MANAGER'S COMMENTS

The final phase of a one-year upgrade to the County's Oracle Financial and Human Resources Management Systems was completed a few weeks ago by a team of general government and public school employees with the help of only one consultant. Generally an organization spends millions of dollars upgrading a system of this size and complexity and hires many consultants to do the work. Most of the employees involved with this project gave up their Thanksgiving weekend to implement the initial phase of the system and during the final phase did a huge amount of work during work hours as well as on weekends. Thanks to their efforts, which should not go unnoticed, the County had a very smooth transition to Oracle Release 12. The team included employees from the Department of Information Technology, Department of Finance, Department of Human Resources, and Henrico County Public Schools.

Following the Manager's comments, Human Resources Director Paula Reid expressed pride in the team on behalf of its leaders and asked family members of the team who were in the audience to stand and be recognized for their support during this difficult process. Information Technology Director Tom Owdom, who joined Ms. Reid and members of the team at the podium, also briefly addressed the Board.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' COMMENTS

Mr. Thornton noted that the Henrico High School men's basketball team has won the first state title in the school's 51-year existence. The Henrico Warriors beat the John Marshall Justices on March 8 in the first ever Virginia High School League Group AAA Boys Basketball Championship game to feature two Central Region teams or two schools that are located within a couple of miles of one another. The Warriors went 20-2 during their regular season and were 10-0 in the post-season, winning both the District and Regional titles before taking the VHSL Group AAA State Championship. They were coached by Vance Harman, a Douglas Freeman High School graduate.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Thornton, and by unanimous vote the Board followed the recommendation of the Planning Commission and approved this item with the following proffered conditions:

1. <u>Conceptual Plan.</u> Development of the Property for a Wawa convenience store shall be in general conformance with the Conceptual Plan attached hereto entitled "Wawa Brookland District Henrico County, VA. Conceptual Plan" prepared by E.D. Lewis & Associates P.C., dated December 6, 2012 (the "Conceptual Plan"), (see case file), which Conceptual Plan is conceptual in nature and may vary in detail, unless otherwise requested and specifically approved at the time of Plan of Development.

2. <u>Elevations.</u> Development of the Property for a Wawa convenience store shall be in general conformance with the architectural appearance shown on the elevations attached hereto entitled (i) "Proposed Wawa, Staples Mills and Bethlehem Roads, Brookland District, Henrico County, Virginia" prepared by LMA Architects LLC, dated May 30, 2012 and (ii) "Proposed Wawa, Staples Mills and Bethlehem Roads, Brookland District, Henrico County, Virginia, Canopy Elevations" prepared by LMA Architects LLC, dated May 30, 2012 (see case file), unless otherwise requested and specifically approved at the time of Plan of Development

...

- 3. Exterior Materials/Architecture. The exposed portion of each exterior wall surface (front, rear and sides) of any building (excluding rooftop screening materials for mechanical equipment) shall be similar to the exposed portions of other exterior walls of such building in architectural treatment and materials. Any building shall have exposed exterior walls (above finished grade and exclusive of trim) of brick, glass, stone, stone veneer, split face block, architectural-grade metal panels, or a combination of the foregoing, unless different architectural treatment and/or materials are specifically approved with respect to the exposed portion of any such wall, at the time of Plan of Development. No building shall be covered with or have exposed to view any painted or unfinished concrete block, or industrial-grade metal, unless otherwise specifically approved at the time of Plan of Development.
- 4. <u>Parking Lot Lighting.</u> Lighting shall be directed to minimize glare on public roads and adjacent properties. Direct embedded light poles and standards shall be prohibited. Any lighting over any fuel pumps shall be recessed, flat lens fixtures.
- 5. **Prohibited Uses.** The following uses shall be prohibited:
 - a. billiard, bagatelle, video game or a bingo parlor;
 - b. flea markets or antique auctions;
 - c. billboards;
 - d. recycling facilities;
 - e. funeral homes, mortuaries, crematories and/or undertaking establishments;
 - f. dance halls;
 - g. truck stops;
 - h. gun shop, sales and repair;
 - i. parking garages or commercial parking lots as a principal use;
 - j. sign painting shops;

