Mrs. O'Bannon called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m.

Mrs. O'Bannon led recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

George T. Drumwright, Jr., Deputy County Manager for Community Services, delivered the invocation.

MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Mr. Hazelett recognized the Henrico County Government Christmas Mother Program Chair, Lisa Orlosky of the Department of Information Technology, who presented a ceremonial check in the amount of \$14,500 to the 2010 Henrico Christmas Mother, Dorothy Tatum. Ms. Tatum announced that the Henrico Christmas Mother program has received 2,100 applications for assistance, 39 percent of which are from first time applicants. This year, the program will help 6,000 individuals and 1,963 families, including 3,538 children as well as 690 seniors and disabled adults. Ms. Tatum noted that County employees have worked together to donate a tremendous amount of money, toys, clothes, and food under the outstanding leadership of Mrs. Orlosky and Juliana Haalboom, Mrs. Orlosky's co-chair. She expressed appreciation to County employees for finding the strength to give to those in need during difficult times.

Mr. Hazelett recognized Tim Davey, a Managing Principal at Timmons Group and Chairman of the Urban Land Institute (ULI) Richmond, along with Gloria Freye, a Partner with McGuire Woods who serves on ULI Richmond's Executive Committee and as Co-Chair of its Leadership Committee. Ms. Freye presented ULI Richmond's 2010 Leadership in Public Policy Award to the County for its development of the Homeowner's Enhancement Guide. The award was announced at a ULI Richmond awards ceremony held on December 1, 2010. The Homeowner's Enhancement Guide, which is available for free download on the County's website and can be checked out or purchased at County libraries, is the County's newest neighborhood revitalization tool and was developed for homeowners and for prospective purchasers of older homes that may be in need of modernization and enhancement. Accepting the award on behalf of the County was Mark Strickler, Director of Community Revitalization. Joining him from the Department of Community Revitalization were John Young, Community Development Manager; Paul Johnson, Community Maintenance Manager; and Kelly Kinahan, Revitalization Planner.

Local Government Attorneys of Virginia (LGA) has recognized Henrico Assistant County Attorney Ben Thorp as a winner of the organization's 2010 Special Projects Award. Mr. Thorp earned this distinction for his work on LGA's Ad Hoc Committee on Noise Ordinances. The committee was formed to provide guidance to local government attorneys in revising and updating their localities' noise ordinances to comply with a Virginia Supreme County decision that the Virginia Beach ordinance was unconstitutional.

At its regular meeting on December 3, 2010, a quorum of the members of the Virginia Waste Management Board unanimously elected the County's Division Director of Solid Waste and Recycling, Steve Yob, to the position of Chairman. The Governor appointed Mr. Yob to serve a four-year term on this Board in May 2009, which provided the County with an important opportunity to be part of the process of adopting regulations and policies regarding waste disposal and recycling that have an impact on residents in Henrico and throughout the Commonwealth. Mr. Yob is a professional engineer and holds a Class II solid waste facility operator's license.

The County won the "Best New Public Program" award at the 27th annual Minority Input Committee Gold Star Awards celebration, which was hosted by the Virginia Minority Supplier

Development Council on December 9, 2010 at The Jefferson hotel in downtown Richmond. The award acknowledges the County's innovative supplier development activities and outreach to the minority supplier community. Mr. Hazelett shared a video highlighting the award and recognized Marvis Marshall, Supplier Relations Coordinator for the County's Department of General Services, who presented the award to the Board of Supervisors. Mrs. O'Bannon accepted the award on behalf of the Board. Mr. Donati noted his and Mr. Thornton's involvement in the startup of the County's minority business program, expressed appreciation to Mr. Hazelett and the Board for their support of the program, and acknowledged the efforts of Ms. Marshall with the assistance of County staff in helping the program take a great leap forward.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' COMMENTS

Mr. Thornton acknowledged the recent passing of Mary Brown Crawley, who owned Hawk's Barbecue and Crawley Enterprises. He commented that Mrs. Crawley was a great visionary, always saw the best in people, had the spirit of the entrepreneurial effort, and helped the homeless and those who could not defend themselves.

Mr. Kaechele and Mr. Glover wished everybody throughout Henrico County a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.

