#### PUBLIC HEARING – REZONING CASES AND PROVISIONAL USE PERMIT

320-14 REZ2014-00048 Tuckahoe Bickford Senior Living: Request to conditionally rezone from R-0C One-Family Residence District (Conditional) to R-6C General Residence District (Conditional) Parcel 737-750-7485 containing 7.58 acres located on the southwest line of Ridgefield Green Drive between John Rolfe and Ridgefield Parkways.

Mrs. O'Bannon's asked that this item be moved up on the agenda because the applicant had requested a deferral. No one from the public spoke in opposition to a deferral of this item.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Glover, and by unanimous vote, the Board deferred this item to the March 10, 2015, meeting.

36-15 REZ2014-00049 Tuckahoe Hanky, LLC: Request to conditionally rezone from A-1 Agricultural District to B-2C Business District (Conditional) Parcel 750-755-0814 containing 3.65 acres located on the northeast line of Three Chopt Road approximately 420' north of its intersection with Gaskins Road.

Mr. Vithoulkas noted this item and Agenda Item No. 37-15 (PUP2014-00018) were companion cases and with the Board's indulgence would be presented and heard at the same time.

Joe Emerson, Director of Planning, and Mike Jennings, Assistant Director of Public Works, responded to questions from Mrs. O'Bannon and Mr. Kaechele.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to these items.

Mrs. O'Bannon remarked that this zoning case had been well-vetted and that Tuckahoe District Planning Commissioner Bonnie Leigh-Jones had done a terrific job of going over many details. She commented on the attractiveness of the proposed structure and stated that this case will take the County's Comprehensive Plan a step better even though it does not completely fit the plan.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Kaechele, and by unanimous vote, the Board followed the recommendation of the Planning Commission and approved this item with the following proffered conditions:

- 1. <u>Permitted Uses</u>. The only uses permitted on the Property shall be a fully enclosed self-storage facility with an accessory office and such uses as are customarily accessory and incidental thereto, and any principal use permitted in the O-1 district.
- 2. <u>Site Plan</u>. The site will be developed similar to the attached concept plan, entitled Exhibit A (see case file), unless otherwise requested and specifically approved by the Planning Commission at the time of Plan of Development or subdivision approval.
- Architecture. The building elevations for Building A and B as shown on Exhibit A (see case file), shall be in substantial conformity to the architectural rendering labeled Exhibit B (see case file). The building elevations for Building C shall be substantially similar to the existing office building on GPIN 750-754-0386, as approved by the Planning Commission at the time of Plan of Development review.
- 4. Exterior Materials. The portions of all exterior wall surfaces of each building constructed on the Property shall include full standard brick or full standard brick and glass, with architectural treatments, to

match Exhibit B (see case file), as approved by the Planning. Commission at the time of Plan of Development review.

#### 5. Buffers.

- a. Three Chopt Road: A landscape buffer a minimum of fifty (50) feet in width shall be provided along the eastern right-of-way line of Three Chopt Road, as measured from the ultimate right-of-way line, and shall meet the County of Henrico Transitional Buffer Fifty (50) standards.
- b. Interstate 64 and Gaskins Road: A buffer a minimum of twenty-five (25) feet in width shall be provided along the parcel's frontage with the western right-of-way line of Interstate 64 and the western right-of-way line of Gaskins Road, except in the area of the fire lane, which may be landscaped and/or retain existing vegetation as determined at the time of Plan of Development. Dead and diseased trees within the buffer shall be removed and replaced.
- c. Transitional buffers: A buffer a minimum of twenty-five (25) feet in width shall be provided along the northern line of the property along GPIN 749-755-4576 and along the southern line of the property along GPIN 750-754-0386 and shall be supplemented to create a vegetated screen that meets the County of Henrico Transitional Buffer Twenty-Five (25) standards.
- 6. Outside Storage. Outside storage shall not be permitted.
- 7. Hours of Operation. The business hours of operation shall be limited to 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.
- 8. Exterior Lighting. Lighting fixtures shall not exceed twenty (20) feet in height as measured from the grade at the base of the lighting standard, unless otherwise requested, and specifically approved at the time of Plan of Development. Lighting shall be directed to minimize glare on public roads and adjacent properties.
- 9. <u>HVAC Screening.</u> Any heating, ventilation and air conditioning equipment and any utility meters shall be screened from public view at ground level at the perimeter of the Property with use of landscaping, a wall or other architectural feature similar to the exterior of the building on which it is located, or such other method as may be approved at the time of Plan of Development.
- 10. <u>Trash Receptacles.</u> Dumpster enclosures and trash receptacles, not including convenience cans and recycling receptacles, shall be constructed of finished masonry materials similar to the building (with the exception of gates and doors) where such dumpsters are not