- k. free-standing communication towers;
- 1. car title loan operations;
- m. adult businesses as defined by Section 24-3 of the Henrico County Code;
- n. establishments whose primary business is check cashing and/or the making of payday loans as defined and regulated by Sections 6.2-2100 et seq. and 6.2-1800 et seq. of the Code of Virginia (the foregoing shall not preclude banks, savings and loans or similar financial institutions that are not regulated by the foregoing Virginia Code sections); and
- o. bars, which, for purposes of this restriction, shall mean a business establishment whose primary business is the sale of alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption. This restriction shall not prohibit the sale of alcoholic beverages in restaurants as licensed by the Virginia Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control.
- 6. Refuse Containers/Trash Receptacles/Recycling Activities. Dumpsters, trash receptacles, not including convenience cans, and recycling receptacles shall be screened from public view with masonry enclosures compatible with the architectural design of the building at ground level at the Property lines as approved at the time of Plan of Development. The gates and doors on the masonry refuse screens shall be of a substantial and durable material as determined at the time of Plan of Development. Support posts, gate frames, hinges and latches shall be of a sufficient size and strength to allow the gates to function without sagging or becoming a visual evesore as determined at the time of Plan of Development. Landscaping shall be provided to mitigate the visual impact of the dumpster pad as shown on the Conceptual Plan as determined at the time of Landscape Plan. Convenience cans shall be within or part of a decorative container.
- 7. <u>Mechanical Equipment.</u> Mechanical equipment shall be screened from public view at ground level at Property lines as approved at the time of Plan of Development.
- 8. <u>Severance.</u> The unenforceability, elimination, revision or amendment of any proffer set forth herein, in whole or in part, shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the other proffers or the unaffected part of any such proffer.
- 9. Outside Speakers. Any music being played over any outside speaker system shall be prohibited from 10:00 p.m. until 7:00 a.m.

- 10. <u>Underground Utilities.</u> All utility lines on the Property shall be underground, except for junction boxes, meters, gas meters, traffic control, irrigation backflow preventers, existing and/or relocated existing overhead utility lines and lines in wetland areas. Electrical junction boxes and meters shall be screened from public view at ground level at the perimeter of the tract with use of a wall, fencing, landscaping, or such other method as may be approved at the time of Plan of Development and/or subdivision review.
- 11. <u>Best Management Practice.</u> Any Best Management Practice structures shall be located underground.
- 12. Landscaping. Landscaping measures such as the continuous hedge along the roadways, street trees and internal trees as shown on the Conceptual Plan (see case file), shall be provided as determined at the time of Landscape Plan, unless otherwise requested and specifically approved at the time of Landscape Plan.
- 13. <u>Outside Storage</u>. Except for ice coolers, no merchandise shall be displayed or stored outside of the building or on sidewalks.

GGC Associates, LLC: Request for a Provisional Use Permit under Sections 24-58.2(a), 24-120 and 24-122.1 of Chapter 24 of the County Code in order to allow 24 hour operation of a proposed convenience store with fuel pumps (Wawa) on Parcels 774-740-7574, -7856, -8236, and -8370 located in the southeast quadrant of the intersection of Staples Mill Road (U. S. Route 33) and Bethlehem Road.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Nelson, and by unanimous vote, the Board followed the recommendation of the Planning Commission and approved this item with the following conditions:

- 1. This permit shall only apply to the 24-hour operation of a Wawa convenience store with fuel sales, and it shall not be transferable to any other operator or owner.
- 2. The installation of pay phones on site shall be prohibited.

- 3. Any outside speakers and/or sound system shall comply with the following standards:
 - a) Sound systems shall be equipped with controls that permit full and complete volume control; and
 - b) Sound(s) emitted from the system shall not be audible beyond a distance of one hundred (100) feet measured from the source.
- 4. Prior to 24-hour operation, the applicant and the Crime Prevention Unit of the Division of Police shall conduct a security survey of the property and store operations. The owner/occupant of the Wawa shall implement the mutually agreed upon security measures affecting the property.
- 5. The owner or operator shall be responsible for the installation, operation, and maintenance of exterior security camera(s) and video system of professional grade and quality, and rated for the exterior surveillance of retail operations. This security system shall at a minimum include:
 - a) Exterior surveillance cameras shall monitor all entrance(s), fueling area(s), parking area(s), delivery area(s), and other areas determined necessary by the Crime Prevention Unit of the Division of Police. Such security cameras shall provide clear imagery of the establishment's patrons and their vehicles.
 - b) Recordings of all activities under surveillance shall be preserved for a period of four (4) months by the applicant or owner/operator. Authorized representatives of the Henrico County Division of Police shall have full and complete access to all recordings upon request.
- 6. Store windows shall not be tinted or obscured by advertisements, posters, blinds, and/or visual obstructions that inhibit or hinder exterior surveillance. The installation and use of light blocking devices during daylight hours shall be permissible if approved by the Crime Prevention Unit of the Division of Police.
- 7. The owner or operator shall provide adequate lighting for the entrances, exits, and parking areas serving the use or location. "Adequate lighting" means lighting sufficient for clear, visual and security camera surveillance.

