Mr. Thornton called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Mr. Thornton led the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

Major Humberto I. Cardounel, Jr., Deputy Chief of Police for the Investigative Bureau, delivered the invocation.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Glover, the Board approved the minutes of the November 10, 2015, Regular and Special Meetings.

MANAGER'S COMMENTS

This is the seventh year Henrico County has been recognized in the Virginia Association of Counties (VACo) Green Government Challenge for its commitment to environmental stewardship. The Green Government Challenge is a friendly competition between counties throughout the Commonwealth to encourage and support green practices and sustainability in governmental operations. The VACo scorecard for this competition considers many areas of sustainability. These include creating an energy or sustainability plan, conducting energy audits at County facilities, and purchasing power from renewable energy sources. A strong green building program with LEED-registered facilities is also part of this competition. Mr. Vithoulkas thanked Energy Manager Jerry Walker and General Services Director John Neal for their efforts in Henrico's promotion of conservation and sustainability.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' COMMENTS

Mr. Nelson thanked Community Revitalization Director Mark Strickler and his staff for doing a tremendous job in hosting a community meeting at Henrico Theatre on November 23. The meeting introduced the Highland Springs revitalization initiative and a proposal for a National Register district in this area of Henrico County.

Mr. Nelson noted he was at Highland Springs High School earlier in the day, where he witnessed the principal acknowledging academic excellence for the first nine weeks of the school year. Close to 800 students, almost half of the student body, made the honor roll. Mr. Nelson pointed out that his son, TJ, was in the audience observing the meeting and is a tenth-grade honor roll student at Highland Springs with a 4.2 grade point average.

Mr. Kaechele recognized Tommy Branin, the Supervisor-Elect from the Three Chopt District, who was in the audience observing the meeting.

Mr. Thornton mentioned the recent passing of Leonard W. Lambert, Sr. Mr. Lambert was born in Henrico County and graduated from Virginia Randolph High School and Virginia Union University. Mr. Thornton characterized Mr. Lambert as an outstanding lawyer, a devoted family man and husband, and an illustrious person.

PUBLIC HEARING ITEMS

Kevin Wilhite, Principal Planner, narrated a slide presentation on this item. He pointed out zoning classifications in the vicinity of the site, provided aerial views of the property, and reviewed proposed facility and site improvements contained in the master plan of development. Mr. Wilhite then responded to questions from Mr. Kaechele and Mr. Glover. He noted two playground areas were added to the plan in response to citizen concerns expressed at a community meeting held on November 12.

The following persons addressed the Board during the public hearing and expressed a number of concerns relating to the proposed master plan of development, including proposed uses and types of facilities, lighting and noise generation, buffering, traffic, road improvements, and drainage: Julie Bell, a resident of 11154 Greenwood Road; Ronald Carter, a resident of 10909 Greenwood Road; Stephen Cutwright, a resident of 11101 Greenwood Road; Nancy Ward, a resident of 11123 Greenwood Road; Kim Novelli, a resident of 11061 Forest Trace Way; Jennifer Johnson, a resident of 11611 Bent Pine Road; Vincent Novelli, a resident of 11061 Forest Trace Way; Holly Herbert, a resident of 11611 Bent Pine Road; Debbie Southall, a resident of 3000 Quail Walk Drive; Cathy Harrison, a resident of 11607 Bent Pine Road; Leslie Sorrells, a resident of 11115 Greenwood Road; and Bob Arnett, a resident of 11607 Bent Pine Road. Ms. Bell requested that public water and sewer be extended along Greenwood Road between Braxton Road and Quail Walk Drive as part of the Greenwood Park project.

Mr. Glover addressed several of the concerns voiced by the speakers. Steve Yob, Director of Public Works, assured Mr. Glover that staff has determined how to manage drainage on the subject site without impacting Greenwood Road residents. Mr. Glover noted he has been talking about a locating a recreation area on this property since the late 1990s. He remarked that he believes the proposed sports complex will be a tremendous amenity to the County and nearby residential neighborhoods. In response to a comment by Mr. Kaechele, Mr. Glover pointed out the County will continue to address citizen concerns as plans of development are considered for each phase of the park.

