The Henrico County Board of Supervisors convened a regular meeting on Tuesday, April 12, 2011 at 6:00 p.m. in the Board Room, Administration Building, Henrico County Government Center, Parham and Hungary Spring Roads, Henrico County, Virginia.

Mr. Thornton called the meeting to order at 6:04 p.m.

Mr. Thornton led recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

Rev. Travis Branch, Chaplain of Gospel Jail Ministry, delivered the invocation.

PUBLIC HEARING

93-11 Resolution - Adoption of Operating and Capital Annual Fiscal Plans For Fiscal Year 2011- 12 and Allocation of Car Tax Relief for Tax Year 2011.

Mr. Hazelett noted that copies of the budget document and *Budget in Brief* packet were available for interested citizens. After providing background information on preparation of the budget, he narrated a slide presentation highlighting the proposed budget. Mr. Hazelett identified the primary prevailing goals throughout the budget creation process as no tax increases, no reduction in service levels, the avoidance of layoffs, and a salary increase for general

government and school employees. During his presentation, he also reviewed significant revenue challenges, economic trends, local general fund revenues, efficiency and cost saving measures, "Changing How Henrico Does Business" initiatives, proposed budget goals and funds, department highlights, decisions made to balance the budget, and the proposed capital budget. At the conclusion of his presentation, Mr. Hazelett reminded the Board that staff was requesting deferral of this item until April 26, 2011.

During the public hearing on this item, the following speakers thanked the Board for continuing to provide funding for their agencies or programs: Jason Young, Executive Director of the Community Futures Foundation that operates the Mill House; Ross Hotchkiss, a member of the Board of Directors for FeedMore, the umbrella organization for Meals on Wheels and the Central Virginia Foodbank; and Lou Mazzini, Director of Development for the Salvation Army of Central Virginia. Ligia Allenye, representing Parents for Community-Based Services, thanked the Board for continuing to fund supported employment services for Henrico special education students leaving school. Dale Alexander, joined by her granddaughter Rihanna Alexander and representing the Ralisha NiCole Alexander Scholarship Fund, thanked the Board for funding lighting and sidewalk improvements along Laburnum Avenue.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board deferred this item to the April 26, 2011 meeting.

Each member of the Board thanked and complimented Mr. Hazelett and the County staff for their work on the budget. Mr. Hazelett thanked the Board for the consideration given to staff.

Mrs. O'Bannon offered information on the County's *Earth Day* 400th anniversary commemoration hosted event, which will be held on April 16, 2011 at Three Lakes Park.

PUBLIC HEARINGS - REZONING CASES AND PROVISIONAL USE PERMIT

96-11 C-21C-10 Brookland Old Glen Allen Properties, LLC: Request to conditionally rezone from R-2A One-Family Residence District to B-1C Business District (Conditional), Parcel 770-767-3587 containing approximately 1.83 acres located along the north line of Mountain Road approximately 150' west of its intersection with John Cussons Drive.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this case.

Mr. Glover remarked that the applicant had been very helpful in addressing all of the issues identified by staff and the Planning Commission. He also commented on the historical significance of the site in the Mountain Road corridor and the great intentions of the applicant to ensure that the site remains an asset to the old Glen Allen area.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Donati, the Board did not follow the recommendation of the Planning Commission and approved this item with the following proffered conditions:

Use Restrictions.

- 1. The following B-1 Uses shall not be permitted on the Property:
 - a. Animal Hospitals or Clinics;
 - b. Auto Parts Sales:
 - c. Dog Beauty Parlor;
 - d. Laundromats:
 - e. Obedience School:
 - f. Commercial Parking Lots;
 - g. Tattoo Parlors;
 - h. Banks;
 - i. Child Care Facilities;
 - j. Establishments whose primary-business is check cashing and/or the making of payday loans as defined and regulated by Sections 6.1-432 et seq. and 6.1-444 et seq. of the Code of Virginia, in effect as of the date of the approvals of these proffers;
 - k. Grocery Stores or Convenience Stores;
 - 1. Video Store;
 - m. Private club, lodge, meeting hall and fraternal organization;
 - n. Farming and livestock activities;
 - o. Revival tents:
 - p. Funeral home and mortuary:
 - q. Sale of alcoholic beverages;
 - r. Shopping Center.
- 2. Parking Lots. The two parking lots located on either side of the buildings shall be paved with a flexible asphalt payement as shown on the Conceptual Plan (see case file) referred to in Proffer 6, no later than April 30, 2013.
- Access. Access to the Property shall be limited to two entrances with one entrance located on each side of the two story frame building. The entrances shall be paved with the same materials as the parking lots and shall be completed no later than April 30, 2013. The entrances shall be a minimum of 24 feet wide and a maximum of 30 feet wide.

