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# Summary of Actions Taken by the Board on June 13, 2000

The invocation was given by Reverend Jack Peters, Gospel Jail Ministries.

The minutes of the May 23, 2000 Regular and Special Meetings and May 16, 2000 Special Meeting were approved.

#### MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Mr. Hazelett announced that Mrs. O'Bannon was attending Douglas Freeman High School's graduation ceremony and would join the Board meeting while it was in progress.

Mr. Hazelett welcomed two staff members from the Chesterfield County Administrator's Office - Marilyn Cole, Assistant County Administrator, and Lisa Elko, Clerk to the Board. They were in attendance to observe how Henrico County conducts its Board meetings.

The Henrico Water Reclamation Facility Operations Challenge Team, comprised of five employees from the Department of Public Utilities directed by Frank Miller, won First Place overall in Division II at the Virginia Water Environment Association's annual "Operations Challenge" competition in Roanoke on May 8, 2000. As state champions in Division II for their speed and accuracy in five events related to the operation of a water reclamation facility, the team earned the privilege to compete with approximately 40 other teams at the Water Environment Association's International "Operations Challenge" in Anaheim, California in October. Carol Isenhour, Chief of Laboratory Services at the County's Water Reclamation Facility, was instrumental in promoting and coordinating the activities of the team. Members of the team are as follows: Sandy Gusti (Team Coach), Office Supervisor; Jeff Parks (Team Captain), Utility Inventory Technician; Bob Gusti, Utility Plant Mechanic; Calvin Minor, Wastewater Plant Operator II; and David Ogburn, Maintenance Helper.

Mark Prentice, Manager of the Water Reclamation Facility, just completed a successful year as President of the Virginia Water Environment Association. Ms. Isenhour will serve as President-Elect for the coming year.

Mrs. O'Bannon was selected because of her extraordinary work and achievements in combating domestic violence, including serving as the catalyst in developing Henrico County's Domestic Violence Team, which pairs public and private organizations to help victims through the entire process and increase accountability of batterers. Mrs. O'Bannon is donating her \$2,500 prize and an additional \$2,500 of her own money to further domestic violence programs in Henrico County.