On motion of Mr. Glover, seconded by Mr. Kaechele, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item – see attached resolution.

Following the vote on this item, Ms. Ward addressed the Board again and commented on the projected vehicle trips for the park development. Mr. Glover responded to her comments.

Shawn Nelson, a resident of the Varina District and Military Veteran who served in the Middle East, expressed concerns regarding the potential settlement of Syrian refugees in the local community and the incompatibility of Middle Eastern Islamic ideology with western culture. Sarah Matthews, Mr. Nelson's fiancée, reiterated his concerns and suggested there is a need for a transition plan and strategy to protect the community.

WHEREAS, an application has been submitted for approval of POD2015-00108, Greenwood Park Master Plan, to construct a public park to include eight lighted synthetic turf playing fields, one lighted synthetic turf championship field within a 3,000 seat stadium, eight sand volleyball courts, a multipurpose building, one large pavilion, two small pavilions, restroom buildings, a playground, pedestrian trails, assorted shelters, and related parking facilities; and,

WHEREAS, the 197.71 acre site is located along the north line of Greenwood Road and the west line of Bent Pine Road, approximately 1,580 feet west of the intersection of Greenwood Road and Woodman Road, on parcels 774-771-7084, 775-771-7259, 775-773-3004, and 777-771-6782 is zoned A-1, Agricultural District, R-5AC, General Residence District (Conditional) and R-6C, General Residence District (Conditional); and is located in the Brookland District; and,

WHEREAS, the County Administration, including the Division of Recreation & Parks, the Department of Planning, the Department of Public Works, the Department of Public Utilities, the Division of Fire, the Division of Police, and the Office of Building Construction and Inspections, has reviewed the application and recommends approval of it subject to the staff recommendations and the staff plan dated November 24, 2015; and,

- 1. The Director of Public Utilities shall approve the construction plans for public water and sewer prior to beginning any construction of these utilities. The Department of Public Utilities shall be notified at least 24 hours prior to the start of any County water or sewer construction.
- 2. The parking lot shall be subject to the requirements of Section 24-98 of the Henrico County Code.
- 3. The parking spaces shall be marked on the pavement surface with four-inch wide white painted traffic lines. All lane lines and parking lines shall be white in color with the exception that those dividing traffic shall be yellow.
- 4. Sufficient, effective usable parking shall be provided. If experience indicates the need, additional parking shall be provided.
- 5. Curb and gutter and necessary storm sewer shall be constructed as shown on approved plans.
- 6. The plan of development shall be revised as annotated on the staff plan dated November 24, 2015, which shall be as much a part of this approval as if its details were fully described herein. Nine sets of revised plans, including the detailed drainage, erosion control, and utility plans, shall be submitted by the design engineer who prepared the plans to the Department of Planning for final review. Upon notice from the Department of Planning that all comments have been addressed, 14 sets of final plans for signature shall be submitted to the Department of Planning for approval signatures.
- 7. The Department of Public Works shall be notified at least 24 hours prior to the start of any construction.
- 8. A detailed landscaping plan shall be submitted to the Department of Planning for review and approval prior to the issuance of any occupancy permits.
- 9. All ground cover and landscaping shall be properly maintained in a healthy condition at all times. Dead plant materials shall be removed within a reasonable time and replaced during the normal planting season.
- 10. Prior to the approval of an electrical permit application and installation of the site lighting equipment, a plan including light spread and intensity diagrams and fixture specifications and mounting height details shall be submitted for Department of Planning review and approval.
- 11. All exterior lighting shall be designed and arranged to direct light and glare away from nearby residential property and streets.
- 12. The site, including the parking areas, shall be kept clean of litter and debris on a daily basis. Trash container units/litter receptacles and recycling containers shall be maintained with scheduled regular pickups and shall be screened properly on all four sides. The gate(s) shall remain closed except when the receptacle(s) are being filled or serviced and shall be repaired or replaced as necessary. Details shall be included with the final site plan or required landscape plan review and approval.
- 13. Required fire lanes shall be marked and maintained in accordance with the Virginia Statewide Fire Prevention Code.

