Mr. Kaechele led the Board, staff, and public in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mrs. O'Bannon requested a change to page 5 of the draft July 8, 2008 Special Meeting Minutes under consideration by the Board, specifically that the word "play" be replaced by the word "be" in the fifth line of the second to last paragraph so that the sentence would begin "Mrs. O'Bannon commented that she had tried to be fair in this matter..." rather than "Mrs. O'Bannon commented that she had tried to play fair in this matter..."

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Donati, the Board approved the minutes of the July 8, 2008 Regular and Special Meetings with the change requested by Mrs. O'Bannon.

MANAGER'S COMMENTS

The Virginia Sustainability Building Network (VSBN), a statewide non-profit organization that promotes environmentally sound building practices, has recognized Henrico County with a 2008 Virginia Green Innovation Award for "Most Sustainable Community Program." The award is based on the County's continuing successful efforts to bring a higher level of energy and environmental awareness to Henrico residents and students as well as County employees through its Energy Program, which is now in its sixth year of development. Jerry L. Walker, Energy Manager, and William L. Smith, Deputy Director of General Services, accepted the award on behalf of the County at VSBN's 13th anniversary celebration and annual meeting held on June 25, 2008 at the University of Richmond's Jepson Alumni Center.

Paul N. Proto, Director of General Services, commented on Mr. Walker's enthusiasm and noted that Mr. Walker has done a tremendous job representing Henrico County on various activities statewide while bringing the County into the forefront for its sustainability program. PUBLIC HEARING ITEMS

211-08 Resolution – Amendment to the FY 2008-09 Annual Fiscal Plan: July, 2008.

In response to a question from Mr. Kaechele, Director of Management and Budget Gene Walter clarified that Schools had requested the transfer of approximately \$2.5 million in capital project funds originally appropriated for the renovation of administrative offices at seven elementary schools to the Fairfield Middle School renovation project. In response to a question from Mr. Thornton, Mr. Hazelett stated that it would be very difficult to extend LEED certification to school renovation projects. In response to a question from Mr. Hazelett, Mr. Walter acknowledged that there was an error on page 2 of the resolution being considered by the Board, i.e. the figures for TOTAL CAPITAL FUNDS and Total Amendments/Appropriations should have been listed as \$50,000,000 rather than \$45,000.000. Mr. Walter clarified for Mr. Hazelett that these figures had been listed correctly in the advertisement for this public hearing. Mr. Hazelett clarified for Mr. Kaechele that the paper before the Board could be corrected.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this resolution.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 211-08 – see attached Resolution.

In response to questions from Board members, Fire Chief Ed Smith clarified the location and purpose of the alternate Emergency Operations Center site and advised that approval of this grant would not be automatic.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 215-08 – see attached Resolution.

216-08 Resolution – Signatory Authority – Change Order to Contract for Implementation of Human Resources Management System.

In response to a question from Mr. Kaechele, Mr. Proto stated that County staff had been negotiating with the contractor in earnest for the past two months on this proposed modification to the contract and that the contractor had agreed to a dramatic reduction in its labor rates for the extended period of time as well as a couple of months of no charges to the County. In response to a question from Mr. Glover, Director of Human Resources George Cauble, Jr. and Mr. Hazelett spoke to the greater efficiencies that would be realized by implementing the Human Resources Management System and noted that it would prevent the County from overpaying or losing money. At Mr. Kaechele's request, Mr. Proto elaborated on the unforeseen circumstances and complexities that caused the need for this proposed contract change In response to questions from Mr. Glover, Mr. Proto and Director of order. Information Technology Steve Lewis confirmed that the most current version of Oracle software is being used by the contractor, that 11 full time equivalent (FTE) positions provided by the contractor have been on site since October 2006, and that staff was recommending an increase in the contract amount by \$1.3 million to cover a year's worth of time. Mr. Proto clarified for Mrs. O'Bannon that both the contractor and the County had contributed to the delays in completing the project by the original deadline of December 2007. In response to questions from Mr. Glover, Mr. Proto clarified that the project is well under way, that the new system should be operational by the end of the current calendar year, that staff is comfortable with the new timeframe, and that this type of program is very complex and difficult to implement. Mr. Proto reiterated for Mrs. O'Bannon that the County and the contractor both bore part of the burden and the cost of the contract delays. He clarified for Mr. Kaechele that phase 2 of the contract would include recruitment and job training. In response to a question from Mr. Glover, Mr. Hazelett said he suspected that the County would wind up in court and would be without a particular solution to this problem for a long time in the future should the Board not approve this resolution. Mr. Proto clarified for Mr. Kaechele that the new system would be turning out paychecks and keeping time as of the first payday in the upcoming calendar year but that use of the system for recruitment and professional development would begin on April 1, 2009. Mr. Glover remarked that he did not like this any better than Mr. Kaechele but was going to move the resolution because it did not sound like the alternative was too good.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mrs. O'Bannon, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 216-08 – see attached Resolution.



AN ORDINANCE to amend and reordain Section 9-2 of the Code of the County of Henrico titled "Precincts and polling places" by revising the boundaries of the Sadler and Sullivans Precincts and creating two new precincts and polling places.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA:

1. That Section 9-2 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained as follows:

Sec. 9-2. Precincts and polling places.

The following shall be the precinct boundaries and polling places for the magisterial districts in the county.

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- (3) Three Chopt Magisterial District.
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k. Sadler Precinct. Beginning at the intersection of Pouncey Tract Road and the boundary line of Goochland County and Henrico County; thence-southwardly-along the boundary line of Goochland-County-and Henrico County to its intersection with Interstate Route 64; thence southeastwardly along Interstate Route 64 to its intersection with Interstate Route 295; thence northeastwardly along Interstate Route 295 to its intersection-with Rooty Branch; thence northwardly-along Rooty Branch to intersection with Fords Country-Lane; thence southwestwardly along Fords Country Lane-to-its-intersection with Nuckols Road; thence northwestwardly along Nuckols Road to its intersection with Pouncey Tract Road; thence northwestwardly along Pouncey Tract Road to its intersection with the boundary line of Goochland County and Henrico County and the point of beginning. Beginning at the intersection of Nuckols Road and Pouncey Tract Road (State Route 271); thence southeastwardly along Pouncey Tract Road (State Route 271) to its intersection with Shady Grove Road; thence eastwardly along Shady Grove Road to its intersection with Twin Hickory Road; thence northeastwardly along Twin Hickory Road to its intersection with Nuckols Road; thence northwestwardly along Nuckols Road to its intersection with Pouncey Tract Road (State Route 271) and the point of beginning. The polling place for Sadler Precinct shall be Deep Run High School, 4801 Twin Hickory Road.

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Short Pump Precinct. Beginning at the intersection of m. 

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF HENRICO, VIRGINIA:

1. That Section 22-181 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained as follows:

Sec. 22-181. Distributing handbills, soliciting contributions or selling merchandise in highway.

It shall be unlawful for any person while standing in the highway to:

(1) Distribute handbills, leaflets, bulletins, literature, advertisements or similar material to the drivers of motor vehicles or passengers therein on secondary-highways located within the county.

(2) Solicit contributions of any nature from the drivers of motor vehicles or passengers therein on secondary highways located within the county.

(3) Sell or attempt to sell merchandise to the drivers of motor vehicles or passengers therein on secondary highways located within the county.


