to have complete faith in the men and women sworn to protect our community and have every confidence in the teams tasked with objectively investigating this incident. Please be mindful we are in the very early stages of this investigation and will provide updates as we gather the facts.”

Mother Speaks About Sons 1991 Death

On **August 23, 1991**, at approximately 4:00 p.m. the Henrico Fire Division responded to the I-64 west off-ramp onto Mechanicsville Turnpike in Henrico County, for a vehicle on fire. The Fire Division arrived on the scene and observed a white, 1979 Ford pick-up truck, where the hood was up, and the engine compartment was smoldering.

The Fire Division extinguished the fire and subsequently located a male, later identified as **16-year-old Marshall Ray Butler**, in the passenger floorboard of the truck, slumped over the seat, deceased. It was then determined that Butler had been severely beaten and stabbed multiple times. At the time, witnesses described a male subject running across the interstate from the burning truck. Evidence from the vehicle was collected and included several sets of latent fingerprints, which have been identified to two person(s) of interest in the case.

Marshall was last seen with another male seated in the passenger seat of the pickup truck earlier that same afternoon. During this investigation, the Police Division interviewed over 100 witnesses and other people, who provided insight into Marshall's murder. Witness statements, as well as evidence collected at the scene, has indicated Marshall was assaulted by more than one individual, and possibly by someone that was known to him. Witnesses have suggested that the suspects may have been picked up in a vehicle by a third person after the murder occurred.

Cold Case: Gary Earl Post, Sr. Homicide

On April 4, 2007, at approximately 12:37 pm, Henrico Police received an emergency call to respond to the (former) Legacy Inn located in 5200 hundred block of Airport Square Lane regarding a medical emergency. There were reports a male subject was shot in the chest at that location. Witnesses had observed four black males wearing masks, and were in a silver vehicle, before and after the incident.

Information was obtained that on April 3, 2007, Gary Post and his two sons, had checked into a room at the Legacy Inn. They were planning to fly to Texas in the morning for a wedding. While they moved items between their car and the room, four masked black males entered their room and demanded money. One of the males shot Gary Post Sr, in the chest. Mr. Post and sons had put their hands up, telling the suspects that they would not give them any problems. The suspects began retreating out of the room when one of the suspects shot Mr. Post.

The suspects were last seen by witnesses getting into a silver colored vehicle and fleeing the scene. Witnesses had observed the suspect vehicle, driving in and out of the motel all day long. The criminal investigators, in this case, had previously developed some useful information in the case. The investigations team is hoping someone in the community has additional information to move this case forward.

Fraud Alert

Henrico Police have spoken to area residents who have become fraud victims and have suffered a financial loss as part of an on-going scam. A suspect makes a call in these reported instances, claiming your social security number has been linked to drug trafficking and money laundering. The suspect requests victims to remove all their money from their bank accounts so the funds will not be tied up in any criminal investigation.

In previous instances, the victims have been instructed to use gift cards and cryptocurrency to transfer their money. The suspected representative claims a local law enforcement agency member will contact them to receive the funds for safekeeping or transfer the money.

The victims then receive a call from an 804-501 number, which may vary; however, these 501 prefix numbers are well known throughout Henrico County and may seem legitimate to our community members. The suspect's goal is to gain the credibility of Henrico County or the Henrico County Police Division. These calls have been reported to take up to four hours and claim to be a law enforcement member. There have been threats of arrest or complex legal procedures if you do not comply, therefore causing a great deal of concern.

Henrico Police wants to remind residents of these safety tips:

- Know who you are dealing with, even if the phone number appears legitimate.
- Guard your personal information and do not give it out over the phone.
- Henrico Police will not ask to transfer money on your behalf.
- Henrico Police will not demand immediate payment from you,
- Henrico will not require payment by cash, gift-card, wire transfer, or any pre-paid cards.
- Work with your banking institutions to make sure you have increased safety measures on your accounts.

Henrico County Confirms Fifth Rabies Case in 2020

On October 1, 2020, Henrico Police Animal Protection responded to the 3000 block of Silverbush Court in the Brookland District for an aggressive raccoon. Officers discovered that a resident had been chased by a raccoon as they exited their home to walk to their car. The resident was able to escape from the animal after it had initially grabbed them by the shoe.

The raccoon was submitted to the State Lab for testing. The raccoon tested positive for rabies. The person involved in the incident has been notified and is consulting with Health Department. There were no additional animal or human exposures reported. This is the fifth confirmed rabies case in Henrico County in 2020.

Henrico Police Animal Protection reminds everyone to be sure to keep their pets' rabies vaccinations current to ensure the safety of their pets and our community. Please report abnormal wildlife behavior and any possible rabies exposures to the Henrico Police Non-Emergency Communications Center at (804) 501-5000.

Pet owners must register and pay at the cashier's office in the Administration Building before seeing a veterinarian on the first level of the parking deck. 

Death Investigation Underway After Man Found Dead in Henrico Hotel

On November 8, 2020, the Henrico County Police Division responded to a hotel located in the 1000 block of Virginia Center Parkway for a medical emergency. Upon arrival, first responders found an adult male, later identified as 38-year-old Bert Belasco III, of Woodland Hills, Calif., deceased.

Hotel staff, who had received a call to check on Mr. Belasco's welfare when family and friends could not reach him, called the Division's Emergency Communications Center at 2:52 a.m. Mr. Belasco was pronounced on scene.

Attempted Robbery – Henrico’s Westend



Suspects Arrested After Two Robberies in Henrico

On Tuesday, November 17, 2020, around 4:38, Henrico Police Officers were called to the 4200 block of Innslake Drive for the report of a robbery. The victim was selling two electronic gaming devices on an app and agreed to meet at an address along Innslake Drive. Two males arrived, grabbed both systems, and ran off, getting into different vehicles. The victim tried to open one of the passenger doors the suspect was driving, and the suspect displayed a gun. Marquan Demont Lane and Demonta Leon Blunt were identified as suspects in this robbery.

Later, Henrico Police Officers were in the 4500 block of S. Laburnum Avenue when another robbery occurred around 6:56 pm. Officers quickly reacted and apprehended two individuals, and a third suspect was apprehended a short time later. The victim advised he was meeting to purchase an electronic device from an individual through an app.

4. **Deontae Johnson-Chappelle, 22, of Henrico** - Robbery, Conspiracy to Commit Robbery, and Use of a firearm in the commission of a felony (Second Incident).

Driver Charged in Fatal Crash

On October 17, 2020 at 5:37 p.m., Henrico Police and Fire first responders were dispatched to the intersection of Patterson Avenue and Lauderdale Drive for a traffic crash. Shooting Leaves 2 Victims with Critical Injuries and Traffic Detoured

On December 11, 2020, at 12:31, the Emergency 9-1-1 team began receiving calls about a shooting in the area of Parham Road and Three Chopt Road. Police located two victims, both struck by gunfire. Henrico Fire/EMS transported the two victims to area hospitals with critical injuries.

Due to the heavy police presence and active crime scene, traffic was reduced to one lane from Lawndell Road to Three Chopt Road for nearly two hours, and Northbound Parham Road was closed to all traffic until about 4:30 pm. Traffic is back to normal.
