MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Mr. Hazelett updated the Board on the impact of the previous day's 20-minute storm that resulted in 95,000 Henrico electricity customers losing power and caused road closures and traffic signal outages. A number of County facilities, including the Water Treatment Plant and water intake structure, relied on back-up generators for power. County buildings incurred an estimated \$10,000 in damages.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' COMMENTS

Mrs. O'Bannon pointed out that the grand re-opening of the Gayton Branch Library was held the previous evening after the storm. She shared a card and a picture each given to her by a young person in appreciation of the library's re-opening.

Mrs. O'Bannon noted the recent passing of Phillis Ladd Blackwell, a longtime resident of the County and former member of the County's Transportation Safety Commission who was very active in the eastern Henrico community.

Mr. Thornton noted the recent passing of Wesley T. Carter, a Virginia Union University alumnus and eminent educator who taught at Virginia Randolph High School.

Mr. Nelson acknowledged the Chief of Police, Fire Chief, and County Manager for doing a great job in responding to the storm and thanked them for their service and leadership.

Mr. Glover recognized Brandon Smith from Boy Scout Troop 715, sponsored by Three Chopt Presbyterian Church, who was observing the meeting.







WHEREAS, Henrico County is an entitlement community under the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") Community Development Block Grant ("CDBG") Program, as authorized by Tille 1 of the Housing and Community Development Acl of 1974, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, the County's CDBG entitlement is \$1,395,283 for Program Year Twenty-Three, and the County prepared the attached proposed sources and uses of CDBG entitlement funds for 2012-2013; and,

WHEREAS, the County is an entitlement community under the HUD Home Investment Partnership Program ("HOME") as authorized by the HOME Act of 1990, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, the County's HOME entitlement is \$612,660 for Program Year Sixteen, and the County prepared the attached proposed sources and uses of HOME funds for 2012-2013; and,

WHEREAS, \$20,654 in CDBG funds from previous years are included in the proposed use of CDBG and HOME funds in 2012-2013; and,
