PANCREATIC CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

November 2011

WHEREAS, in 2011, an estimated 44,030 people will be diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in the United States and 37,660 will die from the disease; and

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer is one of the deadliest cancers and is the fourth leading cause of cancer death in the United States; and

WHEREAS, when symptoms of pancreatic cancer present themselves, it is usually too late for an optimistic prognosis, and 74 percent of pancreatic cancer patients die within the first year of their diagnosis while 94 percent of those diagnosed die within the first five years; and

WHEREAS, of all the racial and ethnic groups in the United States, African-Americans have the highest incidence rate of pancreatic cancer, between 34 percent and 70 percent higher than the other groups; and

WHEREAS, approximately 950 deaths will occur in Virginia in 2011 from pancreatic cancer; and

WHEREAS, there is no cure for pancreatic cancer and there have been no major improvements in survival rates in the last 40 years; and

WHEREAS, the federal government invests significantly less money in pancreatic cancer research than it does in any of the other leading cancer killers; and

WHEREAS, this research only constitutes approximately two percent of the National Cancer Institute's federal research funding, a relatively low figure given the severity of the disease, its nortality rate, and how little is known about how to arrest it; and

WHEREAS, the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network is the only national patient advocacy organization that serves the pancreatic cancer community in Henrico County and nationwide by focusing its efforts on public policy, research funding, patient services, and public awareness and education related to developing effective treatments and a cure for pancreatic cancer; and

WHEREAS, this organization and its affiliates in Hernico County support those patients currently battling pancreatic cancer as well as those who have lost their lives to the disease and are committed to nothing less than a cure; and

WHEREAS, the good health and well-being of the residents of Henrico County are enhanced as a direct result of increased awareness about pancreatic cancer and research into early detection, causes, and effective treatments.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED that the Board of Supervisors of Henrico County, Virginia hereby recognizes November 2011 as Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month and calls this observance to the attention of all Henrico citizens.

WHEREAS, funding for the program enhancements after the expiration of the federal grant will be sought from outside sources, and acceptance of this grant will not commit this Board or future Boards to fully funding the program enhancements once federal grant funds expire.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors authorizes the County Manager to accept this grant award and implement the enhancements to adult drug court program in Henrico County, provided, however, that acceptance of this grant will not commit this Board or future Boards to fully fund the program enhancements once federal grant funds expire.

