





Vehicle crashes involving pedestrians and bicyclists are on the rise, leading to often serious or fatal injuries.

In 2022, Henrico County had



74 CRASHES involving pedestrians, with 8 FATALITIES



21 CRASHES involving bicyclists, with 1 FATALITY

Watch Out Ahead Henrico (WOAH!) is a publicawareness campaign to promote safer streets for everyone. Whether you're traveling by motor vehicle, bike or foot, remain alert and avoid distractions, including headphones and mobile phones.





Whenever possible, avoid a collision:

DRIVERS

- Stay alert and obey all traffic laws
- Reduce your speed around pedestrians and bicyclists, including at crosswalks and in areas where parked cars may obstruct views
- Leave at least 3 feet of space to the left of bicyclists when passing or overtaking them

WALKERS & RUNNERS

- Use sidewalks and crosswalks where they are available
- Face traffic if sidewalks are not available
- Assume drivers can't see you, especially at night
- Wear bright or reflective clothing and walk in well-lit areas away from parked cars and other obstacles

BICYCLISTS

- Follow the rules of the road as if you were a motorist*
- Wear a helmet and bright or reflective clothing
- Be predictable, use proper hand signals and avoid sudden movements
- Use front and rear lights, required at night*
- *Required under Virginia law
