MANAGER'S COMMENTS

The County of Henrico has been awarded the highest possible rating from the Insurance Services Office (ISO), the organization most insurance companies rely upon when deciding what to charge homeowners and businesses for fire insurance coverage. The ISO independently evaluates municipal fire protection efforts in more than 47,000 communities throughout the United States. The Class 1 rating received by the County has been achieved by only 130 fire departments nationwide and three others within Virginia. Henrico is now the only county in the nation with both an accredited fire department and the Class 1 ISO rating. This outstanding news comes about as a result of a deliberate, concerted, and coordinated effort by the County's Division of Fire, Police Division Emergency Communications Center, and Department of Public Utilities to ensure the absolute best level of public safety and fire protection for Henrico residents and businesses. Mr. Vithoulkas clarified for Mrs. O'Bannon the new rating is effective November 1 and the County will do everything it can to notify residents and businesses of this change. Mrs. O'Bannon suggested residents and businesses call their insurance agent at that time and ask what kind of discount they will be receiving on their homeowners insurance rate.

Mr. Glover has long been an enthusiastic supporter of youth athletics in the Brookland District and has been instrumental in helping ensure all of the children in Henrico County have superior facilities in which to compete. He was an advocate for sports tourism before it became such a well-coordinated activity.

191-15ME Nuckols, LLC: Request to conditionally rezone from A-1 AgriculturalREZ2015-District to B-3C Business District (Conditional) part of Parcel 733-764-000214118 containing 1.68 acres located between the south line of W. BroadThree ChoptStreet (U.S. Route 250) and the north line of Graham Meadows Drive
approximately 385' west of N. Gayton Road.

Joe Emerson, Director of Planning, responded to questions from Mr. Kaechele.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this case.

On motion of Mr. Kaechele, seconded by Mr. Glover, and by unanimous vote, the Board followed the recommendation of the Planning Commission and approved this item with the following proffered conditions:

- 1. <u>Use.</u> The Property shall only be used for retail horticultural uses, including all of the products, services and activities associated with a florist, greenhouse and garden center operation, and for a non-exclusive access road in common with the property to the west.
- 2. <u>Signage.</u> No detached signage shall be permitted on the Property other than directional signage.
- 3. <u>Hours of Operation.</u> Hours of service to the general public will be from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Seasonally, during the months of December, March, April and May, hours may be extended from 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. These restrictions shall not be applicable to the use of the non-exclusive access road.
- 4. <u>Site Lighting Controls.</u> Site lighting shall be located and oriented so as to minimize glare and spillover onto adjacent roadways and residential areas. Site lighting standards shall be limited to 20' maximum height. Site lighting shall be reduced to minimum security levels at close of operating hours.
- 5. <u>Severance</u>. The unenforceability, elimination, revision or amendment of any proffer set forth herein, in whole or in part, shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the other proffers or the unaffected part of any such proffer.
- 6. <u>Landscape Buffer.</u> A minimum 25' landscape buffer, planted to "Transitional Buffer 25" standards, shall be provided adjacent to Graham Meadow Drive except to the extent necessary or allowed for utility easements, signage, grading, and other purposes requested and specifically permitted, or if required, at the time of Landscape Plan approval.

475' northwest of its intersection with Miller Road.

On motion of Mr. Nelson, seconded by Mrs. O'Bannon, and by unanimous vote, the Board followed the recommendation of the Planning Commission and approved this item with the following proffered conditions:

