Mr. Kaechele led the Board, staff, and public in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Rev. Peter duPlessis, Director of Missions, Richmond Baptist Association, provided the invocation.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Donati, the Board approved the minutes of the June 10, 2008 Regular and Special Meetings.

MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Two original programs produced by Henrico County Television-Channel 17 (HCTV) have earned Emmy awards from the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences. The awards were presented at the 50th Emmy Awards ceremony June 14, 2008 in Washington, D.C. "No Way Back: Coping with Alzheimer's," produced by Roberta A. Fountain, won the Emmy in the News Special category, and "Turning Point: Inside Henrico's Drug Court," produced by Ryan C. Eubank, captured the prize for the Public/Community Affairs Program. Tamra R. McKinney, Director of Public Relations & Media Services, and David R. Miller, Television & Media Services Manager, also received Emmys as Executive Producers. The honors are the first Emmys received by HCTV, which began airing full-length programs in 2003. More than 820 entries in 93 categories were submitted by broadcasters throughout Virginia, Maryland, and Washington, D.C. for the annual competition.

Rhysa G. South, Assistant County Attorney, was elected Vice President of the Local Government Attorneys of Virginia, Inc. on April 25, 2008 at the organization's annual spring conference. LGA, as it is commonly known, is a separate statewide organization of over 650 public and private lawyers who practice local government law.

Karen M. Adams, Senior Assistant County Attorney, was appointed to serve as a member of the Third District Committee Section III of the Virginia State Bar on June 19, 2008. The Third District Committee Section III, composed of seven lawyers and three lay members, acts as a trial court when determining charges alleging attorney misconduct in the jurisdictions of Henrico, Richmond, Chesterfield, Dinwiddie, and Suffolk.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' COMMENTS

Mrs. O'Bannon reiterated concerns she stated at the previous Board meeting regarding the financial practice that was followed by the County in allocating funds for the Memorial Day parade, specifically that a check was sent by the County to an individual who made a request to an individual Board member before the rest of the Board knew of the event or its cost. Although she asked to see a budget for the parade after learning of the expenditure, that information was unavailable. When the County's Director of Finance subsequently requested an accounting of the funds provided by the County, he found that more funds had been allocated for the parade than were needed so \$7,900 was returned to the County. Mrs. O'Bannon characterized this financial practice as a poor way to do business with the people's money. She hopes in the future when a request is made to the County to fund a project that the Board will first ask to see the project budget and that all Board members will know about the transaction before the funds are disbursed.

Mr. Donati noted that Mr. Thornton had recent surgery and that it was nice to have him back.

Mr. Glover recognized Julian Williams from Boy Scout Troop 732, sponsored by St. Peter's Baptist Church, who is working on his last four badges for the rank of Eagle Scout.

Mr. Kaechele recognized the following Boy Scouts from Troop 768, sponsored by the Tuckahoe Ward of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, who were observing the meeting to fulfill merit badge requirements: Brandon Fiala, Tanner Fiala, and Ronnie Newton.

170-08 Resolution - Authorizing the Issuance and Sale of Not to Exceed \$45,000,000 Aggregate Principal Amount of Henrico County, Virginia, General Obligation School Bonds; Providing for the Sale of Such Bonds to the Virginia Public School Authority and the Form and the Interest Rates, Redemption or Prepayment Provisions and Other Details Thereof; Authorizing the Designation of a Bond Registrar and Paying Agent for Such Bonds; Authorizing the Execution and Delivery of a Use of Proceeds Certificate, a Certificate as to Arbitrage, and a Continuing Disclosure Agreement Relating to Each Series of Such Bonds; and Otherwise Providing with Respect to the Issuance of Such Bonds.

In response to questions from Mrs. O'Bannon, Director of Finance John Vithoulkas confirmed that the School Board was requesting this bond issuance because of changes in the costs of construction and said he anticipated that these bonds would cover the extra costs for the West Area High School, West Area Middle School, Northwest Elementary School No. 9, Mehfoud Elementary School addition, and Varina Elementary School addition. Mr. Vithoulkas also noted that the bond amounts designated for the West Area Middle School and West Area High School would include the amount required for LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) certification for those two projects. In response to a question from Mr. Kaechele, Mr. Vithoulkas explained that the voters had authorized these projects but that the amounts exceeded the costs that were expected

at the time of the bond referendum. By going to market through the VPSA (Virginia Public School Authority), the County should get similar interest rates to what it would realize on a normal G.O. (General Obligation bond) sale.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this resolution.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mrs. O'Bannon, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 170-08 – see attached Resolution.