- 14. Traffic control signs shall be provided as indicated on the Planning staff plan. All signs shall be fabricated as shown in The National Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways and Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways.
- 15. The assigned property number shall be displayed so it is easily readable from the street. If assistance is needed with the address, please contact the Department of Planning at 501-4284. The Planning Department must assign all property addresses.
- 16. The contractor shall have a set of plans approved by the Director of Public Works, Director of Public Utilities, and the County Manager available at the site at all times when work is being performed. A designated responsible employee shall be available for contact by County inspectors.
- 17. The property shall be developed generally as shown on the plan filed with the case and no major changes or additions to the layout shall be made without the approval of the Board of Supervisors.
- 18. Upon completion of the improvements and prior to the certification of the permanent occupancy permit, the engineer or land surveyor who prepared the POD plan shall furnish a statement to the effect that all construction, including water and sewer, is in conformance with the regulations and requirements of the POD.
- 19. The developer shall provide fire hydrants as required by the Department of Public Utilities and Division of Fire.
- 20. Insurance Service Offices (ISO) calculations should be included on the final construction plans for approval by the Department of Public Utilities prior to issuance of a building permit.
- 21. Any necessary offsite drainage easements must be obtained in a form acceptable to the County Attorney prior to final approval of the construction plans by the Department of Public Works.
- 22. Deviations from County standards for pavement, curb, or curb and gutter design shall be approved by the County Engineer prior to final approval of the construction plans by the Department of Public Works.
- 23. Vehicles shall be parked only in approved and constructed parking spaces.
- 24. The construction shall be properly coordinated to ensure that safe access, circulation and adequate parking is provided for the facility. A plan to indicate the phasing of improvements and the handling of traffic (construction and employees) shall be submitted to the Department of Planning prior to the issuance of a building permit.
- 25. The right-of-way for widening of Greenwood Road as shown on approved plans shall be dedicated to the County prior to any occupancy permits being issued. The right-of-way dedication plat and any other required information shall be submitted to the Director of Real Property at least 60 days prior to requesting occupancy permits.

