## PRESENTATIONS

Mr. Thornton presented a proclamation recognizing May 2011 as Drug Court Month. Accepting the proclamation were the Honorable Gary A. Hicks, Judge of the Henrico Circuit Court and Drug Court, and Justin Wainwright, a Drug Court participant. Joining them were the Honorable Michael L. Wade, Sheriff; Michael D. O'Connor, Director of Henrico Area Mental Health and Developmental Services; and Patricia A. Shaw, Drug Court Administrator.

Mr. Glover presented a proclamation recognizing May 2011 as Older Americans Month. Accepting the proclamation was Marian M. Dolliver, Caregiver Support Manager for Senior Connections, The Capital Area Agency on Aging. Joining her were Gloria B. Johnson, Henrico County representative on the Senior Connections Board of Directors, and Carol A. Young, Vice Chair of the Senior Connections Advisory Council and Social Worker II with the Henrico County Department of Social Services Adult Services Program.

## PUBLIC HEARING ITEMS

107-11 Resolution - Real Estate Tax Levies, 2011.
There were no comments from the public.
On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item - see attached resolution.

108-11 Resolution - Personal Property, Aircraft, Manufactured Homes, Qualifying Vehicles Owned or Leased by Members of a Volunteer Rescue Squad or Volunteer Fire Department, Disabled Veterans' Vehicles, Motor Vehicles Specially Equipped to Provide Transportation for Physically Handicapped Individuals, Machinery and Tools, and Machinery and Tools for Semiconductor Manufacturers Tax Levies, 2011.

There were no comments from the public.

On motion of Mr. Donati, seconded by Mr. Glover, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item - see attached resolution.

99-11 Ordinance - To Amend and Reordain Section 9-1 of the Code of the County of Henrico Titled "Magisterial districts" to Redistrict the County Based on the 2010 Census.

Joe Emerson, Director of Planning, narrated a slide presentation on the Henrico County 2011 Magisterial District Redistricting Proposed Plan. During his presentation, Mr. Emerson revisited the County's redistricting process to date and reviewed the draft plan originally presented to the Board at its March 22, 2011 meeting and previously discussed at a public hearing held by the Board at its April 12, 2011 meeting. He also offered an alternative plan developed by staff in response to citizen comments made at the April 12, 2011 public hearing; explained how this plan meets the redistricting criteria adopted by the Board on February 22, 2011; identified precinct changes that would result from adoption of this plan; and discussed the next steps in the redistricting process. Following his presentation, Mr. Emerson responded to questions from the Board.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this ordinance.
Mr. Thornton commented on the legacy of the Henrico Civic League in promoting inclusion and the establishment of certain sensitivities within Henrico County. He expressed pride in the inclusiveness of today's Henrico County, remarked that this was a signal day for the County and for persons of African-American and minority descent, and spoke in favor of the alternative redistricting plan before the Board.

Mr. Hazelett noted that he had for the Board's consideration a substitute ordinance labeled as agenda item 99A-11. He advised that the difference between the original ordinance and the substitute was that the substitute would move into the Fairfield District the Martins Manor subdivision, the Windsor Place subdivision, the Foxhill subdivision, the portion of Hechler Village subdivision currently located in the Varina District, and immediately adjacent areas not in a subdivision.

On motion of Mr. Donati, seconded by Mr. Glover, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved the substitution of ordinance 99A-11 for 99-11.

On motion of Mr. Donati, seconded by Mr. Glover, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 99A-11 - see attached substitute ordinance.

100-11 Ordinance - To Amend and Reordain Section 9-2 of the Code of the County of Henrico Titled "Precincts and polling places" to Redistrict the County Based on the 2010 Census.

Mark Coakley, General Registrar, narrated a brief slide presentation on the Henrico County 2011 Redistricting Proposed Precinct Changes. He responded to questions from Mr. Kaechele.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this ordinance.

Mr. Hazelett noted that he had for the Board's consideration a substitute ordinance labeled as agenda item 100A-11. He advised that the difference between the original ordinance and this substitute was that the substitute ordinance would impact two additional precincts: Adams in the Fairfield District, and Pleasants in the Varina District.

On motion of Mr. Donati, seconded by Mr. Glover, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved the substitution of ordinance 100A-11 for 100-11.

On motion of Mr. Donati, seconded by Mr. Glover, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 100A-11 - see attached substitute ordinance.