GENERAL AGENDA

171-08 Resolution – Appropriation of Funds for Fiscal Year 2008-09.

In response to questions from Mrs. O'Bannon, Director of Management & Budget Gene Walter reiterated that the County's FY 2008-09 operating budget is \$1 billion and the capital budget is \$193.1 million. In response to a question from Mr. Kaechele, Mr. Hazelett confirmed that the Board used to appropriate funds quarterly but that annual appropriations are more efficient so the Board has been making annual appropriations for the past several years.

On motion of Mr. Donati, seconded by Mrs. O'Bannon, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 171-08 – see attached Resolution.

172-08 Resolution – Authorization to Apply for and Accept Grant Funding from the Department of Homeland Security.

In response to questions from Mrs. O'Bannon, Fire Chief Ed Smith explained that the equipment to be funded from this grant can be placed on a helmet or a robot but is not a thermal imaging camera although it can pick up body heat. He confirmed for Mr. Hazelett that no local match would be required.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Thornton, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 172-08 – see attached Resolution.

173-08 Resolution - Signatory Authority - Amendment to Contract for Architectural and Engineering Services - Dabbs House Renovation - Rawlings Wilson & Associates.

In response to questions from Mrs. O'Bannon, Director of General Services Paul Proto noted that this contract amendment would accommodate the design and structure of a high density filing system in support of the Division of Recreation and Parks programs in the Dabbs House facility. He reiterated for Mr. Donati that the renovations would be completed by the end of July 2008.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 173-08 – see attached Resolution.

174-08 Resolution - Signatory Authority - Amendment to Contract for Architectural and Engineering Services - Henrico Theatre - Guernsey Tingle Architects.

On motion of Mr. Donati, seconded by Mrs. O'Bannon, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 174-08 – see attached Resolution.

In response to questions from Mr. Kaechele, Mr. Proto advised that the contract approved by the Board in the previous resolution would close out the project.

175-08 Resolution - Signatory Authority - Amendment to Contract for Architectural and Engineering Services, Glen Allen Library - PSA Dewberry, Inc.

In response to questions from Mrs. O'Bannon, Mr. Proto clarified that this contract would provide for services to document and submit improvements for LEED certification for this project. He pointed out that LEED certification adds approximately two to three percent to the total cost of the construction contract.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 175-08 – see attached Resolution.

176-08 Resolution - Award of Construction Contract - Expansion of Juvenile Courts Building - Sun Bay Contracting, Inc.

In response to a question from Mr. Kaechele, Mr. Proto explained that the low bidder for this project had been permitted to withdraw its bid under a process outlined in the State Code.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Thornton, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 176-08 – see attached Resolution.

177-08 Resolution - Award of Contract for Architectural and Engineering Services - Fire Station #7 - RP Hughes Architects, Inc.

In response to questions from Board members and Mr. Hazelett, Mr. Proto clarified that the existing fire facility at 2701 East Laburnum addressed by this contract would be demolished and a new facility constructed in the same location. The new fire station was a bond referendum project.

On motion of Mr. Thornton, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 177-08 – see attached Resolution.

178-08 Resolution - Award of Contract for Architectural and Engineering Services -Renovation and Expansion of Fire Station #10 - ACA Architects, P.C.

In response to a question from Mr. Kaechele, Mr. Proto advised that this contract would address an addition to and renovation of the existing facility.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Thornton, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 178-08 – see attached Resolution.

179-08 Resolution - Award of Contract for Architectural and Engineering Services -Renovation and Expansion of Fire Station #12 - Bignell Watkins Hasser Architects, P.C.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Thornton, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 179-08 – see attached Resolution.

