MANAGER'S COMMENTS

For the 26th consecutive year, the Henrico County Budget Office has prepared the *Financial Trends Monitoring System* document prior to examination of the operating budget for the subsequent fiscal year. This document provides an historical review over an 11-year period of financial and budgetary information that is combined with economic and demographic information. It is a valuable tool in monitoring the County's fiscal health.

The Board will receive the proposed Fiscal Year 2013 County budget on March 13, 2012, which will reflect cautious optimism in local revenue projections. Although this budget is balanced, without layoffs or significant service delivery reductions, this budget process began with a \$53 million budget gap and is the most challenging the County has ever experienced. The State budget continues to be the wild card in all of the County's budget discussions. The General Assembly is not scheduled to complete its 2012 session until March 10, just three days before the Board will receive the FY13 budget.

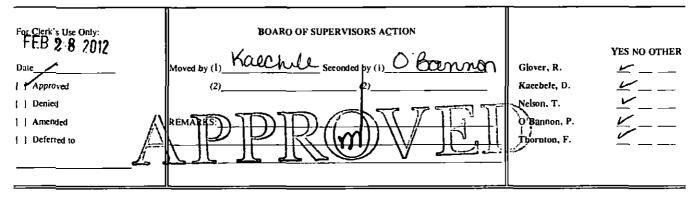

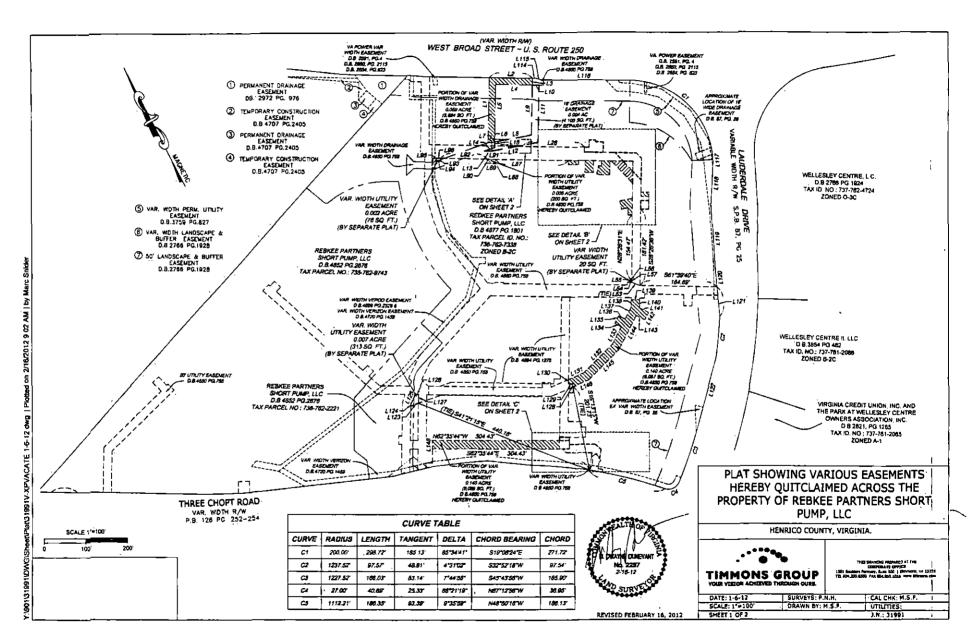
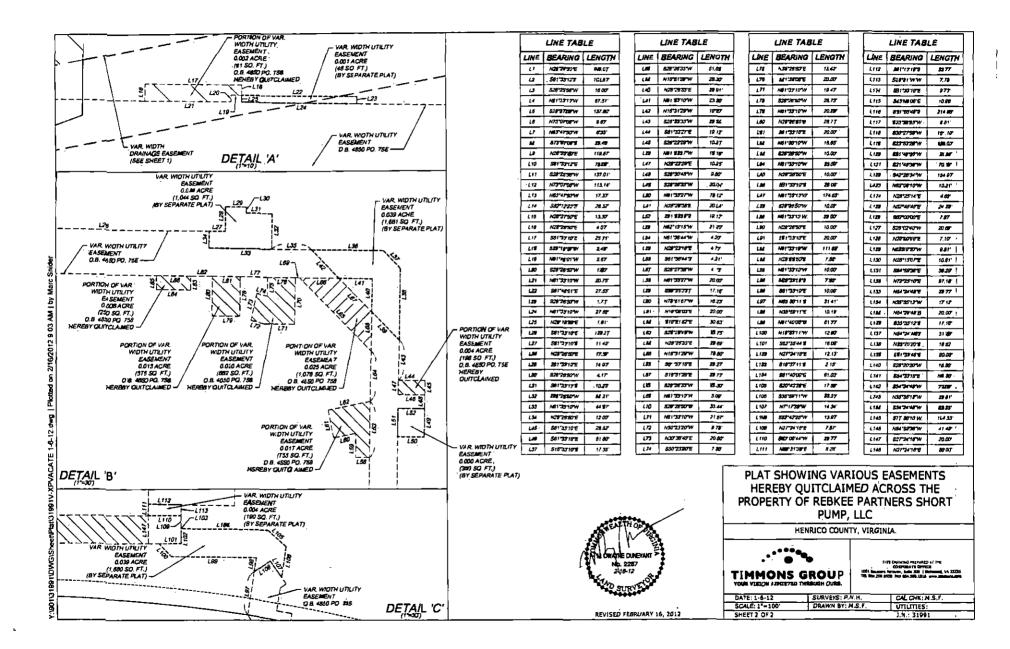