109-11 Resolution - Signatory Authority - Quitclaim of Interest in Right-of-Way and Conveyance of Easements - Varina District.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this ordinance.
On motion of Mr. Donati, seconded by Mr. Glover, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item - see attached resolution.

Ordinance - To Amend and Reordain Subsections (b) and (c) of Sections 23359 and 23-360 Titled "Water connection fees" and "Sewer connection fees," Respectively, and Subsection (a) of Sections 23-361 and 23-362 Titled "Water service and volume charges" and "Sewer service charges and rates," Respectively, of the Code of the County of Henrico, All to Change County Utility Fees and Charges.

Art Petrini, Director of Public Utilities, responded to questions from the Board. In response to concerns raised by Mr. Thornton, there was some discussion regarding the reduced rate paid by residential water and sewer customers, including many senior citizens, who have low levels of water consumption. There was also some discussion of the cost and benefits to the County of the Cobbs Creek Reservoir project.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this ordinance.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Kaechele, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item - see attached resolution.

## PUBLIC COMMENTS

Bernice B. Newell, a resident of the Varina District, expressed concern about the amount of land being used for new residential development.

William H. Spencer, a resident of the Three Chopt District, offered prayers and compliments for the Board and spoke to the importance of parents talking with their children.

Jennifer Andrews, a resident of the Three Chopt District and past president of the Henrico Education Association, expressed appreciation to the Board for including a pay raise for fulltime employees in the County's proposed operating budget. She also expressed appreciation to Mr. Hazelett for his efforts over the past several years to find funds to absorb increases in health insurance premiums for County employees.

At the conclusion of the public comments, Mr. Thornton noted that a book on the history of Richmond includes a photograph of Mr. Spencer as a youngster in front of St. Luke Hall.

## GENERAL AGENDA

93-11 Resolution - Adoption of Operating and Capital Annual Fiscal Plans For Fiscal Year 2011-12 and Allocation of Car Tax Relief for Tax Year 2011.

Gene Walter, Management and Budget Division Director, responded to a question from Mrs. O'Bannon.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Donati, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item - see attached resolution.

Mr. Hazelett noted that the Board had asked staff during this year's legislative budget reviews to compile information concerning Changing the Way Henrico County Does Business and that he had shared this information earlier in the day during interviews with Ms. Lazo and a local television station. At Mr. Hazelett's direction, Mr. Walter distributed copies of this information to the Board in the form of a booklet. Mr. Hazelett directed the Board's attention to four lines of page one of the document, which identified $\$ 56,500,861$ in cost savings initiatives for general government and schools, including a one-time savings of $\$ 5,465,532$, annual savings of $\$ 33,305,329$; and debt service savings of $\$ 17,730,000$. Mr. Hazelett emphasized that every level of government must change the way it does business. He expressed pride in the difference made by the men and women of Henrico County government, thanked the Board for its commitment to Henrico's citizens, and referred to
this document as one way of expressing staff's commitment to try harder.
Mrs. O'Bannon suggested sending this document with a cover letter to the members of Congress. Mr. Hazelett responded to a question from Mr. Kaechele pertaining to the level of cost savings achieved by the County. There were further comments from the Board relating to the information contained in this document. Mr. Thornton thanked Mr. Hazelett for citing this visionary document. At Mr. Kaechele's request, Mr. Hazelett elaborated on the debt service savings achieved by the County highlighted on the last page of the document and responded to additional questions from the Board.

111-11 Resolution - Acceptance of Roads.
On motion of Mr. Donati, seconded by Mr. Glover, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item - see attached resolution.

Mr. Glover expressed pride in being part of today's Henrico and in working with Mr. Thornton through the years to include women and minorities. Mr. Kaechele concurred with Mr. Glover's sentiments.

At Mr. Thornton's request, Mr. Hazelett dispelled a rumor alluded to by Ms. Newell that he is planning to retire in the near future.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:29 p.m.