Mr. Proto, Assistant Director of General Services Bill Smith, and Mr. Hazelett responded to several questions from Board members pertaining to the previous three resolutions approved by the Board. There was some overlap among bidders for the various fire station project contracts being considered by the Board. All of the firms submitting bids specialized in fire stations and were new to Henrico. No firms from the Richmond region bid on these projects. All of these projects were placed in the capital budget and the source of funding was the General Fund. The Board will probably see a number of these projects over the next several years as the County increases EMS (Emergency Medical Services) and puts more people into the fire stations. The County was currently operating 12 ambulances 24 hours a day, seven days a week but would be adding a 13th ambulance within the next 30 days. Additional space at fire stations is required to accommodate the additional people and equipment resulting from the doubling up of fire and EMS operations at these stations.

180-08 Resolution - Consideration of Amendment to the Zoning Ordinance to Provide Standards for Planning Commission Review of Alternate Fence Heights in Front Yards.

Director of Planning Joe Emerson confirmed for Mr. Kaechele that this topic was reviewed at a previous work session of the Board and the Board's consensus was to move forward with this resolution.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Donati, with Mrs. O'Bannon voting "No," the Board approved Agenda Item No. 180-08 – see attached Resolution.

181-08 Introduction of Ordinance – To Amend and Reordain Section 9-2 of the Code of the County of Henrico Titled "Precincts and polling places" By Revising the Boundaries of the Sadler and Sullivans Precincts and Creating Two New Precincts and Polling Places.

On motion of Mr. Donati, seconded by Mrs. O'Bannon, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 181-08 – see attached Introduction of Ordinance.

182-08 Resolution - Signatory Authority - Award of Construction Contract - Drive Isolation Transformers - Davis & Green, Inc. In response to questions from Board members, Director of Public Utilities Art Petrini and Mr. Hazelett stated that if there is not sufficient capacity at a pumping station there is the potential for basin overflow; however, this situation has never occurred in the County. The contract addressed by this resolution would protect the sewer pumps from electrical surges, technically known as spikes in transient events. The pumps cost approximately \$1 million each.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 182-08 – see attached Resolution.

In response to a question from Mrs. O'Bannon, Mr. Hazelett confirmed that there are three pumps at the River Road Sewage Pumping Station.

183-08 Resolution – Acceptance of Roads.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 183-08 – see attached Resolution.

In response to questions from Mrs. O'Bannon, Director of Public Works Lee Priestas confirmed that although the County maintains its own roads it receives funding from the State for road maintenance based on Iane miles. Mr. Priestas and Mr. Hazelett explained the documentation that the State requires in order to provide maintenance funding for roads that have been accepted into the County system. On average, the County adds 10 to 15 miles of new roads per year. Mrs. O'Bannon noted that the State has been trying to impose development limits on counties and has contended that there is not sufficient State funding to pay for road maintenance costs.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:20 p.m.

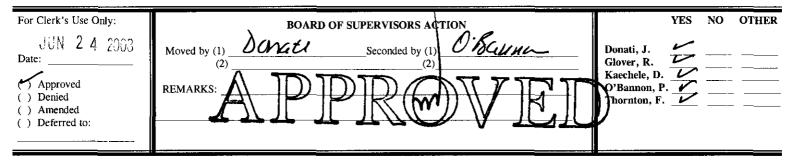

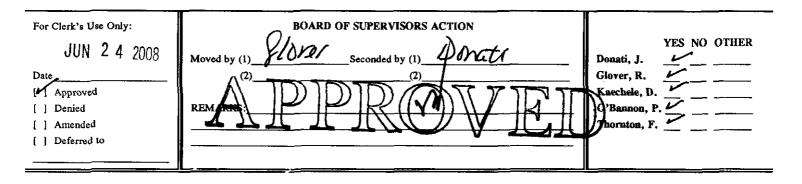

RESOLUTION - AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF NOT TO EXCEED \$45.000.000 AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF HENRICO COUNTY. VIRGINIA, GENERAL OBLIGATION SCHOOL BONDS: PROVIDING FOR THE SALE OF SUCH BONDS TO THE VIRGINIA PUBLIC SCHOOL AUTHORITY AND THE FORM AND THE INTEREST RATES, REDEMPTION OR PREPAYMENT DETAILS PROVISIONS AND OTHER THEREOF; AUTHORIZING THE **DESIGNATION OF A BOND REGISTRAR AND PAYING AGENT FOR SUCH BONDS:** AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF A USE OF PROCEEDS CERTIFICATE, A CERTIFICATE AS TO ARBITRAGE, AND A CONTINUING **DISCLOSURE AGREEMENT RELATING TO EACH SERIES OF SUCH BONDS; AND** OTHERWISE PROVIDING WITH RESPECT TO THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA:

