Mr. Wright advised that his company had worked out a mutually agreeable situation with an adjoining landowner to provide the landowner with temporary access to his property until such time as permanent access is allowed through the community church property located to the north of the landowner's property. He responded to a question from Mr. Kaechele regarding how this agreement will be documented.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Kelly Decker, a resident of Hunton Estates in the Brookland District, expressed concerns regarding a case involving her family that is currently pending in the Henrico Juvenile and Domestic Relations District Court. Mrs. O'Bannon noted that this is a legal case. Mr. Hazelett pointed out that the Board of Supervisors has neither power nor authority over the judicial system. He advised Ms. Decker that he will be happy to look into her concerns if he can do so without creating a dilemma for her or the courts and after discussing the matter with the County's attorneys and receiving additional information from her.

Mr. Foster responded to questions from Mr. Glover relating to the status of the next phase of this project. Mrs. O'Bannon commented on an op ed piece in the October 12, 2010

Wall Street Journal concerning how road decisions are made in China without consideration of personal property rights. She noted that Henrico citizens have a say as to where roads are located and that the County pays a lot of attention to the property rights of its citizens.

AN ORDINANCE adopting a recodification of the ordinances of the County of Henrico, Virginia, titled "The Code of the County of Henrico, Virginia of 2010."

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA:

- 1. The Code titled "The Code of the County of Henrico, Virginia of 2010" (hereinafter "the Code") published by Municipal Code Corporation and consisting of Chapters 1 through 24, each inclusive, is adopted.
- 2. Unless another penalty is expressly provided, every violation of any provision of the Code or any ordinance, rule or regulation adopted or issued in pursuance thereof, shall be punishable as a class 1 misdemeanor. Each act of violation and each day upon which any such violation shall occur shall constitute a separate offense. The penalty provided by this paragraph, unless another penalty is expressly provided, shall apply to the amendment of any Code section whether or not such penalty is reenacted in the amendatory ordinance. In addition to the penalty prescribed above, the County may pursue other remedies such as abatement of nuisances, injunctive relief, administrative adjudication and revocation of licenses or permits.
- Additions or amendments to the Code when passed in the form as to indicate the intention of the Board of Supervisors to make them a part of the Code shall be deemed to be incorporated in the Code, so that reference to the Code includes the additions and amendments.

- (b) The director of general services shall award all contracts on behalf of the school board except for:
 - (1) Contracts for Capital Project Fund work; and
 - (2) Contracts where the superintendent of schools, in his sole discretion, has determined that an award by the school board is appropriate and the request for proposal or invitation to bid states that the award of the proposed contract will be made by the school board.