WHEREAS, drug courts are an essential component of our criminal justice system and a proven budget solution that benefits all facets of society by saving vast system resources and returning individuals to their communities as productive, tax-paying citizens; and

WHEREAS, drug courts are our criminal justice system's most effective tool for reducing substance abuse and crime; and

WHEREAS, for the past 22 years, drug courts have been restoring lives, reuniting families, and making communities safer across the nation; and

WHEREAS, results of more than 100 program evaluations and at least four metaanalytical studies have yielded definitive evidence that drug courts significantly improve substance-abuse treatment outcomes and substantially reduce drug abuse and crime at less expense than any other criminal justice strategy; and

WHEREAS, the Henrico County Adult Drug Court has served our community since January 2003 as a collaborative effort of the $14^{\text {th }}$ Judicial Circuit, the Commonwealth's Attorney's Office, the Sheriff's Office, Henrico Area Mental Health and Developmental Services, the Division of Police, the Community Corrections Program, and the Probation and Parole District \#32 Office of the Virginia Department of Corrections; and

WHEREAS, 91 participants in tho Henrico County Adult Drug Court have successfully completed its intensive requirements and graduated from the program since 2004.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED that the Board of Supervisors of Henrico County, Virginia hereby recognizes May 2011 as Drug Court Month; calls this year's theme, Drug Courts: A Proven Budget Solution, to the attention of Henrico citizens; salutes the praetitioners and participants who make drug courts work; and acknowledges the important contributions that drug courts continue to make in reducing substance abuse and crime.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Henrico, Virginia, that no part of the funds raised by the general County levies or taxes shall be considered available, allocated, or expended for any purpose until there has been an appropriation of funds for that expenditure or purpose by the Board of Supervisors. Appropriations shall be made on an annual basis.

BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Henrico, Virginia, that:
(1) There be, and hereby is, levied for the calendar year 2011, the tax per $\$ 100$ of assessed valuation on all taxable real estate located in this County on January 1,2011; the tevy hereby ordered being also applicable to the real estate property of public service corporations and other persons with property assessed pursuant to Chapter 26 of Title 58.1 of the Code of Virginia based upon the assessment thereof fixed by the State Corporation Commission and the Virginia Department of Taxation, and duly certified, as follows:

The Board of Supervisors certifies that notice of such rates of levy as set forth in the foregoing order was duly advertised according to law.
(2) For calendar year 2011, the tax levied on real estate shall be due and payable in two equal installments, the first installment being due and payable on June 6, 2011, and the second installment being due and payable on December 5, 2011.
(3) The revenue from such taxes, when and if appropriated by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Henrico, Virginia, shall be used to defray the County charges and expenses and all necessary obligations incident to, or arising from, the execution of the lawful authority of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Henrico, Virginia.

COMMENTS: This resolution should be considered on April 26, 2011, to comply with Virginia Code Section 15.2-2503, "The governing body shall approve the budget, and fix a tax rate for the budget year no later than the date on which the fiscal year begins." For practical purposes in mailing tax bills and to fulfill the requirements of the Code of Virginia, Section 22.1-93, "Approval of annual budget for school purposes," the rate should be fixed prior to May 1, 2011. The Director of Finance recommends approval of this Board paper and thie County Manager concurs.

(9) Pursuant to Section 58.1-3001 of the Code of Virginia, if any taxpayer owns tangible personal property of such small value that the local levies thereon for the year result in a tax of less than fifteen dollars, such property roay be omitted from the personal property book and no assessment made thereon.
(10) The revenue from such taxes, when, and if, appropriated by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Henrico, Virginia, shall be used to defray the County charges and expenses and all necessary obligations incident to, or arising from, the execution of the lawful authority of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Henrico, Virginia.

The Board of Supervisors certifies that notice of the rates of levy as set forth in the foregoing order was duly advertised according to law.

COMMENTS: This resolution should be considered on April 26, 2011, to comply with Virginia Code Section 15.2-2503, "The governing body shall approve the budget and fix a tax rate for the budget year no later than the date on which the fiscal year begins." For practical purposes in mailing tax bills and to fulfill the requirements of the Code of Virginia, Section 22.1-93, "Approval of annual budget for school purposes," the rate should be fixed prior to May 1, 2011. The Director of Finance recommends approval of this Board paper and the County Manager concurs.

AN ORDINANCE to amend and reordain Section 9-1 of the Code of the County of Henrico titled "Magisterial districts" to redistrict the County based on the 2010 Census.

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA:

1. That Section 9-1 of the Code of the County of Henrico is hereby amended and reordained as follows:

## Sec. 9-1. Magisterial districts.

The Clerk of the Board shall send a certified copy of this ordinance, including a description of the boundaries and a map showing the boundaries of the five magisterial districts, to the Henrico County Electoral Board, Secretary of the Commonwealth, State Board of Elections, and Division of Legislative Services.

AN ORDINANCE to amend and reordain Section 9-2 of the Code of the County of Henrico titled "Precincts and polling places" to redistrict the County based on the 2010 Census.

