MANAGER'S COMMENTS

The American Planning Association (APA) County Planning Division and the National Association of County Planners (NACP) have given an Award of Merit in the Grass Roots Initiative category to the County of Henrico for the County's Homeowner's Enhancement Guide. The award was presented to S. Mark Strickler, the County's Director of Community Revitalization, at the APA National Conference in Boston, Massachusetts on April 10, 2011. This is the second award received by the County for the guide, which is the County's newest neighborhood revitalization tool. The guide is available for free download on the County's website and can be checked out or purchased at the County's public libraries.

Bobbie Ragsdale, Solid Waste Labor Foreman II for the Department of Public Utilities, is this year's recipient of the Frank D. Soignoli Award for Excellence in Community Service Supervision. The award was established by the Henrico Community Corrections Program to be given annually in memory of Frank Soignoli, who served for 13 years as the community service site supervisor for the County's Department of Social Services. Mr. Ragsdale was recognized for his leadership role in the County's Community Maintenance Program (CCP) and most particularly for his utilization of clients in CCP's weekly cleanups.

112-11 P-5-11 Fairfield W.H. Capital, LLC: Request for a Provisional Use Permit under Sections 24-58.2(a), 24-120 and 24-122.1 of Chapter 24 of the County Code in order to allow 24 hour operation of a proposed restaurant on part of Parcel 802-736-8028, located on the west line of Mechanicsville Turnpike (U.S. Route 360) approximately 225' north of its intersection with E. Laburnum Avenue.

Mr. Hazelett informed the public that this item had been withdrawn by the applicant.

113-11 P-6-11 Fairfield T.V. Wilson: Request for a Provisional Use Permit under Sections 24-62.2(a), 24-62.2(b), 24-120 and 24-122.1 of Chapter 24 of the County Code in order to allow festivals and assembly halls in an existing building on Parcel 797-736-6692, located on the east line of Carolina Avenue at its intersection with Pensacola Avenue.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to a request by the applicant to defer this case.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Kaechele, and by unanimous vote, the Board deferred this item to the September 13, 2011 meeting.

114-11 P-7-11 Three Chopt Virginia CVS Pharmacy, LLC: Request for a Provisional Use Permit under Sections 24-58.2(a), 24-120 and 24-122.1 of Chapter 24 of the County Code in order to allow 24 hour operation of an existing pharmacy on part of Parcel 747-759-8591, located in the southwest quadrant of the intersection of W. Broad Street (U.S. Route 250) and Cox Road.

Joe Emerson, Director of Planning, and Mike Rothermel, an attorney for Spotts Fain PC who was representing the applicant, responded to questions from Mr. Kaechele.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this case.

On motion of Mr. Kaechele, seconded by Mrs. O'Bannon, the Board followed the recommendation of the Planning Commission and approved this item subject to the following conditions:

- 1. This permit shall only apply to the 24-hour operation of a CVS Pharmacy on Parcel 747-759-8591.
- 2. Store windows shall not be tinted or obscured by advertisements, posters, blinds, and/or other visual obstructions that inhibit or hinder exterior surveillance. The installation and use of light blocking devices during daylight hours shall be permissible if approved by the Crime Prevention Unit of the Division of Police.
- Prior to 24-hour operation, the applicant and the Crime Prevention Unit
 of the Division of Police shall conduct a security survey of the subject
 property and store operations. The owner/occupant of the CVS Pharmacy
 shall implement the mutually agreed upon security measures affecting the
 property.
- 4. The owners or operators shall provide adequate lighting for all entrances, exits, and parking areas serving the use or location. "Adequate lighting" means lighting sufficient for clear visual and security camera surveillance.
- 5. Any outside speakers and/or sound system shall comply with the following standards:
 - a. Sound systems shall be equipped with controls that permit full and complete volume control; and,
 - b. Sound(s) emitted from the system shall not be audible beyond a distance of one hundred (100) feet measured from the source.
- 6. The owner or operator shall be responsible for the installation, operation, and maintenance of exterior security camera(s) and video system of

professional grade and quality, and rated for the exterior surveillance of retail operations. This security system shall at a minimum include:

- a. Exterior surveillance cameras shall monitor all entrance(s), fueling area(s), parking area(s), delivery area(s), and, other areas determined necessary by the Crime Prevention Unit of the Division of Police. Such security cameras shall provide clear imagery of the establishment's patrons and their vehicle.
- b. Recordings of all activities under surveillance shall be preserved for a period of four (4) months by the applicant. Authorized representatives of the Henrico County Division of Police shall have full and complete access to all recordings upon request.
- 7. Should evidence (i.e. police calls to the premises, complaints from other businesses, criminal assaults, etc.) or registered complaints (i.e. increased public nuisance, loitering, excessive noise, etc.) indicate that 24-hour exterior operation is having adverse effects on the area, the Board of Supervisors may hold a public hearing to consider revoking the permit and/or amending all or some conditions.