SECTION 1. <u>Findings and Determinations</u>. The Board of Supervisors (the "Board of Supervisors") of Henrico County, Virginia (the "County"), hereby finds and determines as follows:

(a) On May 8, 2008, the County School Board of Henrico County (the "School Board") adopted a resolution (the "School Board Resolution") (i) requesting, pursuant to Section 15.2-2640 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended (the "Virginia Code"), the Board of Supervisors to authorize the issuance and sale of general obligation school bonds of the County in an aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$45,000,000 for the purpose of paying the costs of various capital school improvement projects of and for the County (such capital school improvement projects being referred to collectively as the "Project") and to submit an application to the Virginia Public School Authority (the "Authority") in connection with the issuance and sale of such bonds to the Authority, (ii) consenting, for purposes of Section 15.2-2638.B(iii) of the Virginia Code and Article VII, Section 10(b) of the Constitution of Virginia, 1971, to the issuance and sale of such bonds to the Authority, and (iii) requesting the Board of Supervisors to declare the official intent of the County under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 to reimburse itself from the proceeds of such bonds.

(b) On May 27, 2008, the Board of Supervisors adopted a resolution (the "Board of Supervisors Resolution") (i) authorizing the County Manager on behalf of the County to submit an application to the Authority to participate in a financing by the Authority and to issue and sell general obligation school bonds to the Authority in an aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$45,000,000 for the purpose of financing the Project, and (ii) declaring the official intent of the County under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 to reimburse itself from the proceeds of such bonds for expenditures made with respect to the Project prior to the issuance of such bonds.

(c) Pursuant to the provisions of Title 15.2, Chapter 26, of the Virginia Code (the same being referred to herein as the "Public Finance Act of 1991"), the County is authorized to contract debts for any project, borrow money for any project, and issue its bonds to pay all or any part of the costs of acquiring, constructing, reconstructing, improving, extending, enlarging, and equipping any project.

(d) In accordance with provisions of the School Board Resolution and the Board of Supervisors Resolution, the Board of Supervisors has determined that it is necessary and expedient for the County to contract a debt and to authorize the issuance and sale of general obligation school bonds of the County to be designated and known as "Henrico County, Virginia, General Obligation School Bonds" in an aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$45,000,000 (the "Bonds") to pay all or any part of the costs of acquiring, constructing, reconstructing, improving, extending, enlarging, and equipping the Project.

(e) In accordance with the provisions of Section 15.2-2606(A) of the Virginia Code, the Board of Supervisors has held a public hearing, duly noticed, before the adoption of this resolution authorizing the issuance of the Bonds.

SECTION 2. <u>Authorization of Issuance of Bonds.</u> (a) Pursuant to the provisions of the Public Finance Act of 1991 and upon the terms, conditions and provisions set forth in this resolution, the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the County to contract a debt and to issue the Bonds, in one or more series, for the purpose of paying the costs of the Project. Each series of the Bonds shall have such series designation or designations as shall be determined by the County Manager.

(b) Each series of the Bonds shall be issuable in fully-registered form; shall be dated the date of issuance and delivery of the Bonds of such series or such other date as shall be determined by the County Manager; shall bear interest from the date of delivery of the Bonds of such series or such other date as shall be determined by the County Manager, such interest to be payable on such first interest date as shall be determined by the County Manager and semiannually thereafter (each an "Interest Payment Date"), subject to the provisions of Section 4 of this resolution and at the rates established in accordance with Section 4 of this resolution; and shall mature on such date in each of the years (not exceeding thirty (30) years from the date of the Bonds of such series) (each a "Principal Payment Date") and in the amounts in each such year (the "Principal Installments") as shall be determined by the County Manager, without further action by the Board of Supervisors, subject to the provisions of Section 4 of this resolution.

