Summary of Actions Taken by the Board on February 27, 2001

The invocation was given by Rabbi Richard Smith, Congregation Or Atid.

The minutes of the February 13, 2001 Regular and Special Meetings were approved.

MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Governor James S. Gilmore, III has appointed W. Forrest Matthews, Jr., the County's Director of Finance, to serve as chairman of the Virginia Retirement System Board of Trustees. The Virginia Retirement System has assets of over \$38 billion and administers retirement benefits for more than 300,000 public employees and 98,000 retirees. Mr. Matthews has previously completed the Pension Funds and Money Management program conducted by The Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania and most recently earned a Certificate of Achievement in Public Plan Policy Employee Pensions from the International Foundation of Employee Benefit Plans.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Carroll W. Robb, a Fairfield District resident and representative of Hechler Village Neighborhood Watch, expressed concern about a recent decrease in the County's assessed value of his home on Laburnum Avenue. He also inquired about the status of the Nine Mile Road Revitalization Study.

Lewis Reid, a Tuckahoe District resident, advocated reducing the real estate tax rate to offset recent increases in real estate assessments, holding the Schools' budget at its current level, and cutting public expenditures to offset any increases in employee salaries. He also asked the Board not to appeal the recent court decision regarding the Short Pump Town Center Community Development Authority and to consider imposing a moratorium on new residential development.

Marian J. Martin, a Fairfield District resident and representative of the Doron Lane Civic Association, referenced drainage problems in her neighborhood and asked the County to consider the installation of curb, gutter, and sidewalks in the 1700 and 1800 blocks of Doron Lane.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' COMMENTS

Mrs. O'Bannon commented that the County had initiated a new watershed management program, which would serve as a model for other jurisdictions. She noted that the County government was featured in the February 2001 issue of *American City & County* magazine for its creativity in financing technology upgrades. In emphasizing the importance of recognizing cultural diversity in the community, Mrs. O'Bannon reminded everyone that February 27 was Mardi Gras Day, also known as Fat Tuesday, and announced that a celebration was being held in western Henrico that evening.
