#### MANAGER'S COMMENTS

For the 27<sup>th</sup> consecutive year, the Budget Office has prepared the *Financial Trends Monitoring* System document prior to examination of the operating budget for the subsequent fiscal year. This document provides a historical review over an 11-year period of financial and budgetary information that is combined with economic and demographic information. A majority of its indicators show evidence of the current economic downturn. These trends will be discussed as the Board begins its budget hearings the third week of March. The document also has information that is useful in analyzing where the County will go in the future. It is available online or in hard copy from the Department of Finance.

#### PUBLIC COMMENTS

She pointed to a large number of discount stores, vacant properties, and power outages as well as an absence of attractions to make eastern Henrico County inviting to professionals. Mr. Nelson offered to speak with Ms. Missouri after the meeting and to connect her with the Eastern Henrico Business Association, which has partnered with the Department of Community Revitalization and Mr. Nelson on strategies to improve the Nine Mile Road corridor. He noted that private enterprise is principally responsible for bringing new tenants to Fairfield Commons Mall.

- 3. The County Manager is authorized to execute the contract in a form approved by the County Attorney.