SECTION 3. <u>Sale of Bonds</u>. There is hereby delegated to the County Manager the authority, without further action by the Board of Supervisors, to sell the Bonds of each series to the Authority at such price, determined by the Authority at the time of sale to be fair and accepted by the County Manager; *provided* that the true interest cost to the County with respect to any such series of the Bonds shall not exceed six percent (6.00%).

SECTION 4. <u>Interest Rates and Principal Installments</u>. There is hereby delegated to the County Manager the authority, without further action of the Board of Supervisors, to accept the interest rates on each series of the Bonds established by the Authority;

provided that each such interest rate shall be not more than ten one-hundredths of one percent (0.10%) over the annual rate to be paid by the Authority for the corresponding principal payment date of the bonds to be issued by the Authority (the "Authority's Bonds"), the proceeds of which will be used to purchase the Bonds of such series, and provided further that the true interest cost with respect to the Bonds of any such series shall not exceed six percent (6.00%). The Interest Payment Dates and the Principal Installments are subject to change at the request of the Authority. There is hereby delegated to the County Manager the authority, without further action by the Board of Supervisors, to accept changes in the Interest Payment Dates and the Principal Installments at the request of the Authority; provided that the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds of any series as described in Section 8 hereof shall conclusively evidence the acceptance of the Authority's terms, including the interest rates established by the Authority and the Interest Payment Dates and the Principal Installments requested by the Authority as having been so accepted as authorized by this resolution.

SECTION 5. <u>Form of the Bonds</u>. For as long as the Authority is the registered owner of the Bonds or a series of the Bonds, the Bonds of such series shall be in the form of a single, temporary typewritten bond substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A with such changes as shall be approved by the County Manager.

SECTION 6. <u>Payment</u>; <u>Paying Agent and Bond Registrar</u>. The following provisions shall apply to each series of the Bonds:

(a) For as long as the Authority is the registered owner of the Bonds or a series of the Bonds, all payments of principal of and interest on the Bonds of such series shall be made in immediately available funds to the Authority at or before 11:00 A.M. on the applicable Interest Payment Date, Principal Payment Date or date fixed for prepayment or redemption, or if such date is not a business day for Virginia banks or for the Commonwealth of Virginia, then at or before 11:00 A.M. on the business day next succeeding such Interest Payment Date, Principal Payment or redemption.

(b) All overdue payments of principal and, to the extent permitted by law, interest shall bear interest at the applicable interest rate or rates on the Bonds or any series of the Bonds.

(c) There is hereby delegated to the County Manager the authority to designate a Bond Registrar and Paying Agent for each series of the Bonds.

SECTION 7. <u>Redemption or Prepayment</u>. The Principal Installments of each series of the Bonds shall be subject to redemption or prepayment upon such terms and conditions as shall be determined by the Authority and accepted by the County Manager, without further action by the Board of Supervisors; *provided* that in no event shall the premium payable upon the redemption or prepayment of any Bond or any series of the Bonds be in excess of two percent (2%) of the principal amount of such Bond. The Board of Supervisors covenants, on behalf of the County, not to refund or refinance any series of the Bonds without first obtaining the written consent of the Authority or the registered owner of the Bonds of such series.

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SECTION 8. <u>Execution and Delivery of Bonds</u>. Each series of the Bonds shall be executed in the name of the County by the manual or facsimile signatures of the Chairman or Vice Chairman and the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, and the seal of the County shall be impressed, or a facsimile thereof printed, on the Bonds.

SECTION 9. <u>Pledge of Full Faith and Credit</u>. For the prompt payment of the principal of and premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds as the same shall become due, the full faith and credit of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged. In each year while any of the Bonds shall be outstanding, the Board of Supervisors is authorized and required to levy and collect annually, at the same time and in the same manner as other taxes of the County are assessed, levied and collected, a tax upon all taxable property within the County, over and above all other taxes, authorized or limited by law and without limitation as to rate or amount, sufficient to pay when due the principal of and premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds to the extent other funds of the County are not lawfully available and appropriated for such purpose.