WHEREAS, The Collegiate School, a not-for-protit Virginia nonstock corporation (the "School") whose principal place of business is located at North Mooreland Road in Henrico, Virginia, owns and operates an elementary-secondary school (the "Facility") at that location; and

WHEREAS, the Economic Development Authority of Henrico County, Virginia (the "Authority"), has considered the School's application requesting the Authority lo issue its educational facilities revenue bonds, in an amount currently estimated not lo exceed \$24,500,000 (the "Bonds"), to tinance (1) the Project, as detined below, (2) all or a portion of the costs of issuance incurred in connection with the issuance of the Bonds, and (3) interest on the Bonds prior to, during, and up to one year after completion of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Projecl will consist of: (1) the construction of an interior loop road and parking lots, (2) the construction of sidewalks, landscaping and olher site improvements, (3) the construction of stormwater and olher utility facilities, (4) the construction, renovation and improvement of existing academic, administrative and student support services buildings including, in particular, the Middle and Upper School facilities, and (5) the construction of a new Upper School Library/Academic Commons building, consisting of a new building of approximately 27,000 square feet, lo provide library, classroom, meeting, dining and other multi-purpose uses to be located al North Mooreland Road in the County; and

WHEREAS, on February 16, 2012 the Authority held a public hearing on the issuance of the Bonds and adopted a resolution requesting the Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of the County to approve the issuance of the Bonds to comply with Section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), and Section 15.2-4906 of the Industrial Development and Revenue Bond Act, as amended (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, a copy of the Authority's resolution approving the issuance of the Bonds, subject to terms to be agreed upon, a record of the public hearing, and a tiscal impact statement with respect to the issuance of the Bonds have been tiled with the Board.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Henrico County, Virginia:

1. The Board hereby approves the issuance of the Bonds by the Authority for the benetit of the School, as required by Section 147(f) of the Code and Section 15.2-4906 of the Act, to permit the Authority to issue bonds for the purposes set forth above.

2. Approval of the issuance of the Bonds, as required by Section 147(f) of the Code and Section 15.2-4906 of the Act, does not constitule an endorsement of the Bonds or the creditworthiness of the School.

3. As required by Section 15.2-4909 of the Act, the Bonds shall provide that neither the County nor the Authority shall be obligated lo pay the Bonds or the interest thereon or olher costs incident thereto except from the revenues and moneys pledged therefor, and neither the faith and credil nor the taxing power of the Commonwealth of Virginia, the County or the Authority shall be pledged thereto.

4. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

COMMENTS: The Executive Director of the Economic Development Authority recommends approval of this Board paper; the County Manager concurs.

RESOLUTION OF THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA

WHEREAS, there have been described to the Economic Development Authority of Henrico County, Virginia (the "Authority"), the plans of The Collegiate School, a non-profit, Virginia nonstock corporation (the "Borrower"), to finance or reimburse costs related to all or portions of the following projects (collectively, the "Project"): (a) the construction of an interior toop road and parking tots, (b) the construction of sidewalks, landscaping and other site improvements, (c) the construction of stormwater and other utility facilities, (d) the construction, renovation and improvement of existing academic, administrative and student support services buildings including, in particular, the Middle and Upper School facilities, and (e) the construction of a new Upper School Library/Academic Commons building, consisting of a new building of approximately 27,000 square feet, to provide library, classroom, meeting, dining and other multi-purpose uses to be located at North Mooreland Road in Henrico County, Virginia (the "County");

WHEREAS, the Borrower in its appearance before the Authority and in its application has described the benefits of the financing, and has requested the Authority to issue its educational facilities revenue bonds (as more particularly described below, the "Bonds") under the Virginia Industrial Development and Revenue Bond Act in Section 15.2-4900, *et. seq.* of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended (the "Act") in such amounts as may be necessary to finance costs to be incurred in acquiring, improving, equipping and developing the Project; and,

WHEREAS, a public hearing has been held as required by Section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), and Section 15.2-4906 of the Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA:

1. It is hereby found and determined that the financing of the Project for the Borrower will be in the public interest of the County, and its environs, and will enabte the Borrower to provide improved educational facilities for the use of the inhabitants of the Commonwealth of Virginia (the "Commonwealth") and the County, and wilt be in furtherance of the purposes of the Act.

