CIT Goals

- ◆ **SAFETY** for the citizen, for the first responder, and for the community.
- ♦ **FOCUS** on providing an integrated and helpful response that avoids unnecessary incarceration or hospitalization and fosters a connection with community resources.
- ◆ **PROMOTION** of mental health de-stigmatization and the possibility of Mental Health Recovery.
- ♦ COLLABORATION among stakeholders that focuses on assistance with safety, compassion, patience and care.

CIT Partnerships

Henrico County's Division Police and Fire, Sheriff's Office, and Henrico Area Mental Health and Developmental Services, along with many community stakeholders, formed Henrico County's Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) program with the common goal of helping those in psychiatric crisis. Since 2006, this multidisciplinary team has worked with citizens in psychiatric crisis. The CIT program has developed innovative initiatives that consistently focus on linkage with community resources and offers hope that Recovery is possible. Henrico's CIT program adheres to the principles of Mental Health Recovery, which emphasize dignity, respect, trauma informed care, coupled with citizen and family choice.



CIT Initiatives

Henrico's CIT program sponsors many initiatives to help those in crisis. These initiatives include:

- Multidisciplinary community outreach teams,
- Crisis response teams,
- Connection with many community resources,
- Partnerships with local hospitals,
- Training initiatives for first responders.