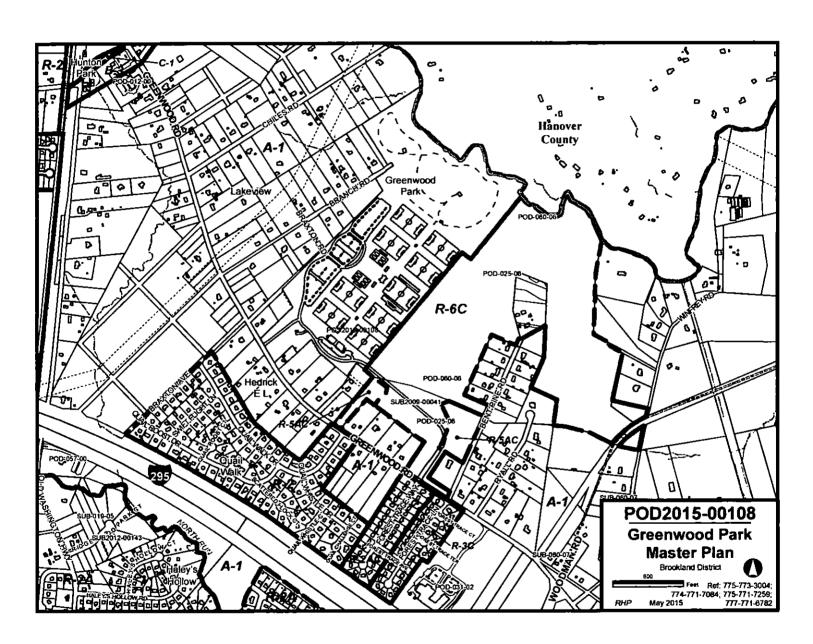

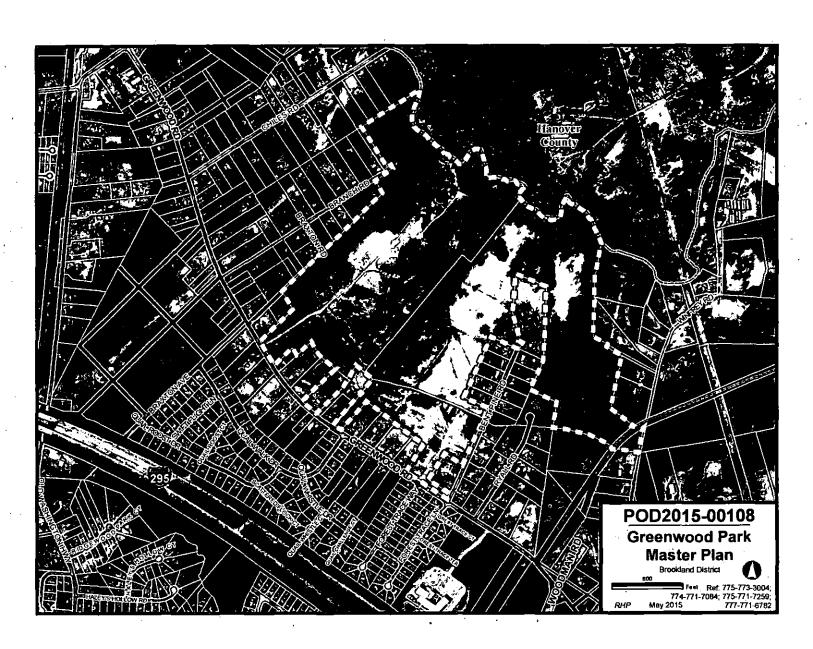

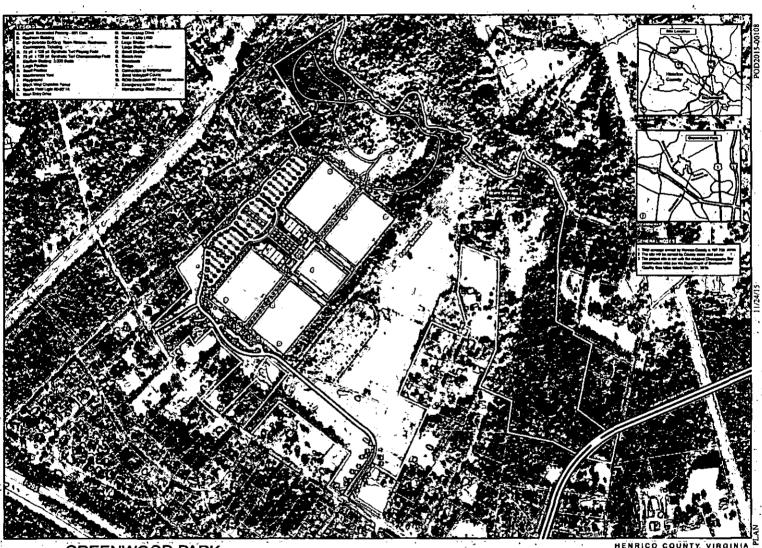

All subsequent detailed plans of development and construction plans needed to implement this conceptual plan may be administratively reviewed and approved and shall be subject to all regulations in effect at the time such subsequent plans are submitted for review/approval.

COMMENTS: The Director of Planning has reviewed the plans submitted by CHA Consulting, Inc. and recommends approval, and the County Manager concurs.