4. Landscaping.

- a. The parking area located directly in front of the two story frame building shall be removed and converted into a landscaped area with vegetation and a pedestrian walkway consisting of mulch, stone, pervious pavers or other natural surface compatible with the character of the building and shall be completed no later than December 31, 2011.
- b. The area beneath the existing trees located approximately 40 feet northwest of the main building shall be cleared of all under brush

- and mulched and shall be completed no later than April 30, 2013.
- c. Landscaping meeting the requirements of a Transitional Buffer 10 shall be installed along the western Property line and shall be completed no later than April 30, 2013.
- 5. <u>Signage.</u> Freestanding signs shall be limited to one; may not exceed six feet in height measured from grade and shall be mounted on a masonry monument type base. Signs shall not be lighted. Exterior mobile signs shall not be permitted on the Property.
- 6. <u>Conceptual Plan.</u> Improvements made to the Property shall be substantially in accordance with the Conceptual Plan, dated April 11, 2011, prepared by Carter Design, marked <u>EXHIBIT A</u> (see case file) and filed with this case.
- 7. Hours of Operation. No business on the Property shall be open to the public after 11:00 p.m. nor before 6:00 a.m.

8. Trash Collection.

- a. The existing trash receptacle shall be relocated as shown on the Conceptual Plan.
- b. Any central trash receptacles, not including convenience containers, shall be screened from public view at ground level from the public right of way and adjacent properties.
- c. Trash pickup from the Property shall occur a minimum of once a week and shall be limited to the hours between 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. Monday through Friday and 9:00 a.m. through 6:00 p.m. Saturday. There shall be no trash pickup on Sunday.
- 9. Parking Lot Lighting. Any parking lot lighting added after December 31, 2010 shall not exceed twenty (20) feet in height above grade level; shall be produced from a concealed source, directed downward and reduced to a security level at the close of business.
- 10. <u>Buildings.</u> No new development beyond the existing two buildings shall be permitted on the Property, unless approved by the County through an amendment to this zoning case C-21C-10. This proffer shall not preclude the replacement of an existing building in the event of a fire or other catastrophic event.
- 11. <u>Surety.</u> A letter of credit, or other form of surety, acceptable to the County, in the amount of the cost for the proffered paving and landscaping shall be delivered to the County no later than thirty (30) days following the approval of Case C-21C-10.

12. <u>Severance</u>. The unenforceability, elimination, revision or amendment of any proffer set forth herein, in whole or in part, shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the other proffers or the unaffected part of any such proffer.

97-11 C-22-10 Varina Felts & Kilpatrick Construction Co. Inc.: Request to conditionally rezone from R-3 One-Family Residence District and B-1 Business District, to R-3 One-Family Residence District and B-1C Business District (Conditional), Parcels 802-702-8535, -8929, -9916, and 803-702-2315 containing 3.08 acres (.58 acres R-3 and 2.50 acres B-1C), located at the northeast intersection of New Market Road (State Route 5) and Midview Road.

Jean Moore, Assistant Director of Planning for Comprehensive Planning and Administration, responded to a question from Mr. Donati.

Kirk Jones, a resident of Glenspring Road in the Fairfield District whose family owns property near the site, stated that he was speaking neither for nor against the case. Ms. Moore responded to his questions regarding the types of retail uses that could operate on the site and the hours of operation that would be allowed under the requested zoning.

Cameron Palmore, Vice President of Balzer and Associates, Inc. and a representative of the applicant, thanked the Board and Planning Commission for moving this case forward.

