

The Board, as a part of the budget amendment introduced on May 24, 2011 and approved on June 14, 2011, appropriated \$370,000 for the capital improvements including \$80,000 for operating expenses.
- (2) My personal interest consists of my status as one of approximately 170 shareholders of Windsor Club of Elko. 1 would benefit from the transaction to the same extent as other shareholders under the proposed terms of the MOU which allows the Club some free use of the property and allows shareholders to rent the space at reduced rental rates.