- 8. The owner or operator shall not permit loitering on the premises during hours of operation.
- 9. Should evidence (i.e. police calls to the premises, complaints from other businesses, criminal assaults, etc.) or registered complaints (i.e. increased public nuisance, loitering, excessive noise, etc.) indicate that 24-hour exterior operation is having adverse effects on the area, the Board of Supervisors may hold a public hearing to consider revoking the PUP, or amending all or some conditions.

Chipotle Mexican Grill, Inc.: Request for a Provisional Use Permit under Sections 24-58.2(d), 24-120 and 24-122.1 of Chapter 24 of the County Code in order to allow outdoor dining for a proposed restaurant (Chipotle) on Parcel 769-757-0921 located on the north line of Staples Mill Road (U.S. Route 33) approximately 965' northwest of its intersection with Old Staples Mill Road.

Jean Moore, Assistant Director of Planning, responded to questions from Mr. Glover.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this item.

- 1. The outdoor dining area shall not be in operation between 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m.
- 2. There shall be no use of outdoor speakers.
- 3. The operator shall not permit food preparation outside the enclosed building.
- 4. The wall/fence enclosing the outdoor dining area shall be limited in height to 36 inches.

- 5. Outdoor lighting fixtures shall complement the style of the building. Lighting fixtures shall not produce glare for motorists or pedestrians on the adjacent rights-of-way and parking areas and shall illuminate only the outdoor dining area.
- 6. Access to the outdoor dining area shall be available only through the interior of the restaurant, except during an emergency when the patio fence exit gate may be utilized.
- 7. This permit shall apply only to Chipotle, is non-transferrable, and shall not apply to any other business in the Staples Mill-Square Shopping Center.
- 8. The outdoor dining area shall comply with proffered conditions of rezoning case C-77C-94.
- 9. Trash receptacles shall be provided and properly serviced to control litter generated by this use.
- 10. Outdoor dining furniture, fencing, and canopies shall be of durable material and complementary to exterior features of the building.
- 11. The outdoor dining area shall be constructed in general conformance with the layouts and images depicted in Exhibits A G (see case file).
- 12. Televisions and other video display devices shall not be allowed in the outdoor dining area.
- 13. Prior to operation, the applicant shall consult with the Special Services Unit within the Division of Police to discuss crime prevention recommendations and conduct a security survey of the property and restaurant operations. The applicant shall implement mutually agreed upon security recommendations resulting from this review.
- 14. Stand-alone heating sources shall not be used within the outdoor dining area. If provided, any exterior heat shall be from a wall-mounted, non-flame heat source or similar method as approved by the Director of Planning.

William Spencer, a resident of the Three Chopt District, pointed out that his son has been with the Virginia State Police for more than 27 years at the main headquarters and commented on the sadness of Master Trooper Walker's death. He offered prayers for the County's Division of Police and praised the County's Division of Fire and its public libraries. Mr. Spencer also offered personal reminiscences and complimented the County on how it is run.

GENERAL AGENDA

62-13 Resolution – Receipt of Operating and Capital Budget Estimates for Fiscal Year 2013-14 and Notice of Public Hearings on the Budget and Proposed Tax Rates.

> Mr. Vithoulkas narrated a slide presentation titled Introduction of the FY14 Manager's Proposed Annual Fiscal Plan. He began his presentation by noting that Henrico County will face unprecedented financial challenges in the next two years, especially in the area of schools. The FY14 proposed budget is balanced within the County's existing real estate tax rate, which has not been increased in the past 35 years. After closing an \$18.5 million budget gap within the real estate tax rate, the County has now cut more than

\$115 in four years. Both schools and general government have experienced difficult expenditure cuts and will require additional cuts in FY15 without additional revenue sources. Across-the-board cuts have been made in both schools and general government departments in addition to a number of targeted cuts and structural fee increases where fees should cover the cost of services provided. The County is facing fixed cost increases on nearly \$33 million in next year's budget, of which nearly \$21 million is attributable to education. The FY14 proposed \$1.1 billion budget represents a nine percent reduction from the FY13 budget and is the lowest since FY08. The FY14 proposed capital budget represents a smaller capital budget than 52 years ago. Every dollar of incremental appropriation in the proposed General Fund \$11.9 million increase can be found in two areas, education and public safety, which represents the Board's highest priorities.

