MANAGER'S COMMENTS

The Henrico County Attorney's Office participated in the 6th Annual Statewide Legal Food Frenzy that was held April 2 through 13. Business Supervisor Karen Grizzard spearheaded the office's participation as she has done for the past four years. The County Attorney's Office came in second in the "Government Per Capita" category, collecting 315.99 pounds per employee. The Legal Food Frenzy engages the legal community in friendly competition to benefit the seven regional food banks and the Federation of Virginia Food Banks during a traditionally slow period for donations. Mr. Rapisarda recognized Ms. Grizzard and Deputy County Attorney J. Thomas Tokarz, who were present representing the County Attorney's Office.

At its most recent business meeting on May 4 in Williamsburg, the membership of the Virginia Association of Community Services Boards (VACSB) elected Mrs. Grizzard, recent past Chairperson of the Henrico Community Services Board (CSB), as Chairperson of this statewide organization. Her election is the result of the leadership she has shown in Henrico County and her contributions to VACSB since she was first appointed to the Henrico CSB in March 2003. Mrs. Grizzard is the third former Henrico CSB chair to be elected to this statewide leadership position. VACSB is the unified voice for local CSB programs in state and federal public policy matters.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' COMMENTS

Mrs. O'Bannon announced that at a special breakfast event on May 17 the Henrico 2011 Commemoration Advisory Commission received the Richmond Metropolitan Convention and Visitors Bureau Chairman's Award for contributions to the enhancement of the Richmond region's tourism industry. The Commission was appointed by the Board of Supervisors to help the County commemorate 400 years of good government. The 2011 commemoration offered an opportunity for the County to showcase and promote its tourist attractions. Mrs. O'Bannon recognized Deputy County Manager Angela Harper, the Commission's lead staff person, and Karen Perkins and Dawn Miller from the Division of Recreation and Parks, who also served as staff to the Commission.

Mrs. O'Bannon noted that on May 20 she attended the 5th Annual Afternoon Tea in Ashland presented by the Ladies of Ashland at the Hanover Arts & Activities Center. For the past five years, this organization has held two events each year to raise funds for Henrico County's Hilliard House, a women and children's homeless shelter in eastern Henrico. Mrs. O'Bannon cited this fundraising effort as an excellent example of regional cooperation.

Mrs. O'Bannon congratulated Mr. Nelson on receiving the Leadership Metro Richmond (LMR) Servant Leader Award at the organization's 2012 spring luncheon, which was held at the Jefferson Hotel. Mr. Nelson was a member of LMR's class of 2011. Mr. Nelson thanked Mrs. O'Bannon for this acknowledgment and also thanked County officials and staff who attended the luncheon and offered their support.



WHEREAS, on March 13, 2012, the Board of Supervisors approved a resolution authorizing the County Manager to accept a \$72,000 grant from the FY2009 Metropolitan Medical Response System ("MMRS") Grant Program as a sub-grantee of the City of Richmond, and as managed by the Virginia Department of Health and the Virginia Department of Emergency Management; and

WHEREAS, this funding will be used to support a regional effort within the Richmond MMRS to conduct an analysis of capabilities and identify measures to enhance the regional medical surge response and capacity of the participating counties of Henrico, Chesterfield, Hanover, Goochland, New Kent, the City of Richmond, the affiliated health districts for these localities, and appropriate private sector partners; and

WHEREAS, at its April, 2012 meeting, the MMRS Steering Committee allocated an additional \$15,000 to this grant, for a total of \$87,000, in order to ensure that this project can move forward.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of Henrico Counly authorizes the County Manager to accept this additional funding of \$15,000, for a total of \$87,000, which does not require any local match, as a sub-grantee of the City of Richmond and as managed by the Virginia Department of Health and the Virginia Department of Emergency Management.