- 1. <u>Uses.</u> The property shall only be used for a trucking terminal, including the parking of trucks and trailers, a driver training facility, a maintenance shop, and diesel fuel storage tanks and dispensers, provided that:
 - a. Fuel shall not be sold or dispensed to the general public.
 - b. Walls: Should the use be expanded beyond the driver training facility, the applicant/owner agrees to construct and maintain the following six (6) foot high masonry walls, which will be consistent in materials, design and color with the existing wall located at Parcel 818-707-0077:
 - i. Along the southern property line adjacent to Charles City Road at Parcels 817-707-7588 and 817-707-6693.
 - ii. Within the buffer area along the western property line adjacent to Parcel 817-707-6693.
- 2. <u>Site Plan.</u> The property shall be developed in general conformance with the attached plan entitled: Swift Transportation Trailer Training Facility Conceptual Plan dated June 15, 2015 prepared by Balzer and Associates (see case file) unless alternative plan are requested by the owner and approved by the Planning Commission at the time of Plan and Development review and approval.
 - a. The site shall be designed to allow sufficient area for parking, "stacking," and turning movements, and the owner shall use best efforts to reduce the impacts of the truck traffic on public rights-of-way.
 - b. No trucks or trailers shall be stored or parked on any public right-of-way.

- 3. <u>**Right of Way.**</u> The property owner/developer agrees to dedicate right-of-way along Charles City Road as requested by the Director of Public Works or the Director of Planning.
- 4. <u>Buffers.</u> Landscaped and/or natural buffer areas regulated by provisions for Transitional Buffer 10 (TB10), will be provided and maintained along the property frontage of Parcels 817-707-7588 and 817-707-6693 except to the extent necessary for entrance drives, utility easements, drainage easements, or other purposes required or permitted by the Planning Commission, or the Director of Public Works.
- 5. <u>Lighting.</u> Parking lot lighting fixtures shall not exceed 30 feet in height and shall emit light from concealed sources ("shoebox type fixtures"). Lighting shall be designed to minimize glare and impact of lighting on public roads and adjacent properties.
- 6. **Buildings.** Buildings shall adhere to the following:

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- a. No building or structure shall exceed thirty (30) feet in height as measured from the grade immediately adjacent to the building;
- b. No building shall be covered with or have exposed to view, any painted or unfinished concrete block;
- 7. <u>Dumpster Screening.</u> Dumpsters and trash receptacles shall be screened from public view at ground level at the property lines in a manner approved at the time of Planning of Development review.
- 8. <u>**HVAC Equipment.**</u> Heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) equipment shall be screened from public view at ground level at the property lines in a manner approved at the time of Plan of Development review.
- 9. <u>Signage.</u> Detached signs shall be ground mounted, monument type and shall not exceed ten (10) feet in height.
- 10. Fencing. No barbed wire shall be used on fences or buildings.
- 11. <u>Paved Areas.</u> Permanent driveways and public parking lots shall be paved.
- 12. <u>Use of Gravel.</u> Graveled surfaces for parking areas, roads, and other access drives shall not be permitted. Gravel shall not be used as a primary landscaping material.

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- 13. <u>Outside Speakers.</u> No outside speakers that can be heard from adjacent residential properties, except for lighting warning devices, shall be permitted on the Property.
- 14. <u>Limited Ingress and Egress.</u> Tractor-trailer type vehicles are restricted from direct access onto Charles City Road from the training facility.
- 15. <u>Severance.</u> The unenforceability, elimination, revision or amendment of any proffer set forth herein, in whole or in part, shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the other proffers or the unaffected part of any such proffer.

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193-15Leinster Nutrient Exchange, LLC: Request to conditionally rezone fromREZ2015-A-1 Agricultural District to R-2AC One-Family Residence District00020(Conditional) Parcel 809-732-9704 containing 19 acres located on the eastFairfieldline of Harvie Road approximately 450' north of its intersection with
Harvest Crest Court.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this item.

On motion of Mr. Nelson, seconded by Mrs. O'Bannon, and by unanimous vote, the Board followed the recommendation of the Planning Commission and approved this item with the following proffered conditions:

1. <u>Maximum Density</u>. The maximum number of building lots on the property shall not exceed thirty seven (37).