On motion of Mr. Donati, seconded by Mr. Glover, the Board followed the recommendation of the Planning Commission and approved this item subject to the following proffers conditions:

1. **Buffers, Landscaping and Fencing.**

- a. The applicant shall provide a 20' buffer along North James Estates Drive planted to the Transitional Buffer 25 standard as per Section 24-106.2(e) (3)(b).
- b. The applicant shall provide a 10' Transitional Buffer as per Section 24-106.2(e)(3)(b) beginning at North James Estates Drive and ending at Midview Road at the rear building setback as shown on the Conceptual Plan (see case file). The applicant shall provide a 6' vinyl fence, or other material as may be approved during plan of development review, beginning at North

- James Estates Drive and running the entire NW boundary of the property. The referenced fence shall not allow for a reduction in the width of the Transitional Buffer.
- c. A 40' landscape planting strip planted to the Transitional Buffer 35 standard with a berm similar in size to the berm in front of 1320 New Market Road shall be provided along New Market Road.

Buffers shall be provided except to the extent necessary for easements, sidewalks, access driveways (which access driveways shall run generally perpendicular to the buffer), and other purposes requested and specifically permitted, or if required, at the time of

Plan of Development. Buffers adjacent to public roads shall be measured from the road's ultimate right-of-way.

- 2. <u>Signage.</u> Any detached signs shall be monolithic style signs, similar to the sign at 2458 New Market Road, the base of which shall be landscaped, and shall be limited in height to eight feet. Changeable message signs, portable or mobile signs, and inflatable or other attention getting devices shall be prohibited.
- Exterior Lighting. Parking lot lighting standards shall not exceed twenty (20) feet in height above grade level. All parking lot lighting fixtures shall be of low intensity and have concealed light sources positioned in such a manner as to minimize the impact of such lighting on any adjacent property. Exterior lighting shall be reduced to security levels after hours of operation.
- 4. <u>Building Design and Materials.</u> Any building constructed on the property shall be as follows:
 - a. Shall not exceed a height of thirty-five (35) feet.
 - b. Shall be colonial-style architecture in theme and color and shall be generally consistent with the building located at 1320 New Market Road as determined by the planning commission at the time of POD approval.
 - c. The exterior walls shall be brick, except to the extent other materials are used for windows, doors, trim, signage, architectural decorations or design elements.
- 5. <u>HVAC Screening.</u> Any heating, ventilating and air conditioning equipment shall be screened from public view at ground level at the perimeter of the Property.

- 6. Right-of-Way Dedication. The owner, upon written request of the Director of Public Works, shall dedicate without cost to the County, the right-of-way over the property for the proposed widening of New Market Road in the location as substantially shown on the Conceptual Plan (see case file). Should the dedicated property not be used for its intended purpose within thirty years of the date of dedication, title to the dedicated property shall revert to the owner or its successors in interest.
- 7. <u>Building Setback.</u> There shall be a 100' building setback from the existing right-of-way.
- 8. <u>Security Alarms.</u> No external alarm bells or external warning devices that are audible beyond the boundary lines of the Property shall be permitted on the Property.
- 9. <u>Conceptual Plan.</u> The Property shall be developed in substantial conformance with the attached Conceptual Plan (see case file) which is conceptual in nature and may vary in detail as requested and approved at Plan of Development review or required by any governmental entity having jurisdiction.
- 10. Trash, Pick-Up, Maintenance. All dumpsters, trash and recycling receptacles, (not including convenience cans), shall be screened from view at the boundary line of the property in a manner approved at the time of Plan of Development Review. Trash pick-up, the emptying of dumpsters and lot maintenance shall be limited to the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday and not allowed on Sunday.
- 11. <u>Existing Houses.</u> The Division of Recreation and Parks shall be allowed to photo document the interior and exterior of the houses before they are removed.
- 12. **Prohibited Uses.** The following uses shall be prohibited:
 - a. billiard, bagatelle, video game or a bingo parlor;
 - b. flea markets or antique auctions;
 - c. billboards:
 - d. recycling facilities;
 - e. funeral homes, mortuaries, crematories and/or undertaking establishments;
 - f. establishments whose primary business is check cashing and or the making of payday loans as defined and regulated by Sections 6.2-2100 et seq. and 6.2-1800 et seq. of the Code of Virginia (the foregoing shall not preclude banks, savings and loans or

similar financial institutions that are not regulated by the foregoing Virginia Code sections);

- g. gun shop sales and repair.
- 13. Outdoor Speakers. Outdoor speakers shall be prohibited.
- 14. <u>Severance.</u> The unenforceability, elimination, revision or amendment or any proffer set forth herein, in whole or in part, shall not affect the validity or enforceability or any of the other proffers or the unaffected part of any such proffer.