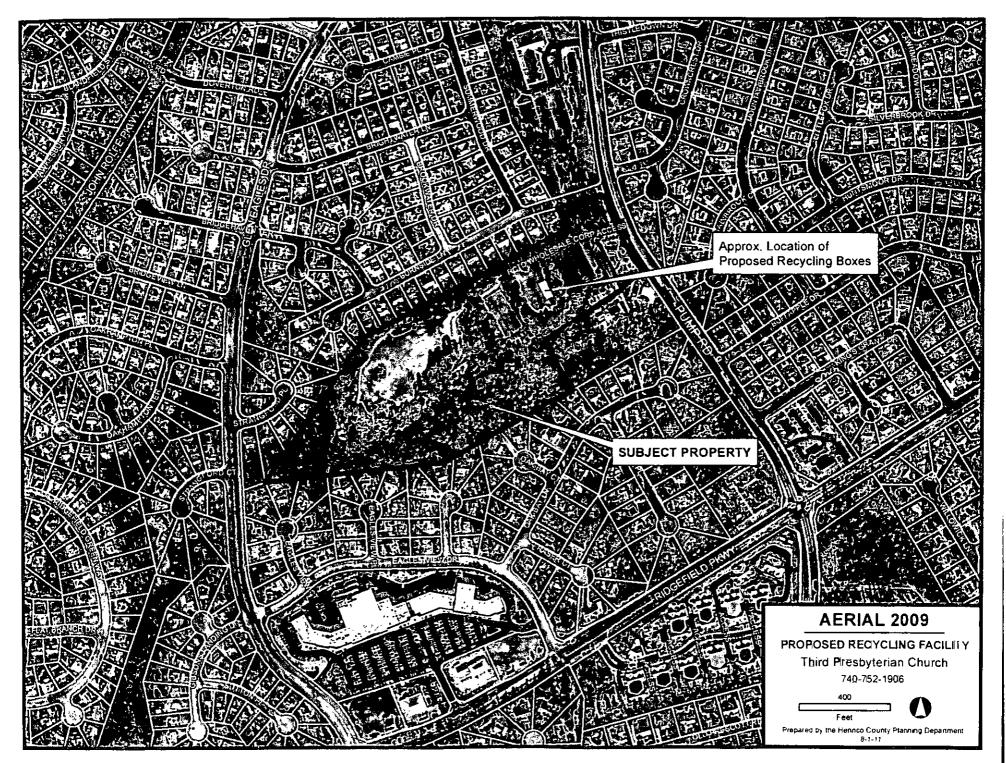

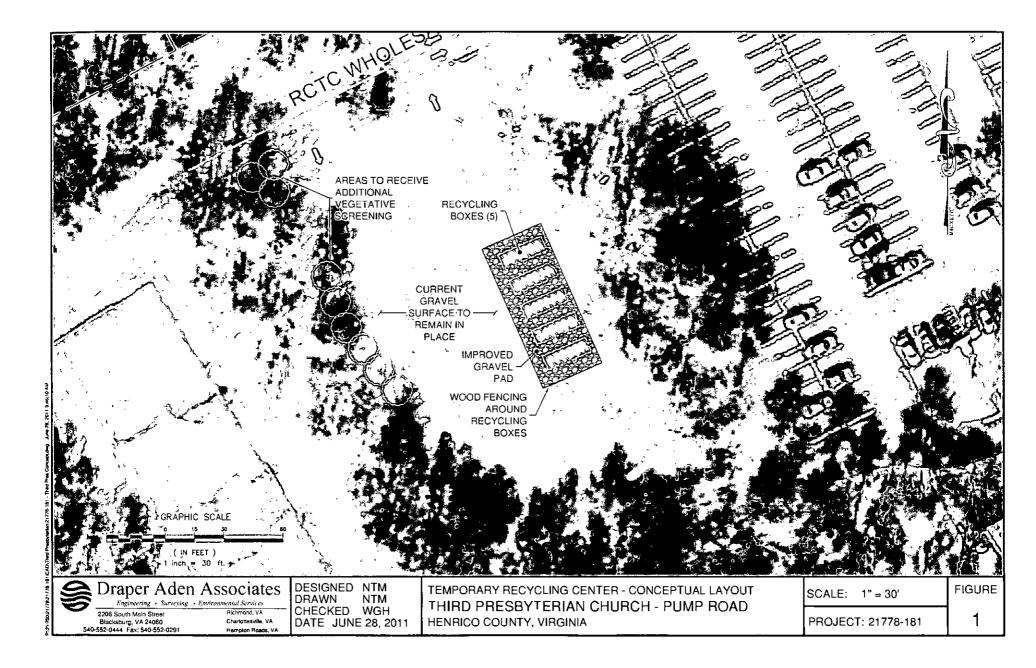

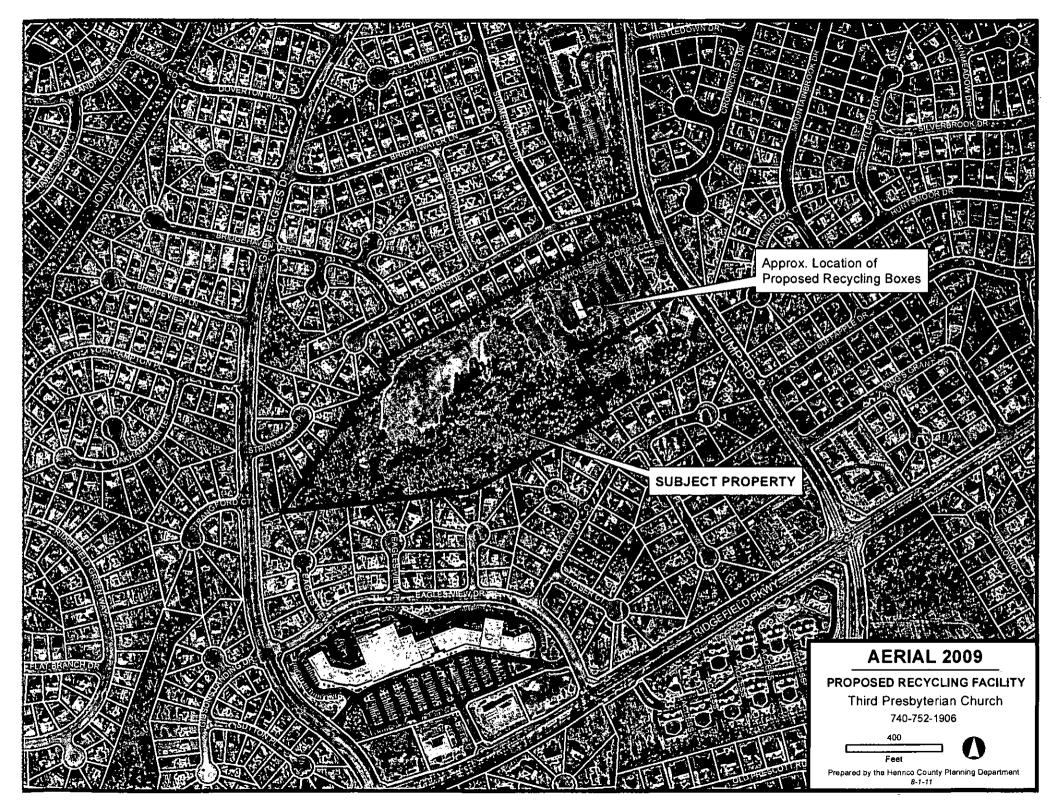