Mrs. O'Bannon pointed out that the original Henrico Christmas Mother, Mittie McGraw Nelson, is prominently included on the list of notable Henricoans that is linked to the Henrico County Public Library's website. Mrs. Nelson lived on New Market Road in the Varina District, worked as a teacher for Henrico County Public Schools, and encouraged her students to contribute to food baskets. The notable Henricoans database is one of the County's 400th anniversary commemoration projects. Citizens can nominate persons as notable Henricoans on the Public Library's website.

290-10 P-11-10 Varina SS Acquisitions, LLC: Request for a Provisional Use Permit under Section 24-58.2(a) of Chapter 24 of the County Code for extended hours of operation on Parcel 816-714-1137 containing approximately 1 acre located along the west line of S. Laburnum Avenue, approximately 300 feet north of its intersection with Williamsburg Road (U.S. Route 60).

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this case.

On motion of Mr. Donati, seconded by Mr. Thornton, the Board followed the recommendation of the Planning Commission and approved this item subject to following conditions:

- 1. This permit shall apply to the entirety of the property currently identified as GPIN 816-714-1137 and shall not allow extended hours of operation for any other business except a restaurant.
- 2. The sale or consumption of alcohol shall be prohibited.
- 3. The installation of pay phones on site shall be prohibited.
- 4. Any outside speakers and/or sound system shall comply with the following standards:
 - a) Sound systems shall be equipped with controls that permit full and complete volume control; and

- b) Sound emitted from the system shall not be audible beyond a distance of one hundred (100) feet measured from the source.
- 5. Prior to operation, the applicant shall consult with the Special Services Unit within the Division of Police to discuss crime prevention recommendations and conduct a security survey of the property and restaurant operations. The applicant shall implement mutually agreed upon security recommendations. Any outstanding issues shall be addressed by the applicant prior to a certificate of occupancy being issued.
- 6. The owner or operator shall install a security camera and video system designed by a security specialist. This security system shall include the following items:
 - a) Exterior surveillance cameras monitoring the entrance(s), parking area(s), and any other areas deemed necessary by the Division of Police. Such security cameras shall provide clear imagery of the establishment's patrons and their vehicles.
 - b) Recordings of all activities under surveillance shall be preserved for a period of four (4) months by the applicant or owner/operator. Authorized representatives of the Henrico County Division of Police shall have full and complete access to all recordings upon request.
- 7. The facility's windows shall not be tinted or obscured by posters, advertisements, or similar materials in order to permit surveillance opportunities both from within and from the outside of the building. This shall not prevent blinds from being used during daylight hours.
- 8. The owner or operator shall provide adequate lighting for the entrances, exits, and parking areas serving the use or location. Adequate lighting means lighting sufficient for clear visual and security camera surveillance.
- 9. The owner or operator shall not permit loitering on the premises during hours of operation.
- 10. Should evidence (i.e. police calls to the premises or complaints from other businesses) indicate that the hours of operation are having an adverse effect (i.e. increased public nuisance, loitering, excessive noise outside the building, criminal assault, etc.) on the surrounding area, the Board of Supervisors may hold a public hearing to consider revoking the Provisional Use Permit.

11. All external building walls shall use building materials that present a high quality, substantially uniform appearance on all sides of the structure as determined by the Director of Planning or Planning Commission at time of plan of development.

291-10 Resolution - Amendments to the FY 2010-11 Annual Fiscal Plan: December, 2010.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this resolution.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Kaechele, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item - see attached resolution.

292-10 Resolution - POD-22-09 - Approval of a Plan of Development for Fire Station #7 - Fairfield District.

Kevin Wilhite, Principal Planner for Development Review and Design, narrated a slide presentation highlighting the major aspects of the POD. He identified the location of this replacement station and the zoning districts for the 4.5 acre fire station site and surrounding properties. Mr. Wilhite described the existing facilities and building on the site as well as the proposed one-story, 11,302 square foot new building, which will be constructed in three phases and replace the existing building. He reviewed existing utilities on the site and proposals for site access points and parking spaces, a stormwater retention basin (BMP), fencing, a recycling facility, architectural design and capacity of the new building, a storage shed and dumpster screen, and LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental A neighborhood meeting on the proposed Design) silver certification. project was held by staff on November 10, 2010. The construction contract is anticipated to be awarded in April 2011 with completion scheduled in July 2012.

Following his presentation, Mr. Wilhite responded to a question from Mr. Kaechele regarding the proposed new building's interior design. Richard Morse, Capital Projects Manager for the Department of General Services, responded to questions from the Board and Mr. Hazelett concerning the building's design features, LEED silver certification requirements, the

construction date of the existing building, and the construction schedule for the proposed new building and site improvements.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this resolution.

