MANAGER'S COMMENTS

For the second consecutive year, Henrico County Television (HCTV) has been named the third best overall government television station in the country, trailing only San Diego, California, and Seattle, Washington — stations serving major metropolitan areas. The National Association of Telecommunications Officers and Advisors (NATOA) recognized HCTV for "Overall Programming Excellence," a category NATOA deems to be of "special significance." In this category, judges evaluate the variety of programming; technical elements, including video quality, audio, lighting, and graphics; and the overall impression of the station. Mr. Vithoulkas congratulated Public Relations & Media Services Director Tam McKinney, Media Services Manager Ben Sheppard, and the Department of Public Relations & Media Services for this outstanding achievement and for putting Henrico County in the national spotlight.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' COMMENTS

Mr. Kaechele pointed out an area of positive economic growth in the County. Enplanements at Richmond International Airport were up 7.5 percent in September compared with the same month last year and are up 4.4 percent for the calendar year to date compared with 2013.

Mrs. O'Bannon noted the passing of Henrico resident Mary Frances Warden Lambert on October 10 at the age of 102. Mrs. Lambert and her husband were known for their catering business, which was established in 1950, and were the official caterers for the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts, the Richmond Academy of Medicine, and several Virginia governors at the Virginia Executive Mansion. The Lamberts hired their children's college friends, to help them buy books and have spending money, and mentored many young people in the catering arts. Mrs. Lambert's name has been entered into the County's list of historic Henricoans.

Ayasha Sledge, VUU's Visual Design Specialist, was in the audience taking photographs. Mr.

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Vithoulkas recognized VUU graduates Necea Montague and Rylanda Thornton, both of whom are now working full-time as Henrico Sheriff's Office Deputies. He also recognized VUU students Rashinda Barnes, Kaylin King, and Charles Sheets, all of whom are graduates of the Sheriff's Office Summer Academy and currently working part-time as Henrico Sheriff's Deputies. Mr. Vithoulkas announced the County has established a new partnership with VUU that will provide internships and stipends to ten VUU students. The first intern hired under this program will join the Division of Police on January 26.

Steve Yob, Director of Public Works, narrated a slide presentation on this item and responded to questions from Mr. Kaechele.

Reginald Brown, a Dabbs House Road resident who would be affected by the proposed road improvements, expressed concern that a planned increase in the speed limit on a section of the road adjoining his property would make it less safe for him to cross the road to access his mailbox. He also voiced concern the proposed alignment would only take property from his side of the road, which would potentially result in existing utility poles being moved further into his property. In response to questions from Mr. Nelson, Mr. Brown clarified he did not have problems with the County improving Dabbs House Road. There was discussion by Mr. Nelson, Mr. Yob, Mr. Vitoulkas, Mr. Glover, and Mr. Kaechele pertaining to the proposed design of the road realignment, the planned speed limit increase, and the safety of the existing road alignment. Mr. Yob noted he will be happy to work with Mr. Brown on the concerns relating to Mr. Brown's utilities and mailbox, and Mr. Nelson assured Mr. Brown the County will continue its dialogue with him on these concerns.



WHEREAS, the Clerk of the Board has given notice of the public hearing as required by Section 33.1-233 of the Code of Virginia; and,


WHEREAS, the Board held the public hearing on September 23, 2014, at which time all owners and other interested citizens were given an opportunity to be heard; and,

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AN ORDINANCE to amend and reordain Section 11-20 of the Code of the County of Henrico titled "Possession, sale, storage or use of fireworks prohibited" to remove references to a section of the Virginia Statewide Fire Prevention Code

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA:

1. That Section 11-20 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained as follows:

Sec. 11-20. Possession, sale, storage or use of fireworks prohibited.

(a) This section is adopted pursuant to authority granted localities by Code of Virginia, § 27-97, and Virginia Statewide Fire Prevention Code section 101.5 to adopt fire prevention regulations that are more restrictive than the Virginia Statewide Fire Prevention Code.

(b) No person shall store, possess, offer for sale, expose for sale, sell at retail or use or explode any fireworks, as that term is defined in <u>the</u> Virginia Statewide Fire Prevention Code section 3302.1, except that a person may conduct a supervised public display of fireworks pursuant to a permit granted by the fire marshal.

(c) Applications for permits shall be made in writing at least 60 days before the date of the supervised public display of fireworks. The sale, possession, discharge and distribution of fireworks for such display shall be lawful only under the terms and conditions and for the purpose set forth in the permit. A permit shall not be transferable nor extend beyond the date or dates set forth therein.

(d) For purposes of this section, the term "fireworks" shall include "permissible fireworks" as that term is defined in <u>the</u> Virginia Statewide Fire Prevention Code section 3302.1.

(e) For purposes of this section, "fireworks" shall not include automobile flares, paper caps containing not more than an average of 0.25 grams (16 mg) of explosive content per cap, or any toy pistols, toy canes, toy guns, and other devices using such caps.

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2. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect on and after its passage.


