PUBLIC HEARING ITEMS

105-10 Resolution – Real Estate Tax Levies, 2010.

John Vithoulkas, Director of Finance, noted that the proposed real tax rate would represent no change from the calendar year 2009 tax rate and that the average residential taxpayer in the County would actually see a real estate tax decrease this year because of the overall reduction in the assessed value of real estate in the County. Mr. Vithoulkas further noted that 2009 was the first year since 1942 that real estate valuations in the County had declined. The reductions in 1942 were not a result of the market but of annexation by the City of Richmond.

In response to a question from Mrs. O'Bannon, Mr. Vithoulkas explained how the County would be able to maintain the same tax rate without reducing services. Among the factors he cited were the collective wisdom of the longest serving Board of Supervisors in Virginia, the experience of the longest serving County Manager in Virginia, and the collective wisdom of County department heads as well as limiting expense growth during an economic expansion, budgeting revenues very conservatively over many years, refinancing outstanding debt at lower interest rates, and continuing the Henrico address initiative. Mrs. O'Bannon acknowledged the role of County department heads in cutting their budgets and expressed appreciation for their efforts. Mr. Kaechele commented that the Board was proud and pleased at the way the County manages its resources and for providing just as much with fewer resources. He thanked the County Manager, Finance Department, and Office of Management Budget for setting a good record.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this resolution.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Thornton, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item – see attached resolution.

He advised that these rates would allow the County to maintain its position of having the lowest tax burden among any full service local government in the Commonwealth of Virginia as measured annually in the independent survey referred to as the Chesapeake report. Mrs. O'Bannon commented that this

resolution shows that Henrico County has a heart.

WHEREAS, drug courts are the most effective tool for reducing substance abuse and crime in our criminal justice system; and

WHEREAS, for the past 21 years, drug courts have been restoring lives, reuniting families, and making communities across the nation safer; and

WHEREAS, results of more than 100 program evaluations and at least four metaanalytical studies have yielded definitive evidence that drug courts are demonstratively effective in significantly improving substance-abuse treatment outcomes and substantially reducing drug abuse and crime at less expense than any other criminal justice strategy; and

WHEREAS, the Henrico County Adult Drug Court has served our community since January 2003 as a collaborative effort of the 14th Judicial Circuit, the Commonwealth Attorney's Office, the Sheriff's Office, Henrico Area Mental Health and Developmental Services, the Division of Police, the Community Corrections Program, and the Probation and Parole District #32 Office of the Virginia Department of Corrections; and

WHEREAS, 76 participants in the Henrico County Adult Drug Court have successfully completed its intensive requirements and graduated from the program since 2004.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED, that the Board of Supervisors of Henrico County, Virginia hereby recognizes May 2010 as Drug Court Month; calls this year's theme, *All Rise: Putting Drug Court Within Reach of Every Person in Need*, to the attention of Henrico citizens; salutes the practitioners and participants who make drug courts work; and acknowledges the significant contribution that drug courts continue to make in reducing substance abuse and crime.

- **COMMENTS:** This resolution should be considered on April 27, 2010, to comply with Virginia Code Section 15.2-2503, "The governing body shall approve the budget, and fix a tax rate for the budget year no later than the date on which the fiscal year begins." For practical purposes in mailing tax bills and to fulfill the requirements of the Code of Virginia, Section 22.1-93, "Approval of Annual Budget for School Purposes", the rate should be fixed prior to May 1, 2010. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the funds included in the Operating and Capital Annual Fiscal Plans for any County department, office, or agency may be used as participating funds in any Federal or State aid program for like purpose upon appropriation by the Board of Supervisors; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board declines to receive any salary increase for 2011 and the salary schedule attached hereto for Boards and Commissions and Unscheduled Salaries effective at the beginning of the 2010-11 fiscal year, hereby is approved; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the approved Operating Annual Fiscal Plan for fiscal year 2010-11 includes a decrease in the personnel complement of 72.5 positions for general government and a decrease of 45.0 positions for schools; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in order to implement changes to the Personal Property Tax Relief Act of 1998 (the "PPTRA") made by legislation adopted by the Virginia General Assembly:

- 1. Any qualifying vehicle, as defined in the PPTRA, sitused within the County commencing January 1, 2010, shall receive personal property tax relief in the following manner:
 - a. Qualifying vehicles valued at \$1,000 or less shall receive 100% tax relief;
 - b. Qualifying vehicles valued at between \$1,001 to \$20,000 shall receive 65% tax relief;
 - ^c Qualifying vehicles valued at \$20,001 or more shall receive 65% tax relief on the first \$20,000 of value only; and
 - d. All other vehicles which do not meet the definition of "qualifying vehicles" will not receive any form of tax relief under the PPTRA.
- 2. The amount of tax relief shall be a specific dollar amount offset against the total personal property taxes that would otherwise be due on a qualifying vehicle but for the PPTRA. The specific dollar amount of relief shall be shown on the tax bill for each qualifying vehicle, together with a general description of the criteria upon which relief has been allocated.
- COMMENTS: This Board Paper should be considered on April 13, 2010, but should be deferred until Tuesday April 27, 2010, to comply with Virginia Code Section 15.2-2506, which states that "The hearing shall be held at least seven days prior to the approval of the budget...." The Director of Finance recommends approval of this Board Paper and the County Manager concurs.
