1961 – St. Mary's Hospital (SMH) was incorporated
1962 – St. Mary's Hospital's Auxiliary was founded
1963 – Bishop John J. Russell broke ground on the construction of the hospital
1966 – Hospital opened on February 15
-Opened with 160 beds
-Mother Germanus served as the first Administrator from 1966 to 1967
-Intensive Care Unit (ICU) opened 8 months after the hospital opened
1969 – Coronary Care Unit (CCU) opened
1970 – Opening of new West wing of the hospital
1970 – Expansion of Radiology and Emergency Departments
1973 – St. Mary's School of Radiologic Sciences graduates first class

1988 – Cardiac Surgery Suite opened December 30
1988 – St. Mary's Child Care Center opened
1989 – Open Heart Surgery first performed
1989 – Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU) opened
1989 – Lithotripsy Suite Opens
1990 – MRI (Magnetic Resonance Imaging) Center opened
1991 – Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) opened
1991 – Community Education Center opened
1992 – Opening of new South Wing (floors G-4)
1992 – Emergency Department relocates and expands to 16 bays
1992 – Medical Office Building South opened
1992 – Four-story parking deck was completed
1992 – Medical Office Building West opened
1995 – Pediatric Emergency Department opens and expands ED from 16 to 32 bays
1996 – Labor & Delivery Unit delivered first quadruplets
1999 – Bon Secours Parish Nurse network began

SMH has continued to grow its Cardiovascular, Orthopedic, OB/GYN, Neurosciences, Pediatric, Surgery, Oncology, Imaging, and Emergency services over the years. Whether it has been a floor/unit renovation or relocation, St. Mary's has continued to see more patients in virtually its original shell. With the exception of the Medical Office Buildings on campus, the South Tower has been the only new patient care area that has been added to the campus