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA:

1. That Section 9-2 of the Code of the County of Henrico is hereby amended and reordained as follows:

## Sec. 9-2. Precincts and polling places.

The following shall be the precinct boundaries and polling places for the magisterial districts in the county.

Developers of new subdivisions shall install local sewer facilities in accordance with chapter 19 and sewer agreements approved by the board of supervisors. Along arty public right-of-way or easement where the property owner desires service for his own personal use (i.e., a single-family residential unit in which the owner intends to reside), the county will extend the local facilities at the owner's expense. The cost of such an extention shall be $\$ 50.00$ per linear foot of sewer main extension, except that the cost for such extension to serve an existing single-family dwelling served by an individual septic system shall be $\$ 25.00$ per linear foot plus a cost of $\$ 3,100000 \$ 3,350.00$ for installing the connection from the main to the property line.
(2) Where local facilities are available to the connector's property and where the costs of such local facilities have not been previously assessed against the property being connected, a local facilities fee shall be required. The local facilities fee shall be $\$ 3,100.00 \$ 3,350,00$
3. That Subsection (a) of Section 23-361 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained as follows:

(3) Industrial strong waste charge. In addition to the charges set out in subsections (a)(1) and (2) of this section, there will ae charged to individual users a streng waste charge as applicable:
a. Suspended solids, when the concentrations of suspended solids exceed 275 milligrams per liter: $\$ 17.60 \$ 18.50$ per CWT for suspended solids in excess of $275 \mathrm{mg} / \mathrm{l}$.
b. BOD, when concentrations of BOD exceed 250 milligrams per liter: $\$ 24.35$ $\mathbf{\$ 2 5 . 6 0}$ per CWT for BOD in excess of $\mathbf{2 5 0} \mathbf{~ m g / l .}$
7. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2011, as provided by law and the following provisions:

Charges set forth in Sections 23-361 and 23-362 shall be pro-rated to apply the old and new charges to that proportion of water supplied and/or sewage collected prior to and after the effective date of the new rates. Calculation of such pro-rated charges shall be computed based on average daily use of service supplied.

The connection fees set forth in Sections 23-359 and 23-360 shall not take effect until October 1, 2011.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the funds included in the Operating and Capital Annual Fiscal Plans for any County department, office, or agency may be used as participating funds in any Federal or State aid program foc like purpose upon appropriation by the Board of Supervisors; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the salary schedule attached hereto for Boards and Commissions and Unclassified Salaries effective at the beginning of the 2011-2012 fiscal year, hereby is approved and, in accordance with Section 15.2-1414.2 of the Code of Virginia, the maximum annual compensation of members of this Board is set for calendar years 2012 through 2015 as set out in note (2) of the Schedule of Compensation.
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the approved Operating Annual Fiscal Plan for fiscal year 2011-12 includes a decrease in the personnel complement of 44.55 positions for schools; and funding for a 2.372 percent merit increase for all eligible general govermment and schaol employees; the increase to be effective on Jnne 18, 2011; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in order to implement changes to the Personal Property Tax Relief Act of 1998 (the "PPTRA") made by legislation adopted by the Virginia General Assembly:

1. Any qualifying vehicle, as defined in the PPTRA, sitused within the County commencing January 1, 2011, shall receive personal property tax relief in the following manner:
a. Quallfying vehicles valued at $\$ 1,000$ or less shall receive $100 \%$ tax relief;
b. Qualifying vehicles valued at between $\$ 1,001$ to $\$ 20,000$ shall receive $68 \%$ tax relief;
c. Qualifying vehicles valued at $\$ 20,001$ or more shall receive $68 \%$ tax relief on the first $\$ 20,000$ of value only; and
d. All other vehicles which do not meet the definition of "qualifying vehicles" will not receive any form of tax relief under the PPTRA.
2. The amount of tax reliof shall be a specific doilat amount offset against the total personal property taxes that would otherwise be due on a qualifying vehicle but for the PPTRA. The specific dollar amount of relief shall be shown on the tax bill for each qualifying vehicle, together with a general description of the criteria upon which relief has been allocated.

COMMENTS: This Board Paper should be considered on April 12, 2011, but should be deferred until Tuesday April 26, 2011, to eomply with Virginia Code Section 15.2-2506, which states that "The hearing shall be held at least seven days prior to the approval of the budget..." The Director of Finance recommends approval of this Board Paper and the County Manager concurs.