2. **Dwelling Design.**

a. Maximum Finished Floor Area: The minimum finished floor area for all dwellings shall be fourteen hundred fifty (1,450) square feet. Sixty percent (60%) of all dwellings shall have a minimum square footage of eighteen hundred (1,800) square feet.

b. Exterior Materials: The exterior of all dwellings shall be constructed of brick, brick veneer, fiber cement siding, vinyl, stone, synthetic stone, or similar masonry material. If vinyl is used then the thickness of the vinyl shall be a minimum of 0.046" and manufacturer's printed literature shall be provided as evidence at the time of building permit application. A minimum of 50% of the dwellings shall have 30% brick or stone on the dwelling's front façade, exclusive of the exterior foundation. Roof shingles shall be warranted to last at least thirty (30) years.

c. Foundations: The main portion of the dwellings shall be constructed with crawl space foundations. The exposed exterior portion of all foundations, front stoops and front steps, shall be brick, brick veneer, stone, synthetic stone or similar masonry material.

d. Fireplace Chimneys: The exposed portion of a fireplace chimney shall be clad in brick, brick veneer, stone, synthetic stone or similar masonry material. No chimney or gas vent unit shall be cantilevered. This proffer shall not apply to direct vent gas fireplaces or appliances.

e. Garages: Each dwelling shall be constructed with a garage and at least fifty percent (50%) of dwellings shall have a two-car garage. Front access two-car garages shall have interior dimensions free of asbuilt obstruction of at least 18 feet in width and at least 20 feet in depth. Front access one-car garages shall have interior dimensions free of as-built obstructions of at least 10 feet in width and at least 20 feet in depth. Side access two-car garages shall have interior dimensions free of as-built obstruction of at least 18 feet in width and at least 20 feet in depth. Side access two-car garages shall have interior dimensions free of as-built obstruction of at least 18 feet in width and at least 18.5 feet in depth. Side access one-car garages shall have interior dimensions free of as-built obstructions of at least 18 feet in width and at least 20 feet in depth. Any areas above garage doors exceeding four (4) feet in height shall include an architectural feature to break up the visual mass.

f. Cantilevering: No closets or windows shall be cantilevered.

g. Windows: All side elevations in homes shall contain a minimum of one window. All side elevations that are adjacent to a public right-ofway shall contain a minimum of two windows except when the side elevation includes a garage.

- 3. <u>Elevations</u>. The architectural appearance of the dwellings shall be generally consistent with the buildings depicted by Exhibit A attached hereto (see case file), unless otherwise requested and approved by the Director of Planning.
- 4. <u>Landscaping and Foundation Plantings and Buffering.</u> All homes shall be provided a landscape package. A diversity of plant materials will be used, including a variety of ground cover, plants and trees.

a. Lot landscaping: Prior to the issuance of a final C.O. for any individual dwelling, a minimum of 6 trees or shrubs (or a combination thereof) shall be provided for the front elevations.

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b. Street trees: Street trees shall be provided along both sides of all internal roadways at a minimum of two per lot with a maximum spacing of 40 feet along street property lines and within 10 feet of the property line (right-of-way), unless otherwise approved at the time of subdivision review. Cul-de-sac lots shall only require one street tree per lot.

c. Sod: Front yards and side yards (to the rear elevation of the main structure) shall be sodded. Irrigation shall be installed unless a drought-tolerant grass is planted.

- 5. <u>Driveways.</u> All driveways shall be constructed of exposed aggregate, concrete, brick, stone, asphalt or pre-cast pavers. Gravel driveways shall not be permitted.
- 6. <u>Sidewalks.</u> A County standard sidewalk shall be provided along one side of Road A, as shown on Exhibit B (see case file), and along the east line of Harvie Road.
- 7. <u>Fencing</u>. A six (6) foot privacy fence shall be installed as shown on Exhibit B (see case file) and shall be installed prior the first certificate of occupancy. Fence materials shall either be vinyl or double-sided wood.
- 8. <u>Underground Utilities.</u> All utilities except for junction boxes, meters and existing overhead utility lines or for technical or environmental reasons shall be installed underground.
- 9. <u>Storm-Water Facilities.</u> Any permanent wet pond shall be aerated and landscaped as approved at the time of construction plan review. Any permanent dry pond shall be screened from any public and/or private roadways with landscaping as approved at the time of construction plan review.
- 10. **Protective Covenants/Homeowners Association**. Prior to or concurrent with the recordation of the subdivision plat approved by the County and before the conveyance of any portion of the Property covered by said subdivision plat (other than for the dedication of easements, roads or utilities), a document shall be recorded in the Clerk's Office of the Circuit Court of Henrico County, Virginia, setting forth controls on the development and maintenance of such portions of the Property. In addition, there shall be a Homeowners