SECTION 10. Use of Proceeds Certificate and Certificate as to Arbitrage. The Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, the County Manager, and such officer or officers of the County as either may designate are hereby authorized and directed to execute a Certificate as to Arbitrage and a Use of Proceeds Certificate each setting forth the expected use and investment of the proceeds of each series of the Bonds and containing such covenants as may be necessary in order to show compliance with the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (the "1986 Code") and applicable regulations promulgated thereunder relating to the exclusion from gross income of interest on each series of the Bonds and on each series of the Authority's Bonds. The Board of Supervisors covenants on behalf of the County that (i) the proceeds from the issuance and sale of each series of the Bonds will be invested and expended as set forth in such Certificate as to Arbitrage and such Use of Proceeds Certificate and that the County shall comply with the other covenants and representations contained therein, and (ii) the County shall comply with the provisions of the 1986 Code so that interest on each series of the Bonds and on each series of the Authority's Bonds.

SECTION 11. <u>State Non-Arbitrage Program</u>. The Board of Supervisors hereby determines that it is in the best interests of the County to authorize and direct the County's Director of Finance to participate in the State Non-Arbitrage Program in connection with each series of the Bonds. The Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, the County Manager and such officer or officers of the County as either may designate are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver such documents as are necessary to permit the County to establish an account with the State Non-Arbitrage Program in respect of the Bonds.

SECTION 12. <u>Continuing Disclosure Agreement</u>. The Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, the County Manager and such officer or officers of the County as either may designate are hereby authorized and directed to execute a Continuing Disclosure Agreement, substantially in the form presented to the Board of Supervisors at the meeting at which this resolution was adopted relating to each series of the Bonds, setting forth the reports and notices to be filed by the County and containing such covenants as may be necessary in order to show compliance with the provisions of the Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12 and directed to make all filings required thereby.

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SECTION 13. <u>Invalidity of Sections, Paragraphs, Clauses or Provisions</u>. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this resolution shall be held invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the remaining portions of this resolution.

SECTION 14. <u>Headings of Sections</u>. The headings of the sections of this resolution shall be solely for convenience of reference and shall not affect the meaning, construction, interpretation or effect of such sections or of this resolution.

SECTION 15. <u>Further Actions</u>. The members of the Board of Supervisors and all officers, employees and agents of the County are hereby authorized to take such action as they or any one of them may consider necessary or desirable in connection with the issuance and sale of each series of the Bonds and any such action previously taken is hereby ratified and confirmed.

SECTION 16. <u>Filing of Resolution</u>. The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized and directed to cause a certified copy of this resolution, certified by the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors to be a true and correct copy hereof, with the Circuit Court of the County.

SECTION 17. <u>Effective Date</u>. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

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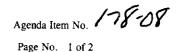

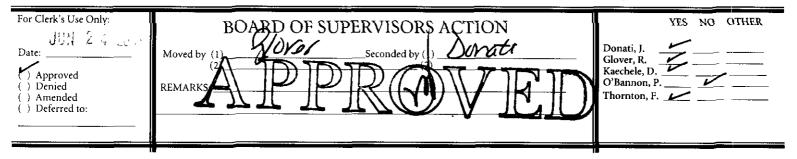

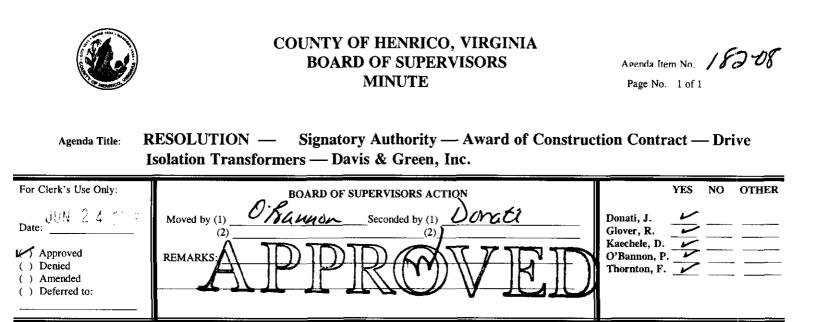