On motion of Mr. Thornton, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item – see attached resolution.

293-10 Resolution - POD-24-10 (POD-17-85 Revised) - Approval of a Revised Plan of Development for Fire Station #13 - Tuckahoe District.

Leslie News, Principal Planner for Development Review and Design, narrated a slide presentation highlighting the major aspects of the POD, which includes renovation of an existing station and construction of a 3,458 square foot addition containing three new apparatus bays for a total overall floor area of 8,903 square feet. She identified the location and zoning districts for the 2.48 acre site and surrounding properties. Ms. News described existing facilities and points of access on the site and plans for expanding an existing public recycling facility. Construction of the project will be phased so that the existing station can remain in operation. Ms. News reviewed proposed site and facility improvements during the stages of construction, including the building addition, relocation of the site's principal entrance, and expanded parking; architectural design and capacity of the renovated and expanded building; and LEED silver certification. A neighborhood meeting on the proposed project was held by the Department of General Services on November 15, 2010.

Following her presentation, Ms. News responded to a question from Mrs. O'Bannon pertaining to LEED silver certification for the project.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this resolution.

On motion of Mr. Kaechele, seconded by Mr. Glover, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item - see attached resolution.

294-10 Ordinance - Vacation of Unimproved Alleys - Highland Park Annex - Fairfield District.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this ordinance.

295-10 Ordinance - Vacation of Building Line - Lot 13 in Block E of Glen Ridge - Tuckahoe District.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this ordinance.

On motion of Mr. Kaechele, seconded by Mr. Glover, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item - see attached ordinance.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Florence Bernstein, a resident of the Brookland District, expressed concern that real estate tax relief provided through the County's Real Estate Advantage Program (REAP) does not apply retroactively to newly qualified applicants. She also voiced concern that the program has not been adequately publicized and suggested that County residents be apprised of the program by letter. Mr. Hazelett responded at length to Ms. Bernstein by highlighting the many ways the County publicizes REAP and its willingness to provide information in the best way it possibly can while at the same time needing to be cognizant of costs. There was discussion between Ms. Bernstein and Mr. Hazelett relating to how the County informs citizens about REAP. Mr. Glover agreed with Ms. Bernstein that the County should research ways it can do more to notify citizens about REAP.

Jason Graham, a resident of the Tuckahoe District, expressed concern that the skateboarding facilities offered by the County's Division of Recreation and Parks are inadequate for modern day skateboarding and that the level of funding provided by the division for skateboarding is insufficient.

William Spencer, a resident of the Fairfield District, expressed support for jobs programs for young people, thanked the Board for establishing the Eastern Henrico Recreation Center, and complimented the Board and County Manager for their efforts.

T. V. Wilson of Vision Making International noted his involvement with the multi-cultural aspects of NASCAR and thanked the Board for the County's assistance to the minority supplier community.

Mr. Kaechele commented that the arrival of low-cost carriers at Richmond International Airport several years ago resulted in a 40 percent reduction in fares. Mr. Donati stated that air fares to New York City increased by 200 percent earlier when Jet Blue recently discontinued its service to that location.

WHEREAS, before the arrival of meaningful low-cost competition in 2005, an estimated one million travelers per year avoided flying to or from RIC, generally compelled by non-competitive airfares to bypass our region's primary airport and instead choose among six other airports in the Mid-Atlantic region; and

WHEREAS, even with the existence of multiple airlines providing service between the Richmond region and highly-demanded destinations like the New York metropolitan area, average fares from RIC were substantially higher than those of markets with a low-cost carrier presence; and

WHEREAS, the entry of two low cost carriers, AirTran (2005) and JetBlue (2006), had the immediate effect of significantly lowering airfares and improving iravel options at RIC; and

WHEREAS, competition created by AirTran and JetBlue at RIC resulted in airfares dropping from among the highest in the country to below U.S. average fares, saving travelers more than \$400 million in reduced ticket costs since the arrival of these two carriers; and

WHEREAS, the presence of low-cost carriers at RIC has had the desirable impact of making Central Virginia fares comparable to those available at other airports in the Mid-Atlantic region; and

WHEREAS, Southwest Airlines has announced its intention to acquire AirTran; and

WHEREAS, the merging of Southwest's and AirTran's respective networks should sustain necessary competition on local routes today served by AirTran and offer future expansion opportunities via a significantly enhanced low-cost network.
