
WHEREAS, the owner, Monument Square, LLC, has requested the County release its interest in the unneeded portion of the utility easement; and,

# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF HENRICO, VIRGINIA AND THE CAPITAL REGION AIRPORT COMMISSION

### I. PARTIES TO THE AGREEMENT

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is between the County of Henrico, Virginia (the "County") and the Capital Region Airport Commission (the "Commission").

### II. PURPOSE

To allow the County access to certain property owned by the Commission upon which is currently located six baseball fields, access roads and parking areas (the "Facilities") for the purpose of maintaining the physical environment of the Facilities for use by the Sandston Youth Association.

### III. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE COUNTY

A. During the term of this MOU, the County agrees to be responsible for the performance and cost of all necessary and prudent maintenance of the Facilities as deemed necessary by the County, provided the Facilities are being utilized by the Sandston Youth Association. The County will also provide portable lavatory facilities, dumpsters, and trash cans.

B. The normal general maintenance schedule for the Facilities will be:

Mowing Weekly/mid-

Weekly/mid-March-November, weather permitting Trash pick-up weekly or based on usage during baseball

season;

Routine Grading Baseball fields annually

### IV. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE COMMISSION

Subject to the requirements of federal law including, but not limited to, grant assurances under 49 U.S.C. § 47107, the Commission agrees to allow the County access to the Facilities for the purpose of maintaining the physical environment of the Facilities as set out in section III.

### V. TERMS OF MOU

Custodial

A. NON LIABILITY OF THE COMMISSION: The Commission shall have no liability for the actions of County employees, contractors or agents while on Commission property or for any injuries or damages sustained by such individuals in the performance of their duties under this MOU.

- B. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW: While performing their duties under this MOU on Commission property, County employees, contractors, and agents shall be subject to all applicable federal, state and local laws and ordinances including, but not limited to, the Rules and Regulations of the Capital Region Airport Commission as the same may be amended from time to time.
- C. APPLICABLE LAWS AND COURTS: The interpretation and enforcement of this MOU shall be governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia and any litigation with respect thereto shall be brought in the courts of the County of Henrico.
- D. TERMINATION AND MODIFICATION: Either the County or the Commission may terminate this MOU upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other. The County or the Commission may agree in writing to modify the terms of the MOU.
- E. TERM: This MOU shall be effective February 15, 2015 (or when executed) and shall continue for a period of ten (10) years until February 15, 2025 unless earlier terminated by one or both parties as provided above.
- F. ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS: This MOU is subject to annual appropriations by the County of Henrico, Board of Supervisors. This MOU shall be terminated if the County of Henrico, Board of Supervisors does not appropriate funds for this MOU or if existing funds are exhausted.
- G. THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARY: This MOU shall not confer any benefit or right upon any person other than the County and the Commission, and no third party shall be entitled to enforce any obligation of this MOU.



WHEREAS, on January 25, 2005, the Board approved a contract with Earth Tech (now known as AECOM) for a total fixed lump sum fee of \$1,495,047.68 for the preparation of design and construction plans for Three Chopt Road from Barrington Hills Drive to 1,000 feet east of Gaskins Road (approximately 2.05 miles); and,

WHEREAS, on June 10, 2008, the Board approved a contract amendment for a total fixed lump sum fee of \$196,789.70 to extend the western boundary of the project approximately 1,245 feet to its new western terminus approximately 1,055 feet west of Barrington Hills Drive to better transition into existing improvements; and,

WHEREAS, on July 27, 2010, the Board approved a contract amendment for a total fixed lump sum fee of \$137,325.01 to incorporate site and utility improvements due to private development along the corridor, to conduct hydraulic studies of the Stoney Run tributary crossing that were not required at time of the original contract, and to collect additional pavement cores to better evaluate the structural integrity of existing pavement; and,

WHEREAS, on February 13, 2013, the Board approved a contract amendment for a total fixed lump sum fee of \$52,771.66 to conduct additional work required to comply with new VDOT noise study regulations; and,

WHEREAS, additional work is required to comply with federal and state requirements not included in the original 2005 scope of work, to add sidewalk along both sides of the roadway, to add a right turn lane onto Cedarfield Parkway, to add conduit for future fiber communication facilities, to coordinate with adjacent development plans, and to prepare plats for right-of-way acquisitions; and,

WHEREAS, AECOM and the Department of Public Works have negotiated a fixed lump sum fee of \$387,963.15 for the additional design work, bringing the total design expenditures to \$2,269,897.20.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors approves an amendment to the contract with AECOM for additional engineering design services for Three Chopt Road for an additional total fixed lump sum amount of \$387,963.15.