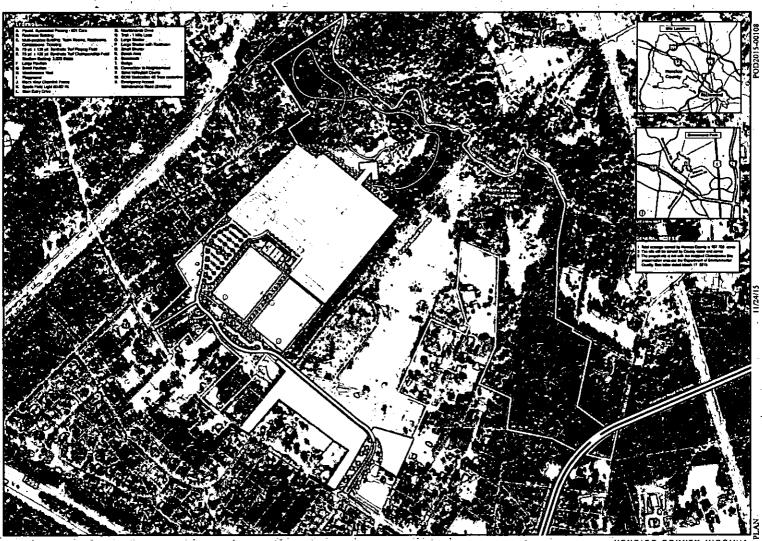


GREENWOOD PARK - MASTER PLAN

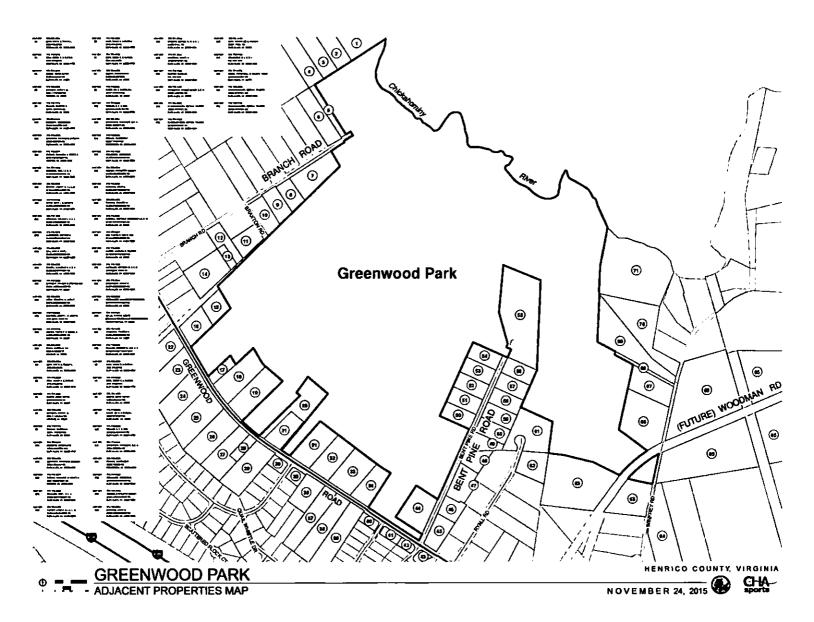

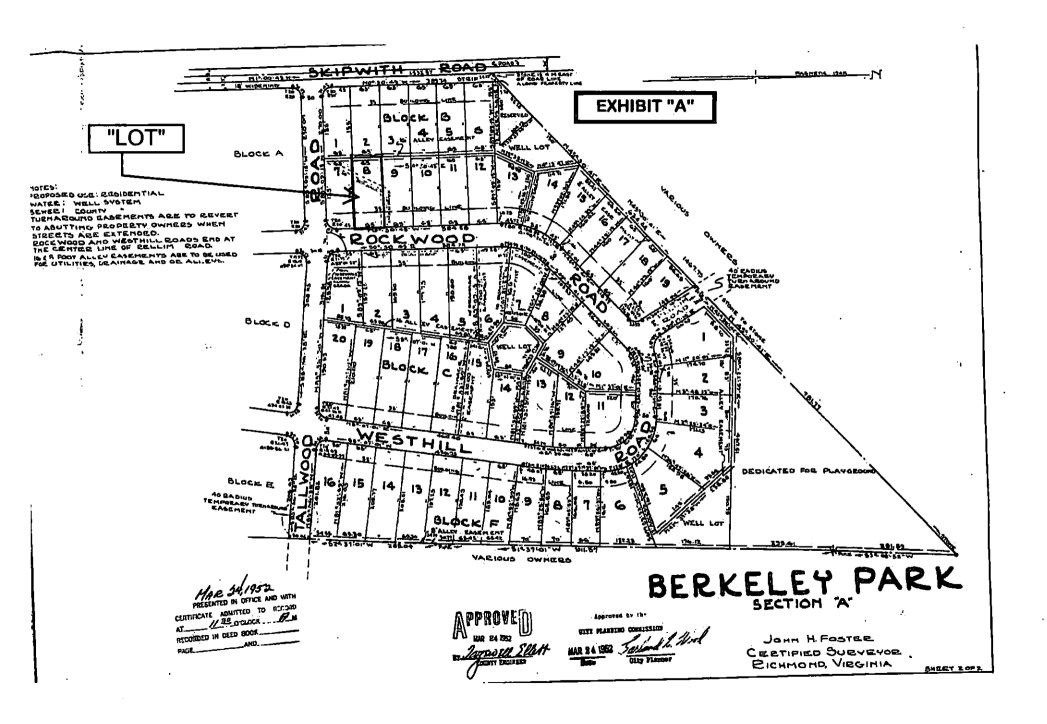

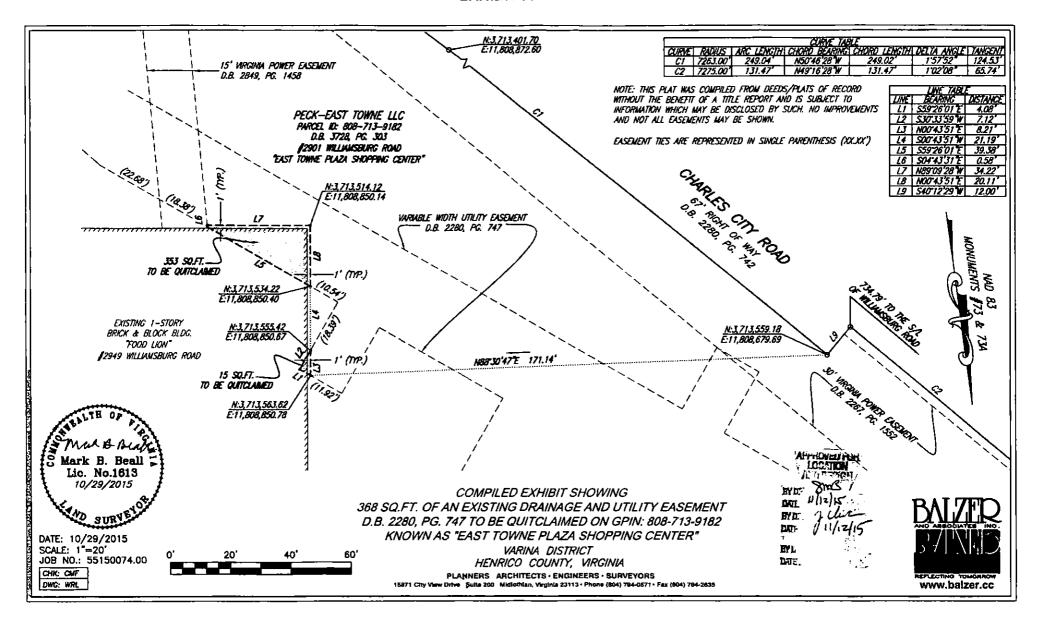

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA REGARDING THE APPROVAL OF ISSUANCE OF BONDS BY THE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY OF DINWIDDIE COUNTY, VIRGINIA FOR THE BENEFIT OF 1701 BYRD AVENUE, LLC, A WHOLLY OWNED SUBSIDIARY OF THE FAISON SCHOOL FOR AUTISM, INC.