During his presentation, Mr. Vithoulkas elaborated on the fixed cost and necessary structural additions for the FY14 proposed budget; pointed out the addition of ten police officers and nine firefighter positions that required the elimination of 19 positions from other departments; provided examples of budget reductions; and noted that many conversations with the County's residents and business will be forthcoming to discuss the consideration of an alternate revenue source, i.e. a meals tax, which is present in 203 other localities in the Commonwealth and would be dedicated to education. He concluded his presentation by sharing the budget calendar, which will begin with the in-depth legislative budget reviews on March 18, and by thanking the Deputy County Managers, department heads, and employees who helped him craft a plan that is balanced within existing tax rates and does not resort to employee layoffs.

Mr. Kaechele thanked Mr. Vithoulkas and the staff for presenting the budget and reiterated that the Board would be spending the entire next week deliberating on the budget. Mr. Vithoulkas responded to questions from Mr. Glover and Mr. Nelson regarding the County's budgetary challenges and from Mrs. O'Bannon pertaining to the status of new legislation that will increase the road maintenance funds the County receives from the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT). Mr. Glover expressed concerns about state mandates passed by the General Assembly that have substantially increased the County's costs of participating in the Virginia Retirement System (VRS) and financially penalized County employees. Mr. Nelson pointed out that County departments have absorbed multi-year reductions and the County will have to either cut services tremendously next year or find additional revenue. Mr. Glover thanked staff for their hard work on the budget.

WHEREAS, the National Multiple Sclerosis Society is observing the second week of March as National Multiple Sclerosis Week to inform citizens about the disease; its diagnosis, treatment, and management; the need for research; and advances leading to a cure.