Association of the property owners that shall be responsible for the enforcement of the restrictive covenants and the maintenance of the common area, which common area shall include the areas noted on the Concept Plan (see case file) as buffers, open space and SWM/BMP. These proffers accepted with this case (see case file) shall be attached as an exhibit to and recorded with such protective covenants. The restrictive covenants shall provide for uniform mailboxes and post lights.

- 11. <u>Severance.</u> The unenforceability, elimination, revision or amendment of any proffer set forth herein, in whole or in part, shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the other proffers or the unaffected part of any such proffer.
- 12. <u>Conceptual Site Plan.</u> The Property shall be developed generally consistent with Exhibit B (see case file). Stub Road E shall be constructed to Henrico County standards and paved.
- 13. <u>Hours of Construction.</u> The hours of exterior construction, including operation of bulldozers and other earthmoving equipment, shall be between 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, and 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. on Saturday, except in emergencies or where unusual circumstances require extending the specific hours in order to complete work such as concrete pours or utility connections. Exceptions shall require the Director of Planning's approval. Construction signs shall be posted in English and in Spanish. The construction sign shall state the hours of construction.
- 14. <u>Compliance Certification</u>. Upon request by the Director of Planning, the developer shall provide the County with the necessary calculations that illustrate that the dwellings and lots constructed in the subdivision are in compliance with all the allowable and required percentages set forth in these proffers.
- 15. <u>Entrance Sign.</u> Any entrance sign and landscaping shall be placed at the entry to the subdivision along Harvie Road. The sign shall be a monument sign constructed of brick, brick veneer, stone, synthetic stone or similar masonry material, or some combination thereof.

194-15 KCA/Bedford, LLC: Request to conditionally rezone from A-1 REZ2015-Agricultural District and RTHC Residential Townhouse District 00026 (Conditional) to RTHC Residential Townhouse District (Conditional) Three Chopt Parcels 747-770-3395 and 747-770-4264 containing 10.1 acres located along the west line of Nuckols Road at its intersection with New Wade Lane.

Mr. Emerson responded to questions from Mr. Kaechele.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this item.

On motion of Mr. Kaechele, seconded by Mr. Glover, and by unanimous vote, the Board followed the recommendation of the Planning Commission and approved this item with the following proffered conditions:

- 1. <u>Conceptual Master Plan.</u> Development of the Property shall be in general conformance with the Conceptual Master Plan attached hereto as Exhibit A entitled "Bedford Falls at Hickory Grove Conceptual Plan, Section 1 & 2, Henrico County" prepared by Cite Design, (the "Concept Plan"), (see case file) which Concept Plan is conceptual in nature and may vary in detail, unless otherwise requested and specifically approved at the time of Plan of Development and/or subdivision review.
- 2. <u>Entrance Feature.</u> An entrance feature shall be provided at the northernmost access to the Property in general conformance with the plan entitled "The Villas at Hickory Grove, Henrico County, Virginia, Exhibit B: Conceptual Entrance Design" prepared by Cite Design and attached hereto (see case file), unless otherwise requested and specifically approved at the time of Plan of Development and/or subdivision review.
- 3. <u>Protective Covenants.</u> Prior to or concurrent with the recordation of a subdivision plat approved by the County and before the conveyance of any portion of the Property covered by said subdivision plat (other than for the dedication of easements, roads or utilities), a document shall be recorded in the Clerk's Office of the Circuit Court of Henrico County, Virginia, setting forth controls on the development and maintenance of such portions of the Property.
- 4. <u>Sidewalks.</u> Sidewalks shall be provided along both sides of the internal private roadway as shown on the Concept Plan (see case file) and along Nuckols Road.