2. The Authority hereby agrees to assist the Borrower to finance the acquisition, improvement, equipping and development of the Project by undertaking the issuance of its educational facilities revenue bonds therefor in an amount not to exceed \$24,500,000, upon terms and conditions to be mutually agreed upon between the Authority and the Borrower.

3. The proceeds of the Bonds shall be loaned to the Borrower to enable it to acquire, improve, equip, and develop the Project, pay any costs of issuance for the Bonds and, if necessary, pay capitalized interest on the Bonds during and after any construction of the Project. The Borrower shall agree to provide payments to the Authority sufficient to pay the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on and purchase price of, if any, the Bonds and to pay all other expenses in connection with financing the Project. The Bonds shall be issued in form and pursuant to terms to be approved by the Authority, and the payment of the Bonds shall be secured by an assignment, for the benefit of the holders thereof, of the Authority's rights to payments (other than rights to fees, expenses and indemnification) under the agreement pursuant to which the proceeds of the Bonds will be loaned to the Borrower.

4. It having been represented to the Authority that it may be necessary to proceed immediately with the acquisition, improvement, equipping, and development of the Project, the Authority hereby agrees that the Borrower may proceed with plans for the Project, enter into contracts for acquisition, improvement, equipping, and development of the Project, and take such other steps as it may deem appropriate in connection therewith, proyided that nothing herein shall be deemed to authorize the Borrower to obligate the Authority without its consent in each instance to the payment of any moneys or the performance of any acts in connection with the Project. The Authority agrees that the Borrower may be reimbursed from the proceeds of the Bonds for all lawful costs so incurred by it.

5. The Authority hereby agrees with the recommendation of the Borrower that Hunton & Williams LLP be appointed as bond counsel in connection with the issuance of the Bonds, and hereby appoints such firm to supervise the proceedings and approve the issuance of the Bonds.

6. The Authority hereby agrees, if requested, to accept the recommendation of the Borrower with respect to the appointment of an agent or underwriter for the sale of the Bonds pursuant to terms to be mutually agreed upon. The Borrower anticipates that the sale of the Bonds will be accomplished through either a direct purchase with a qualified financial institution or a public offering.

7. All lawful costs and expenses in connection with the financing and the acquisition, improvement, equipping and development of the Project, including the fees and expenses of bond counsel, counsel for the Authority and the agent or underwriter for the sale of the Bonds, shall be paid from the proceeds of the Bonds or by the Borrower. If for any reason the Bonds are not issued, or the Bonds are issued but it is determined that a part or all of such costs are not lawfully payable out of bond proceeds, it is understood that all such expenses shall be paid by the Borrower and that the Authority shall have no responsibility therefor.

8. The Borrower shall pay any and all costs and expenses incurred by the Authority in connection with the proposed bond issue. If for any reason the Bonds are riot issued, it is understood that the Borrower will reimburse the Authority for all of its out-of-pocket expenses relating to the proposed bond financing.

9. The Borrower shall pay the Authority its annual administrative fee of \$500 per \$1,000,000 principal amount of the Bonds issued or a pro rata portion thereof, payable upon the issuance of the Bonds and on each anniversary date of the issuance of the Bonds thereafter until payment of the Bonds in full, provided that the amount so paid shall not equal or exceed an amount that would cause the "yield" on the obligation of the Borrower to the Authority or any other "acquired purpose obligation" to be "materially higher" than the yield on the Bonds, as the terms are defined in Section 148 of the Code.

10. The Borrower shall indemnify and save harmless the Authority, its officers, directors, employees, and agents from and against all liabilities, obligations, claims, damages, penalties, fines, losses, costs, and expenses in any way connected with the Borrower or the issuance of the Bonds.

11. Any action heretofore or hereafter taken by any officer of the Authority in conformity with the purposes and intent of this resolution and the issuance of the Bonds is hereby ratified, approved and confirmed.

12. The Authority hereby recommends and requests that the Board of Supervisors of the County (the "Board"), approve the issuance of the Bonds to the extent required by the provisions of Section 147(f) of the Code and Section 15.2-4906 of the Act within sixty days of the date of the adoption of this resolution. The Authority hereby directs the Assistant Secretary of the Authority to submit to the Board this resolution, the Borrower's Fiscal Impact Statement, and a summary of the public hearing held by the Authority prior to the adoption of this resolution.

13. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and shall expire one year from the date of its adoption unless the Bonds are issued within such time.

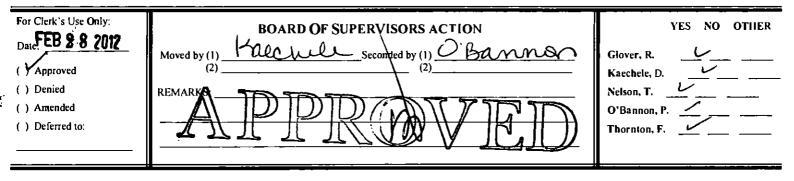
