Mr. Thornton called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m.

Mr. Thornton led recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

Dr. Michael J. Clingenpeel, Pastor of River Road Church, Baptist delivered the invocation.

MANAGER'S COMMENTS

For the 25^{th} consecutive year, the Henrico County Department of Finance's Office of Management and Budget has prepared the *Financial Trend Monitoring System* document prior to an examination of the operating budget for the subsequent fiscal year. This document provides an historical review over an 11-year period of financial and budgetary information that is combined with economic and demographic information. It is a valuable tool in monitoring the County's financial health.

The Board will receive the proposed Fiscal Year 2012 County budget on March 8, 2011, which will reflect cautious optimism in local revenue projections. The State budget continues to be the wild card in all of the County's budget discussions. Mr. Hazelett clarified for Mr. Kaechele that portions of the *Trend* document are used as a basis for revenue projections.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' COMMENTS

Mr. Donati noted that the Division of Fire has been chasing wildfires throughout the County, especially in the Varina District. He saluted the Division and Fire Chief Ed Smith for doing an outstanding job.

Mrs. O'Bannon offered information on the *Kite Festival & The Taste and Sounds of Henrico County* 400th anniversary commemoration event, which will be held on March 5, 2011 at Dorey Park. Representatives from the County's Korean sister city, Yangju, will be participating in this free, public event. The rain date is March 6, 2011.

Mr. Thornton commented on the African-American history program that was held on February 11 - 12, 2011 as part of the County's 400^{th} anniversary commemoration. He characterized this event as a first-class affair and credited the County for being inclusive in its commemoration activities.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Dr. Randall Merchant, a clinical research scientist at the Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU) Medical Center's Department of Neurosurgery and a resident of the Three Chopt District, provided an update on a new clinical trial that is now underway at VCU for patients with a traumatic brain injury. He responded to questions and comments from the Board and distributed copies of a brochure explaining the study and how persons in the community can opt out if they so choose.

Mr. Emerson and Mr. Hazelett responded to questions from the Board. Mr. Thornton remarked that some citizens have a concern regarding where group homes are placed in the community. Mr. Donati stated a need for the County to be notified when group homes are opened so that it can be prepared to provide necessary public services. Mr. Glover commented that he has constituents who are very much against group homes and who have a difficult time understanding that the County has no jurisdiction over them.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item – see attached resolution.

59-11 Resolution - Potential Zoning Ordinance Amendments Regarding Temporary Family Health Care Structures.

Mr. Emerson responded to questions and comments from the Board. Mr. Glover pointed out that conditions placed by the General Assembly in the State legislation permitting these structures will have the effect of significantly limiting where the structures can be located.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Kaechele, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item – see attached resolution.

60-11 Resolution – Signatory Authority – Structure Removal Agreement – Three Chopt District.

Mr. Thornton remarked that this is fortuitous situation in that it will preserve a school building in which African-American children from Henrico County and surrounding communities were taught. He stated that the County should be given a lot of credit for saving a part of its history. Mr. Kaechele agreed with Mr. Thornton's comments but pointed out that there are some real challenges ahead in relocating this building.



Citizens also are encouraged to provide oral and written comments on any plan and the redistricting process during the public hearings to be held by the Board, during the public information meetings to be held by the County Manager's staff, or through the web site that the County will maintain to facilitate citizen input.