115-11 C-1C-11 Varina Godsey Properties, Inc.: Request to conditionally rezone from M-1 Light Industrial District to RTHC Residential Townhouse District (Conditional) part of Parcel 817-721-5981 containing approximately 60.7 acres, located on the north line of Oakleys Lane approximately 300' west of its intersection with S. Holly Avenue.

Jean Moore, Assistant Director of Planning, and Mr. Emerson responded to questions from the Board.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this case.

On motion of Mr. Donati, seconded by Mr. Glover, the Board followed the recommendation of the Planning Commission and approved this item with the following proffered conditions:

Building Type and Design

1. <u>Density.</u> There shall be no more than one hundred thirty-five (135) town homes developed on the property.

- 2. Architecture. The buildings shall be similar in architectural style to those illustrated in Exhibit A (see case file) and include materials such as brick, stone, dryvit, vinyl siding, and/or Hardiplank. At least 35% of the front elevation of a multi-unit building will include materials such as brick or stone. A confirmation of the building material percentages, for all units in the development, shall be provided at the time of each building permit, or at the request of the Director of Planning. Roofing material shall have a minimum thirty (30) year life and associated warranty. Vinyl siding shall have long-lasting strength, resilience and resistance to everyday wear and tear, with a minimum thickness of 0.042". Manufacturer's specifications, demonstrating the minimum vinyl thickness, shall be provided at the time of each building permit.
- 3. **Building Elevations.** All side elevations shall contain a minimum of two windows and a bay window. No cantilevered features will be allowed.
- 4. **Foundations.** The exposed exterior portions of all foundations below the first floor level shall be finished with brick or stone, with a minimum of twelve inches (12") of brick or stone visible above grade.
- 5. Minimum House Size. The minimum finished floor area shall be fifteen hundred (1500) square feet for town homes with garages, and twelve hundred eighty (1280) square feet for town homes without garages, exclusive of garages, porches, and decks.
- 6. **Building Size.** There shall be no more than six (6) town homes per building.
- 7. Sound Suppression Measures. Walls and ceilings between units shall be constructed with a minimum sound coefficient rating of fifty-four (54). Prior to the issuance of a building permit, the owner or applicant shall submit construction details (cross-section), with an architect's or engineer's seal, demonstrating that construction will provide the proffered sound coefficient.
- 8. <u>Chimneys.</u> The exposed portions of all fireplace chimneys shall be of brick, stone, or siding similar to the exterior treatment of the dwelling. The exposed bases of all chimneys shall be of the same material as the dwelling foundation. This proffer shall not apply to direct-vent gas fireplaces or appliances.
- 9. Garages. No less than 20% of the town house units will have a garage, based on the cumulative numbers for the entire development.

An individual section may have a lower percentage or no garages. A cumulative count of garages in the development shall be provided at the time of each building permit or at the request of the Director of Planning.

10. Town Homes. All town homes shall be marketed as owner-occupied homes.

Site Design

- 11. Exterior Lighting. Each town home shall have exterior wall-mounted lights at each entrance. Street lighting fixtures shall not exceed fifteen (15) feet in height above grade level. All lighting will be residential in character.
- 12. <u>Driveways.</u> All driveways shall be finished with concrete. All driveways on each individual lot shall be paved prior to receiving a Certificate of Occupancy.
- 13. <u>Sidewalks.</u> Sidewalks a minimum of four (4) feet in width shall be provided along one side of the roads within the development, and along the front of all lots.
- 14. **Trash.** There shall be no central trash receptacles.
- 15. <u>Curb and Gutter.</u> Standard six (6) inch curb and gutter, meeting Henrico County requirements, shall be provided within the development.
- 16. Roads. Prior to the issuance of any Certificate of Occupancy, the applicant shall provide the Planning Department with certification from a licensed engineer that the roadway within the project was constructed according to the approved subdivision plan, and in compliance with Henrico County road design standards and specifications (except as to pavement width and turning radii), to include proper compaction of the sub-base soils, utility trenches, base stone, and asphalt surface.
- 17. <u>Underground Utilities.</u> Except for junction boxes, meters and existing overhead utility lines or for technical or environmental reason, all utility lines shall be underground.
- 18. <u>Concept Plan.</u> The site will be developed similar to the attached concept plan, entitled Exhibit B (see case file), unless otherwise requested and specifically approved by the Planning Commission at the time of Plan of Development or subdivision approval.

