> Ben Blankinship, Principal Planner, narrated a brief slide presentation on these proposed zoning and subdivision ordinance amendments regarding the extension of certain plat and POD approvals and financial guarantees for defaults on performance bonds. He noted that the amendments were made necessary by actions of the Virginia General Assembly that took effect on July 1, 2012. Mr. Blankinship summarized the provisions of House Bill 571, which addressed the extension of approvals, and Senate Bill 179, which addressed financial guarantees. He also noted the Planning Commission's previous consideration of the ordinance and recommendation for approval.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA:

1. That Section 19-28 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained as follows:

Sec. 19-28. Extension of approvals to address housing crisis.

(a) Notwithstanding the time limits for validity set out in this article, any approved subdivision plat valid and outstanding as of January 1, 20082011, shall remain valid until Juty 1, 20142017. Any other plan or permit associated with such plat extended by this subsection shall likewise be extended until July 1, 20142017.

2. That Section 19-93 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained as follows:

Sec. 19-93. Installation of improvements or bonding; release of bond.

(a) Prior to final approval of a plat for recordation, the subdivider shall complete or provide for completion of all required public improvements at the subdivider's expense. To provide for completion, the subdivider shall provide the director of planning a certified check, cash escrow, surety bond, or bank or savings and loan association's letter of credit approved by the county attorney in an amount sufficient to cover the estimated costs of all required improvements. The amount of the certified check, cash escrow, bond or letter of credit shall not exceed the estimated cost of construction based on unit prices for new public or private sector construction in the county plus a reasonable allowance for estimated administrative costs, inflation and potential damage to existing roads or utilities, which shall not exceed ten percent of the estimated construction cost. The subdivider shall obtain the director of planning's approval of its estimate of the time necessary to complete the improvements. If that time is exceeded and is not extended by the director of planning, the director of planning shall arrange for completion of the improvements using the certified check, cash escrow, or letter of credit or by calling on the surety on the bond. If the owner or developer defaults on construction of such improvements, and such improvements are constructed with funding from the certified check, cash escrow, or letter of credit, the county shall retain or collect the allowance for administrative costs to the extent the costs of such construction do not exceed the total of the originally estimated costs of construction and the allowance for administrative costs.

3. That Section 24-196 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained as follows:

Sec. 24-106. Plan of development (POD), administrative and schematic site plans.

(j) Approval and extension. Approved plans of development shall be valid for the periods provided in section 15.2-2261 of the Code of Virginia, as amended. However, any approved plan of development valid and outstanding as of January 1, 20092011 shall remain valid until July 1, 20142017. Any other plan or permit associated with such plan of development shall likewise be extended until July 1, 20142017. The extension of validity provided for approved plans of development outstanding as of January 1, 20692011 shall not be effective unless any performance