already screened or enclosed by a building, structure, or wall. Gates and doors shall be opaque, sturdy, and minimize visibility from public right-of-way. Support posts, gate frames, hinges and latches shall be of a sufficient size and strength to allow the gates to function without sagging or becoming a visual eyesore, as determined at the time of Plan of Development.

- 11. Right-of-Way Dedication and Sidewalks. A Henrico County standard sidewalk shall be installed along the property frontage along Three Chopt Road. Upon the request of the County, the Owner shall dedicate additional right-of-way on Three Chopt Road to accommodate widening to the ultimate right-of-way width and for sidewalks. Should the dedicated property not be utilized within thirty (30) years of the date of the dedication, title to the dedicated property will revert to the property owner or its successors in interest.
- 12. <u>Underground Utilities.</u> Except for junction boxes, meters and existing overhead utility lines or for technical or environmental reason, all new utility lines shall be underground.
- 13. Parking of Trucks. Any trucks owned by the operator or owner of the fully enclosed self-storage facility and used for the convenience of its occupants shall be parked in the truck spaces designated on Exhibit A (see case file), when not in use. A ten (10) foot high brick screen wall, constructed of finished masonry materials similar to the building, shall connect between Building A and Building B at the rear of the truck parking spaces.
- 14. <u>Security Alarms.</u> Outside speakers shall be prohibited. No external alarm bells or external warning devices that are audible beyond the boundary lines of the Property shall be permitted on the Property.
- 15. Signage. Detached signage shall be monument style, the base of which shall be of a material consistent with that on the building, shall be landscaped, and shall be limited in height to six (6) feet, to match Exhibit C (see case file). Any external lighting shall be screened pursuant to a lighting plan approved by the County. Attached building signage shall be prohibited along the parcel's frontage with the western right-of-way line of Interstate 64 and the western right-of-way line of Gaskins Road. Changeable message signs, portable or mobile signs, and inflatable or other attention getting devices shall be prohibited.
- 16. <u>BMPs/Retention Ponds.</u> Any retention ponds or BMP facilities on the Property shall be maintained in accordance with all applicable law, rules and regulations and any wet pond shall be aerated.

- 17. Construction Activities. Exterior construction activities shall be restricted to the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Monday through Friday and 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Saturday with no construction activities on Sunday. During construction, a sign shall be posted on site in English and Spanish listing the hours of construction activity.
- 18. <u>Severance.</u> The unenforceability, elimination, revision or amendment of any proffer set forth herein, in whole or in part, shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the other proffers or the unaffected part of any such proffer.

37-15 PUP2014-00018 Tuckahoe Hanky, LLC: Request for a Provisional Use Permit under Sections 24-58.2(b), 24-120 and 24-122.1 of Chapter 24 of the County Code in order to allow a self-service storage facility on part of Parcel 750-755-0814 located on the northeast line of Three Chopt Road approximately 420' north of its intersection with Gaskins Road.

Mrs. O'Bannon pointed out there are at least two other facilities of this type in the Tuckahoe District so this case is not precedent-setting.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Kaechele, and by unanimous vote, the Board followed the recommendation of the Planning Commission and approved this item subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The exterior appearance of the buildings shall be in substantial conformance with the elevations titled "Ample Storage Henrico Three Chopt Rd" by Roughton, Nickelson, Deluca Architects (see case file) unless otherwise approved by the Planning Commission at the time of Plan of Development (POD).
- 2. Exterior building materials shall consist of full standard brick with tan accents and soldier courses, glass, dryvit and metal roofing as shown on the elevations submitted with this case and referenced in Condition #1 (see case file) unless otherwise approved by the Planning Commission at the time of POD.
- 3. Development of the property shall be in substantial conformance with the concept plan titled "Concept Plan of GPIN 750-755-0814" prepared by The Bay Companies (see case file), unless otherwise approved by the Planning Commission at the time of POD.

