***Remember: Report all suspicious activity to police!*** Only you know what is ordinary activity in your neighborhood. Anything that looks out of the ordinary may be suspicious activity. Your report could be the tip we are looking for to prevent burglaries in your area.

## ***Crime Prevention Tips***

- Keep doors, windows, garages and sheds locked even when you are at home or working in the yard.
- Lighting deters thieves. Keep your home well lit. Pay attention to garages, back yards and sheds.
- Trim overgrown shrubs around your home that provide hiding places for burglars in action.
- If you are away from home on vacation, make your home appear lived in. Stop mail and newspaper deliveries and put your lights on timers.
- Call the Henrico County Division of Police and schedule a FREE security audit of your home. A trained officer or specialist will assess your home and tell you where you can make improvements to home security.