- 19. <u>Recreational Amenities.</u> There shall be park areas as generally shown on the conceptual site plan (see case file). The Protective Covenants shall require that the rights and obligations associated with the recreational areas and amenities be clearly disclosed in writing to each purchaser.
- 20. Stormwater Management. If a wet pond is utilized as a BMP, it will be aerated and will be designed as an amenity. However, any existing ponds will not be required to be aerated or used as an amenity.
- 21. Right-of-Way Dedication. The owner shall dedicate to Henrico County the right-of-way, and any mutually agreed upon easements for drainage conveyance systems, required for the relocation of Oakleys Lane, upon the request of the County. Should the dedicated property not be used for widening of Oakleys Lane within thirty (30) years of the date of the dedication, title to the dedicated property will revert to the applicant or its successors in interest.
- 22. Phasing. No more than 82 units shall be constructed prior to the construction of relocated Oakleys Lane. The developer shall construct the westernmost entrance as shown on Exhibit B (see case file) first, which shall serve a maximum of 45 units as part of Phase 1. Upon the completion of Phase 1, but not prior to January 1, 2015, Certificates of Occupancy for an additional 37 units may be issued provided the easternmost entrance is constructed by the developer as shown on Exhibit B (see case file). Upon the completion of relocated Oakleys Lane, the preceding phasing requirements shall no longer apply.

Landscaping and Buffering

- 23. Foundation Planting and Sod. Each town home shall have a minimum of six (6) shrubs planted along the front foundation. The front and side yards shall have sod, exclusive of mulched flowerbeds and landscaping, and irrigation. The aforementioned planting and sod shall be installed prior to the issuance of the final Certificate of Occupancy for each town home.
- 24. <u>Landscaping.</u> There shall be at least one (1) tree with a minimum caliper of two (2) inches planted on each side of each building. Also, prior to final recordation, a landscape plan shall be submitted to the Planning Department for approval.
- 25. Entrance Feature. A landscaped entrance shall, at a minimum, be located at one of the entrances for the development. The entrance sign shall be ground-mounted and no more than six (6) feet in height.

Signage shall not be internally illuminated.

26. **Buffers.** A twenty-five (25) foot wide landscape buffer shall be provided adjacent to the future alignment of the right-of-way line of Oakley's Lane. The landscaping within the buffer shall at a minimum meet the Henrico County thirty-five (35) foot transitional buffer standards. Exceptions allowed within the buffer area shall include utility easements, signage, fences, and entrance roads to the project, and other purposes requested and specifically permitted or required by the Planning Commission at the time of Plan of Development or subdivision approval. A landscaped berm may be located within the buffer.

Other

- 27. Hours of Construction. The hours of site work construction, including operation of bulldozers and other earth-moving equipment, shall be between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, except in emergencies or where unusual circumstances require extending the specific hours in order to complete work, such as concrete pours or utility connections. No site work construction will be performed on Saturday or Sunday. The hours of outside building construction shall be between 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. except in emergencies or where unusual circumstances require extending the specific hours in order to complete work, such as concrete pours or utility connections. Outside building construction on Saturday may take place if mutually agreed to by the homebuilder and the manager of Mankin Mansion. outside building construction shall be performed on Sunday. Signs, in both English and Spanish, stating the above-referenced provisions, shall be posted and maintained at all entrances to the property prior to any land disturbance activities thereon.
- 28. Protective Covenants. Prior to or concurrent with the recordation of the first subdivision plat approved by the County, and before the conveyance of any portion of the property covered by said subdivision (other than for the dedication of easements, roads, or utilities), a document shall be recorded in the Clerk's Office of the Circuit Court of Henrico County, Virginia setting forth controls on the development and maintenance of the property. Storage or parking of recreational vehicles, boats and trailers will not be allowed outside.
- 29. C-1 Zoning. A rezoning application shall be filed for C-1 zoning for the area within the 100-year flood plain within the property prior to

the recordation of the subdivision plat for the last section of the property.

30. <u>Severance.</u> The unenforceability, elimination, revision or amendment of any proffer set forth herein, in whole or in part, shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the other proffers or unaffected part of any such proffer.