5. <u>Underground Utilities.</u> Except for junction boxes, meters, pedestals, transformers, transmission mains and existing overhead utility lines and technical or environmental reasons, all utility lines shall be underground.

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- 5. <u>Best Management Practice.</u> Any Best Management Practice structures shall be located outside of any landscaped buffer within the Property, except as a landscaping amenity or water-related feature and if requested and specifically permitted by the Director of Planning or the Planning Commission at the time of subdivision and/or Plan of Development review. Any above-ground wet Best Management Practice structure shall include an aeration feature to move water within such structure.
- 7. <u>Minimum Sizes.</u> The minimum finished floor area of each home shall be 1,865 square feet.
- 8. <u>Architectural Treatment.</u> Townhomes constructed on the Property shall be generally in conformance with the elevations attached hereto as "Bedford Falls Architectural Elevations" Page 1 ", "Bedford Falls Architectural Elevations" Page 2" and "Bedford Falls Architectural Elevations" Page 3" (see case file), unless requested and approved by the Director of Planning at the time of Plan of Development review.
- 9. <u>Building Materials.</u> All buildings shall have exposed exterior walls (above grade and exclusive of windows, gables, doors, trim, soffit and fascia) of stone, stone veneer, brick, hardi-plank, engineered wood (e.g. LP Smartside), or a combination of the foregoing unless different architectural treatment and/or materials are specifically approved with respect to the exposed portion of any such wall, at the time of Plan of Development review. A minimum of thirty-five (35) percent in the aggregate, of the exterior portions of the front building wall surfaces of each building, excluding windows, doors, breezeways, gables and architectural design features, shall be of brick, stone or stone veneer construction.
- 10. <u>Foundations.</u> All finished floor areas, except basements, shall be constructed above grade or give the appearance of being constructed above grade. The exterior portions of all residential foundations, including the exterior portion of foundations below the first floor level which is visible above grade, shall be constructed of brick, stone or stone veneer. There shall be a minimum vertical height of twelve (12) inches of brick, stone or stone veneer above grade utilized on slab-on-grade foundations to present the appearance of a crawl space.

- 11. <u>Cantilevering</u>. There shall be no cantilevered treatment of any architectural features on the first floor. Items on the second floor such as balconies, decks, box or bay-type windows may be cantilevered, but shall include decorative corbels.
- 12. <u>Sound Suppression</u>. Interior walls between homes shall have a minimum sound transmission coefficient rating of 54. A cross-sectional detail, reviewed and approved by a certified architect or engineer as to the methodology to accomplish the sound coefficient rating, shall be included in building permit application.
- 13. <u>Garages.</u> Each home shall include a minimum of a one (1) car attached garage.
- 14. **Driveways.** All driveways directly serving homes shall be constructed of concrete, aggregate materials, asphalt, brick or stone pavers.
- 15. <u>Marketing.</u> All homes shall be marketed for sale as "Owneroccupied".
- 16. <u>Private Street.</u> Prior to issuance of a permanent Certificate of Occupancy for any home, the developer shall provide the Planning Department certification from a licensed engineering firm that the roadway within the development was constructed according to the approved plan and in compliance with Henrico County road design standards and specifications, to include proper compaction of sub-base soils, utility trenches, base stone and asphalt, but excluding road widths, turning radii, cross over and entrance spacing, sight distance and vertical curves, or a bond in an amount satisfactory to the Director of the Department of Public Works shall be provided to Henrico County for items not yet completed. The internal road within the Property shall be private and shall be maintained by the Homeowners Association.
- 17. <u>Street Lights.</u> Street lights shall be provided and shall not exceed sixteen (16) feet in height. The street lights shall be non-glare and residential in character. Direct embedded light poles and standards shall be prohibited.
- 18. <u>Density</u>. There shall be no more than seventy nine (79) residential units developed on the Property.
- 19. <u>Landscaped Median</u>. Landscaping and trees shall be provided within the grassy medians within the Property as generally shown on the Concept Plan. Actual plantings shall be depicted on a plan to be

approved at the time of Plan of Development or Landscape Plan approval.