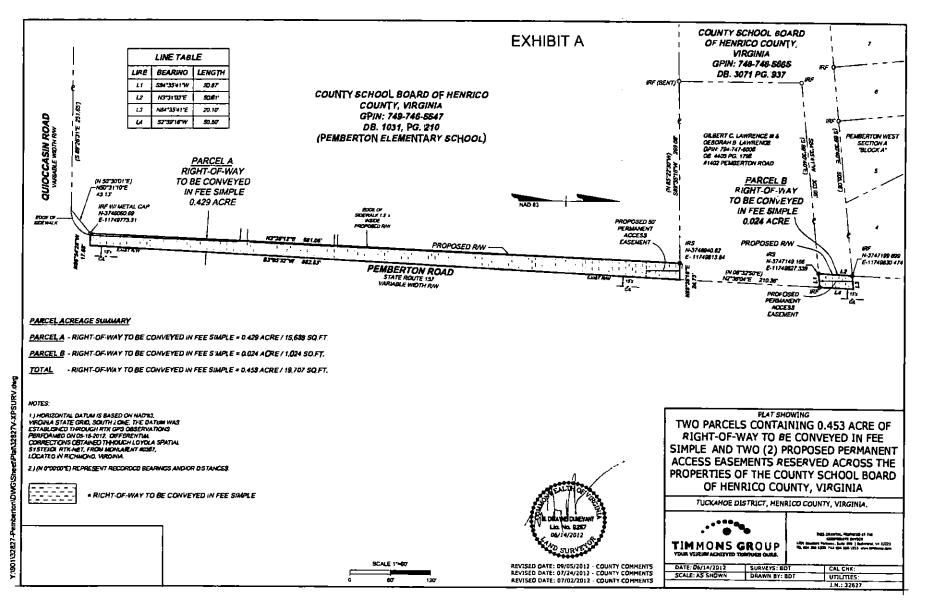

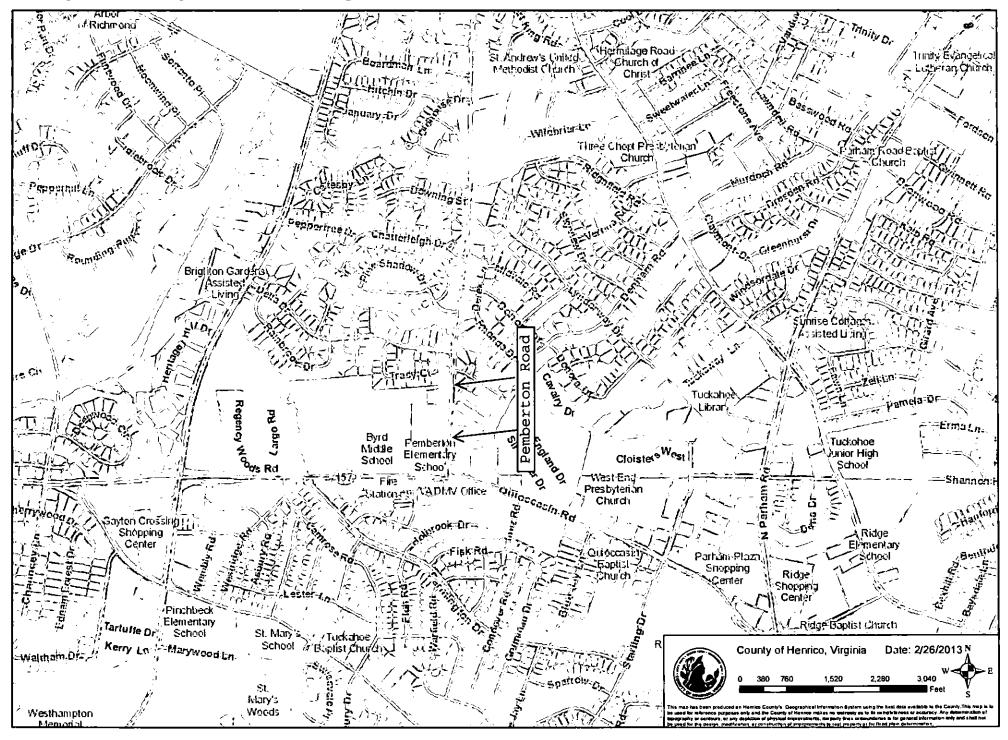

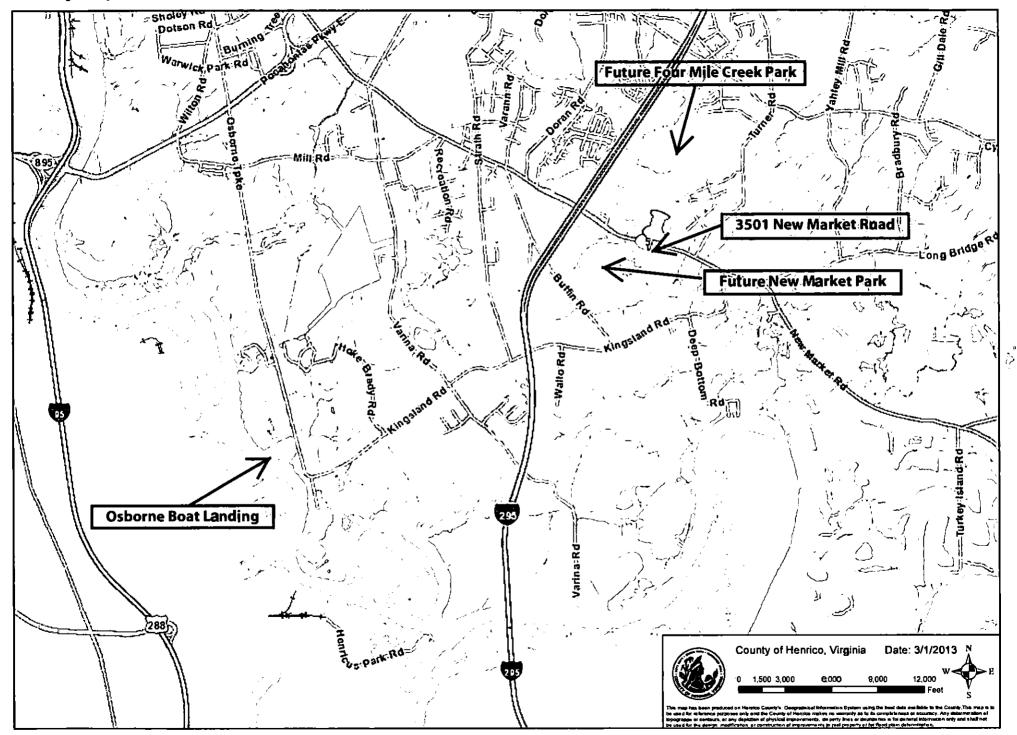
