Recent Public Participation Meetings

- November 19, 2015, 80% CIM
 - Present plan and receive feedback
- April 21, 2016, 80% Follow-up CIM
 - Present County responses, plan changes, and next steps
- May 26, 2016, Public Hearing
 - Officially present plan for public comments, leading to formal project acceptance

Purpose of This Project

- Improve roadway capacity and safety by providing a consistent 4 lanes with curb and gutter, raised grass median and sidewalk on both sides of the road.
- Improve traffic distribution and safety through the corridor.
- Modify Traffic Signals at Cox Road and Gaskins Road to increase traffic flow efficiency.
- Provide enclosed storm drainage and improve three major culvert crossings.
- Extend pedestrian facility network

Project History

- Three Chopt Road is a Major Collector on the 2026 Major Thoroughfare Plan
- In January 2005 the Board of Supervisors (BOS) approved the design contract
- In June 2008 the BOS approved an amendment to extend the western boundary of the project
- In February 2013 the BOS approved amendments to comply with new federal regulations



Question...Why does it take so long?

Answer...Federal funds...very long process

General Project Information




- Project length: 2.2 miles
- Boundaries: Barrington Hills Drive to Winespring Road
- Posted at 45mph
- Fully developed corridor with only minor additional development potential along Three Chopt Road
- Presently an undivided 2 lane road with some areas of widening
- Proposed 4 lanes on the existing alignment with raised grass median, curb and gutter and enclosed drainage
- Sidewalks to be provided on both sides

Project Corridor Walk-Through




- Project begins near Pocahontas Middle School
- Provides four lanes with additional turn lanes
- Provides sidewalk on both sides of Three Chopt Road
- Left turn lane provided at Barrington Hill Drive

Project Corridor Walk-Through (cont.)




- Portion of Three Chopt Road will be closed during culvert construction...
 - Note: temporary detours will not be routed through neighborhoods
- Left turn lanes provided at Thamesford Way, Rockport Drive West & East and Church Run Parkway
- Right turn-lane onto Church Run Parkway

Pedestrian Crossing

County studied corridor and will install a protected pedestrian crosswalk near Thamesford Way



Project Corridor Walk-Through (cont.)



- Portion of Three Chopt Road will be closed during culvert construction
- Intersection improvements at Three Chopt/Cox/Church
- Access to all properties during construction
- Deep Run Church Cemetery will not be disturbed
- Concrete retaining wall (SE corner) will not be disturbed


Access to Deep Run Church and Area Businesses

Eliminate median between Rainbow Station and Newlands Avenue to provide left turn access (Blue Line)

Improve driveway to church (Red Line)




Project Corridor Walk-Through (cont.)



- Triple 10'X10' Box Culvert will be extended without road closure
- Left turn lanes provided at Newlands Avenue, Cedarfield Parkway and Barbara Lane
- Median openings between Cedarfield and Dogwood Terrace to allow U-turns

Project Corridor Walk-Through (cont.)



- Gaskins Road to include dual left turn lanes, two through-lanes, and a right turn lane in all directions,
- Traffic signal modifications will improve traffic flow
- Left turn lane provided at Winespring Road East
- End of project near Pemberton Road



Traffic Summary



- Traffic Study conducted in 2005, revised in 2014
 - Cox Road to Gaskins Road:
 - Existing (2013): 18,070 vehicles per day (vpd)
 - Design Year (2038): 20,470 vpd
 - Cox Road to Barrington Hills
 - Existing (2013): 9,256 vpd
 - Design Year (2038): 10,485 vpd
 - 0.5% Growth Rate consistent with other Short Pump studies
- Recent Truck Study showed < 1% trucks
- Major Collector 45 mph speed limit

Environmental Summary

Project meets all applicable Federal and State environmental requirements




- Categorical Exclusion Environmental Document
- No impact to archeological and architectural resources
- No Impact to Federal or State threatened or endangered species
- Stormwater water quality removal requirement met
- Wetland & Stream mitigation requirements met

Noise Study evaluating Potential Noise Walls

- Comprehensive noise study complies with all federal requirements
- Study identified eight (8) potential noise walls that are considered "reasonable" and "feasible"
- County collected citizen votes from "sensitive receptors". To date, only one (1) "yes" vote, all others are "no" to noise walls
- Design year 2038 increase in noise from traffic will be less than 2 db (less than 3 db is imperceptible)















Stream Crossings (cont.)



Floodplain Crossings:

- FEMA
- County

Design Criteria

- No increase in the 100-year floodplain
- No road overtopping by 100-year floodwater

Landscaping



- History
 - Landscaping is not part of this project given
 Federal funding
 - County committed to separate landscaping project after roadway project
- Landscaping Committee comprised of interested residents
 - County accepting names for Committee
 - Committee will be formed after Public Hearing

Project Financial Summary

Funding is 100% Reimbursable (80% Federal funds and 20% State funds)

Design	\$2.6 million
Right-of-Way	\$2.7 million
Utility Relocations	\$1.3 million
Construction	\$18.9 million
Anticipated Total Project Cost	\$25.5 million





- Public Hearing: May 26, 2016
- ROW Acquisition: Begin Summer 2016
- Utility Relocations: Begin Summer 2017
- Advertise for Construction: Summer 2018
- Project Completion: 2020

Acquisition Process Overview

- There are 71 affected parcels (ROW will be required from 47 parcels)
- Right-of-Way acquisition by Henrico County Real Property
- Acquisition process will follow Virginia State Uniform Relocation and Right of Way Acquisition Code



- Appraisals to begin Summer 2016
- Negotiations anticipated to begin Fall 2016