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- 20. <u>Access.</u> There shall be no direct vehicular access to and from the Property to and from Nuckols Road, unless otherwise requested and specifically approved at the time of Plan of Development and/or subdivision review.
- 21. <u>Greenbelt.</u> A greenbelt, exclusive of adjacent lots, for landscaping and/or natural areas shall be provided a minimum of twenty-five (25) feet in width adjacent to the ultimate right-of-way line of Nuckols Road except to the extent necessary for utility easements, signage, fencing, and other purposes requested and specifically permitted, or if required, at the time of Plan of Development and/or subdivision review, or by any other governmental body. Any utility easements (other than existing utility easements) permitted within the aforesaid greenbelt area shall be extended generally perpendicular to the greenbelt area unless otherwise requested and specifically permitted or if required by the County at the time of landscape plan review.
- 22. <u>Units in a Row.</u> There shall be no more than six (6) residential units developed in a row on the Property.
- 23. <u>Amenity.</u> A park area with benches shall be provided within the passive amenity area generally as shown on the Concept Plan (see case file).
- 24. <u>Front Yards.</u> Front yards shall initially be sodded and irrigated, exclusive of mulched flowerbeds and landscaping.
- 25. <u>Severance.</u> The unenforceability, elimination, revision or amendment of any proffer set forth herein, in whole or in part, shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the other proffers or the unaffected part of any such proffer.
- 26. <u>No Access to New Wade Lane.</u> There shall be no direct vehicular access to and from the Property to and from New Wade Lane, unless otherwise requested and specifically approved at the time of Plan of Development and/or subdivision review.

ORDINANCE — To Amend and Reordain Section 10-199 of the Code of the County of Henrico Titled "Discharges to storm sewer system" to Conform the County Code to the County's Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System Permit

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF HENRICO, VIRGINIA:

1. That Section 10-199 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained as follows:

Sec. 10-199. Discharges to storm sewer system.

- (a) It shall be unlawful to:
 - (1) Cause or allow illicit discharges to the county's storm sewer system;
 - (2) Discharge materials other than stormwater to the storm sewer system by spills, dumping or disposal without a VPDES permit;
 - (3) Cause or allow industrial discharges into the storm sewer system without a VPDES permit; or
 - (4) Violate any condition or provision of this article or any permit granted for stormwater discharges.

(b) Subject to the provisions of subsection (c) of this section, tThe following activities shall not be unlawful as illicit discharges under this article <u>unless the State Water Control Board or</u> the director determines the activity to be a significant source of pollutants to surface waters:

- (1) Water line flushing;
- (2) Landscape irrigation;

(3) Diverteding stream flows or raising groundwater;

(4) Rising ground waters;

(5) Infiltration of Uuncontaminated groundwater infiltration (as defined at 40 CFR

Part 35.2005(20));

(6) Pumping of uUncontaminated <u>pumped</u> groundwater from potable water sources,

foundation drains, irrigation waters, springs or water from crawl spaces or footing drains;

(7) Discharges from potable water sources;

(8) Foundation drains;

(9) Air conditioning condensation;

(10) Irrigation water;

(11) Springs;

(12) Water from crawl space pumps;

(13) Footing drains;

(14) Lawn watering;

(15) Individual <u>residential</u> car washing on-residential properties;

(16) Charity and fund-raising car washing;

(17) Flows from riparian habitats and wetlands;

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(18) Dechlorinated swimming pool discharges; and

(19) Street washing water;

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(20) Discharges or flows from firefighting activities; and

(21) Other activities generating discharges identified by the Department of Environmental Quality as not requiring VPDES authorization.


(c) If the State Water Control Board or the director determines that an activity listed in subsection (b) is a significant source of pollutants to state waters, the director shall notify the person performing such activity and shall order that such activity be stopped or conducted in such manner as to avoid the discharge of pollutants in <u>state</u> waters. The failure to comply with any such order shall constitute a violation of the provisions of this article.

2. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect on and after its passage.

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