- 4. A Landscape Plan shall be submitted to the Planning Commission for review and approval.
- 5. Changeable message signs, portable or mobile signs and inflatable or other attention getting devices shall be prohibited.
- 6. All exterior lighting shall be produced from concealed sources and shall be reduced to no more than a security level following the close of business operations.
- 7. Any heating, ventilation, and air conditioning equipment shall be screened from public view at ground level at the Property lines with a wall or other architectural feature similar to the exterior of the buildings or as approved by the Planning Commission at the time of POD.
- 8. Outside speakers shall be prohibited. No external alarm bells or external warning devices that are audible beyond the boundary lines of the Property shall be permitted on the Property.
- 9. Dumpster enclosures and trash receptacles, not including convenience cans and recycling receptacles, shall be constructed of finished masonry materials (with the exception of gates and doors). Gates and doors shall be opaque and sturdy as determined at the time of POD.
- 10. Trash pickup from the Property shall be limited to the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday and there shall be no trash pickup on Saturday and Sunday.
- 11. Any retention ponds or BMP facilities on the Property shall be maintained in accordance with all applicable laws, rules and regulations and any wet pond shall be aerated.
- 12. Except for junction boxes, meters and existing overhead utility lines or for technical or environmental reasons, all new utility lines shall be underground.
- 13. Any trucks owned by the operator or owner of the self-service storage facility and used for the convenience of its occupants shall be parked within the designated area of the site when not in use. A 10 foot high brick screen wall shall be constructed to shield the trucks from view from adjacent properties.
- 14. Outside storage shall not be permitted.

15. Prior to operation the applicant and the Crime Prevention Unit of the Division of Police shall conduct a security survey of the property. The applicant shall implement the mutually agreed upon security recommendations affecting the property.

Mr. Vithoulkas asked that the Board add an item to the agenda numbered 47-15 and move forward an item from the general agenda numbered 45-15. He explained this request was in response to multiple phone calls and e-mails that had come from the Elko community regarding an increased volume of heavy truck traffic on White Oak Road between Route 60 and Elko Road. Much of this traffic was due to the Lumber Liquidators location in White Oak Technology Park and in defiance of conditions in the Plan of Development accompanying that development. The emergency ordinance would allow the County's Police Division to begin ticketing unauthorized tractor trailers on White Oak Road.

On motion of Mr. Nelson, seconded by Mrs. O'Bannon, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved adding to the agenda an item numbered 47-15 and titled "Emergency Ordinance - To Amend and Reordain Subsection (d) of Section 22-126 of the Code of the County of Henrico Titled "Weight limits for specific streets" to Restrict Through Truck Traffic on White Oak Road - Varina District" – see attached emergency ordinance.

Doug Middleton, Chief of Police, commented on the purpose of the emergency ordinance and responded to a question from Mr. Kaechele. Mr. Nelson thanked Mr. Vithoulkas, Chief Middleton, Mr. Foster, and Public Works Director Steve Yob and his staff for working closely with him on this matter. He elaborated on actions taken by the County during the past 30 days to address the problem, including the installation of signage, and the need for the Board to move quickly on the proposed ordinance.

On motion of Mr. Nelson, seconded by Mrs. O'Bannon, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item - see attached emergency ordinance.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Stewart Goodwin, a resident of the Varina District, expressed appreciation to the Board for passing an emergency ordinance to restrict through traffic on White Oak Road, cited problems she has encountered with truck traffic on this road, and suggested that truckers are being misdirected to White Oak Road because "White Oak" is included in the name of several roads within a one-mile area of the County. Mr. Vithoulkas, Mr. Nelson, and Chief Middleton responded to a question from Mr. Kaechele regarding the County's policy for warning errant drivers and the Police Division's discretion in issuing tickets.

Jake Ferro from Boy Scout Troop 735 asked for clarification of the proper truck route from Route 60 to Elko Road.