269-10 C-19-10 Fairfield

KCA/Laburnum, LLC: Request to rezone from RTHC Residential Townhouse District (Conditional) to A-1 Agricultural District, Parcel 808-731-7728 containing approximately 10.33 acres, located at the southeast intersection of N. Laburnum Avenue and Watts Lane. The A-1 District allows a minimum lot size of 43,560 square feet and a maximum gross density of 1.0 unit per acre.

Ms. Moore advised that the applicant was requesting this case be remanded to the Planning Commission in light of proposed proffer amendments and that staff concurred with this request.

No one from the public objected to this request.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Kaechele, the Board remanded this case to the Planning Commission for further review and for a public hearing by that body on May 12, 2011.

98-11 P-1-11 Three Chopt Regal Cinemas, Inc.: Request for a Provisional Use Permit under Section 24-58.2(a), 24-120 and 24-122.1 of Chapter 24 of the County Code in order to allow extended hours of operation for an existing movie theater on part of Parcel 739-762-4639, located on the north line of W. Broad Street (U.S. Route 250) approximately 600' west of its intersection with Pouncey Tract

Road (State Route 271).

Ms. Moore responded to questions from Mr. Kaechele.

No one from the Board spoke in opposition to this case.

On motion of Mr. Kaechele, seconded by Mrs. O'Bannon, the Board followed the recommendation of the Planning Commission and approved this item subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The hours of operation for Regal Short Pump Cinema 14 shall be extended until 3:00 a.m. to allow the showing of only first run movies with the following limitations:
 - a. Post midnight movies shall not be held more than eighteen (18) days within a calendar year.
 - b. Show times shall commence no later than 12:45 a.m.
 - c. No more than four (4) movie theaters showing movies extending into the hours of up to 3:00 a.m. shall be in operation at any one time.
- 2. The owner/operator of the Regal Short Pump Cinema 14 shall ensure that patrons leave the parking areas within 30 minutes after the last movie ends.
- 3. Use of the cinema's lobby after midnight shall be limited to movie patrons viewing midnight or later movies that same night only.
- 4. The owner or operator shall not permit loitering or public nuisances on the premises.
- 5. A sign that is clearly visible shall be placed on the box office window or outside windows indicating Henrico County Ordinance regarding curfew time. No tickets shall be sold to minors 16 years of age or younger after 11:00 p.m. unless accompanied by an adult.
- 6. The Crime Prevention Unit of the Division of Police shall conduct a Security Survey to identify potential security risks. This survey shall be completed and any outstanding issues addressed by the applicant, prior to the extension of hours being implemented.
- 7. The owner and/or operator of the establishment shall install and maintain a security camera and video system designed by a security specialist. The security system shall include the following items:

- a. Exterior surveillance cameras monitoring the entrance(s), parking area(s), and any other areas deemed necessary by the Division of Police. Such security cameras shall provide clear imagery of the establishment's patrons and their vehicles.
- b. Tapes or digital files showing recorded activities in the areas under surveillance shall be preserved for a period of four (4) months. Authorized representatives of the Henrico County Police Department shall have access to such tapes upon request.
- 8. At least one (1) uniformed security officer shall be on duty during the extended hours of operation. The security officer shall periodically monitor the exterior of the premises as well as the interior for possible criminal activity. Security officers shall either be off duty police officers or licensed security guards employed by a licensed security service company.
- 9. The facility's windows shall not be tinted or obscured by posters, advertisements, or similar materials in order to permit surveillance opportunities both from within and from the outside of the building.
- The owner or operator shall provide adequate lighting for the entrances, exits, and parking areas serving Regal Short Pump Stadium 14. "Adequate lighting" means lighting sufficient for clear visual and security camera surveillance.
- 11. In the event that evidence (i.e. police calls to the premises or complaints from other businesses) indicates extended hours of operation are having an adverse effect (i.e. increased public nuisance, loitering, excessive noise outside the building, criminal assault, etc.) on the surrounding area, the Board of Supervisors may hold a public hearing to consider revoking the provisional use permit.

PUBLIC HEARINGS - OTHER ITEMS

99-11 Ordinance - To Amend and Reordain Section 9-1 of the Code of the County of Henrico Titled "Magisterial districts" to Redistrict the County Based on the 2010 Census.

Mr. Hazelett suggested that at the end of this public hearing the Board consider deferring this ordinance to the April 26, 2010 meeting when the final public hearing on the ordinance will be held.

Joe Emerson, Director of Planning, reviewed the three citizen comments received to date by staff on the draft redistricting plan presented to the Board at its March 22, 2011 meeting. He narrated a slide presentation on the 2011 Magisterial District Redistricting Proposed Plan. During his presentation, he reviewed the draft plan and how it affects each magisterial district and meets the criteria the Board specified, changes to several voter precincts that result from the draft plan, and next steps in the proposed schedule for redistricting process. He responded to questions from Mr. Kaechele.

Kirk Jones, a resident of 4700 Glenspring Road in the Fairfield District, commended County staff on the proposed plan but requested a change that would move a small portion of Hechler Village currently located in the Varina District to the Fairfield District. Mr. Hazelett responded to a follow-up question from Mr. Kaechele. Mr. Rapisarda clarified for the record that School Board election districts but not school attendance zones parallel Board of Supervisors election districts. Mr. Hazelett responded to a question from Mr. Thornton.

W. C. Jones, a resident of 5103 Colwyck Drive in the Fairfield District, questioned why staff did not propose the ideal population breakdown for each of the magisterial districts and why a negative population deviation was proposed for the Fairfield and Varina Districts. Mr. Emerson responded to his questions. Mr. Jones also questioned the geographic configurations of the Fairfield and Varina Districts. He advocated redrawing the district lines to create a second majority minority district and contended that the Board deliberately gerrymandered district lines in 1991 and 2001 and is doing so again in 2010 with the proposed plan. Mr. Jones elaborated at length on his recommendation and concerns. Mr. Rapisarda offered facts clarifying the history of redistricting in the County during the previous two decades. Mr. Jones briefly addressed the Board again from the podium and then stated from the audience that he was representing Hechler Village Neighborhood Watch and that this organization favors Nine Mile Road as the dividing line between the Fairfield and Varina Districts.

On motion of Mr. Kaechele, seconded by Mrs. O'Bannon, and by unanimous vote, the Board deferred this item to the April 26, 2011 meeting.

Ordinance - To Amend and Reordain Section 9-2 of the Code of the County of Henrico Titled "Precincts and polling places" to Redistrict the County Based on the 2010 Census.

Mark Coakley, General Registrar, and Mr. Rapisarda responded to questions from Mrs. O'Bannon and Mr. Kaechele.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this ordinance.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board deferred this item to the April 26, 2011 meeting.

101-11 Resolution - Signatory Authority - First Amendment to Lease Agreement - Crown Castle GT Company LLC, a Delaware Limited Liability Company - Brookland District.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the funds included in the Operating and Capital Annual Fiscal Plans for any County department, office, or agency may be used as participating funds in any Federal or State aid program for like purpose upon appropriation by the Board of Supervisors; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the salary schedule attached hereto for Boards and Commissions and Unclassified Salaries effective at the beginning of the 2011-2012 fiscal year, hereby is approved and, in accordance with Section 15.2-1414.2 of the Code of Virginia, the maximum annual compensation of members of this Board is set for calendar years 2012 through 2015 as set out in note (2) of the Schedule of Compensation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the approved Operating Annual Fiscal Plan for fiscal year 2011-12 includes a decrease in the personnel complement of 44.55 positions for schools; and funding for a 2.372 percent merit increase for all eligible general government and school employees; the increase to be effective on June 18, 2011; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in order to implement changes to the Personal Property Tax Relief Act of 1998 (the "PPTRA") made by legislation adopted by the Virginia General Assembly:

- 1. Any qualifying vehicle, as defined in the PPTRA, sitused within the County commencing January 1, 2011, shall receive personal property tax relief in the following manner:
 - 2. Qualifying vehicles valued at \$1,000 or less shall receive 100% tax relief;
 - b. Qualifying vehicles valued at between \$1,001 to \$20,000 shall receive 68% tax relief;
 - c. Qualifying vehicles valued at \$20,001 or more shall receive 68% tax relief on the first \$20,000 of value only; and
 - d. All other vehicles which do not meet the definition of "qualifying vehicles" will not receive any form of tax relief under the PPTRA.
- 2. The amount of tax relief shall be a specific dollar amount offset against the total personal property taxes that would otherwise be due on a qualifying vehicle but for the PPTRA. The specific dollar amount of relief shall be shown on the tax bill for each qualifying vehicle, together with a general description of the criteria upon which relief has been allocated.

COMMENTS:

This Board Paper should be considered on April 12, 2011, but should be deferred until Tuesday April 26, 2011, to comply with Virginia Code Section 15.2-2506, which states that "The hearing shall be held at least seven days prior to the approval of the budget...." The Director of Finance recommends approval of this Board Paper and the County Manager concurs.

AN ORDINANCE to amend and reordain Section 9-1 of the Code of the County of Henrico titled "Magisterial districts" to redistrict the County based on the 2010 Census.

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA:

1. That Section 9-1 of the Code of the County of Henrico is hereby amended and reordained as follows:

## Sec. 9-1. Magisterial districts.

The county is divided into five magisterial districts, described as follows:

**(1)** Brookland Magisterial District. (2) Fairfield Magisterial District. 



The Clerk of the Board shall send a certified copy of this ordinance, including a description of the boundaries and a map showing the boundaries of the five magisterial districts, to the Henrico County Electoral Board, Secretary of the Commonwealth, State Board of Elections, and Division of Legislative Services.

AN ORDINANCE to amend and reordain Section 9-2 of the Code of the County of Henrico titled "Precincts and polling places" to redistrict the County based on the 2010 Census.

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA:

1. That Section 9-2 of the Code of the County of Henrico is hereby amended and reordained as follows:

#### Sec. 9-2. Precincts and polling places.

The following shall be the precinct boundaries and polling places for the magisterial districts in the county.

The polling place for Dumbarton Frecinct shall be Dumbarton Elementury School, 9000 Hungary Spring Road.
  - c. Glen Allen Precinct. Beginning at the intersection of the R.F.& P. Railroad and the boundary line between Hanover County and Henrico County; thence southwestwardly along the boundary line between Hanover County and Henrico County to its intersection with Staples Mill Road (U.S. Route 33); thence southeastwardly along Staples Mill Road (U.S. Route 33) to its intersection with the Virginia Power easement; thence northeastwardly along the Virginia Power easement to its intersection with Mountain Road; thence southeastwardly along Mountain Road to its intersection with the R.F.& P. Railroad; thence northwardly along the R.F.& P. Railroad to its intersection with the boundary line between Hanoven County and Henrico County and the point of beginning. The polling place for Glen Allen Precinct shall be Glen Allen Elementary School, 11101 Mill Road.

- d. Glenside Precinct. Railroad; thence southwardly along the R.F.& P. Beginning at the intersection of Hungary Road and Springfield Road (State Route 157); thence eastwardly along Hungary Road to its intersection with the Virginia Power easement; thence southwardly along the Virginia Power easement to its intersection with West Broad Street (U.S. Route 250); thence northwestwardly along West Broad Street (U.S. Route 250) to its intersection with Springfield Road (State Route 157); thence northwardly along Springfield Road (State Route 157) to its intersection with Hungary Road and the point of beginning. The polling place for Longan Precinct shall be Longan Elementary School, 9200 Mapleview Avenue.
- m. Maude Trevvett Precinct. 