WHEREAS, the Industrial Development Authority of Dinwiddie County, Virginia (the "Dinwiddie Authority") is empowered by the Industrial Development and Revenue Bond Act (the "Act") to issue its revenue bonds for the purposes of, among other things, financing or refinancing facilities for use by organizations (other than institutions organized and operated exclusively for religious purposes) that are exempt from taxation pursuant to Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), thereby promoting the safety, health, welfare, convenience, and prosperity of the residents of the Commonwealth of Virginia (the "Commonwealth"); and

WHEREAS, the Dinwiddie Authority received a request from 1701 Byrd Avenue, LLC, a not-for-profit Virginia limited liability company and a wholly owned subsidiary of The Faison School for Autism, Inc., a not-for-profit Virginia corporation (together, the "School"), the principal business address of which is 1701 Byrd Avenue, Henrico, Virginia 23230 (the "School Campus"), for the issuance by the Dinwiddie Authority of its revenue bonds in an amount not to exceed \$6,500,000 (the "Bonds") to assist the School in some or all of the following: (i) refinancing the loan originally used by the School to finance the acquisition of the School Campus, (ii) refinancing the loan originally used by the School to finance the acquisition of land behind the School Campus located at 5311 Markel Road in Henrico, Virginia (the "Markel Land"), (iii) financing its purchase of the land and building located at 1600 Willow Lawn Drive in Henrico, Virginia (the "Willow Lawn Land"), (iv) financing renovations and improvements to the School Campus or the Markel Land, and (v) financing the cost of issuing the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the School Campus, Markel Land, and Willow Lawn Land will be used by the School in furtherance of the School's mission; and

WHEREAS, the School is exempt from income taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code and is not organized and operated exclusively for religious purposes; and

WHEREAS, a fiscal impact statement was presented to the Economic Development Authority of Henrico County, Virginia (the "Henrico Authority") and copies of the School's fiscal impact statement, the Inducement Resolution, the Dinwiddie Authority's Summary of Dinwiddie Public Hearing, which included a reasonably detailed summary of the comments expressed at the Dinwiddie Authority public hearing, will be presented to the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddie County, Virginia (the "Dinwiddie Board") on December 15, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the Dinwiddie Board is expected to approve the issuance of the Bonds by the Dinwiddie Authority in accordance with Section 147(f) of the Code and Section 15.2-4906 of the Act on December 15, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the Henrico Authority held a public hearing on the issuance of the Bonds, following reasonable public notice, as required by, and in compliance with, Section 147(f) of the Code and Section 15.2-4906 of the Act, and adopted a resolution on November 19, 2015 (the "Henrico Authority Resolution") that recommended and requested that the Henrico Board approve the issuance of the Bonds and concur with the Inducement Resolution, effective upon the approval by both the Dinwiddie Authority and the Dinwiddie Board; and

 - 2. The Henrico Board concurs with the Inducement Resolution.
- 3. The approval of the issuance of the Bonds does not constitute an endorsement to a prospective purchaser of the Bonds of the creditworthiness of the School Campus, Markel Land, Willow Lawn Land or the School.
- 4. As required by Section 15.2-4909 of the Act, the Bonds shall provide that neither the Dinwiddie Authority, Dinwiddie County, the Henrico Authority nor Henrico County shall be obligated to pay the Bonds or the interest thereon or other costs incident thereto except from the revenues and moneys pledged therefor, and neither the faith and credit nor the taxing power of the Commonwealth of Virginia nor any political subdivision thereof, including the Dinwiddie

Authority, Dinwiddie County, the Henrico Authority, and Henrico County, shall be pledged thereto.

- 5. The Bonds shall not be issued until all governmental approvals as required by the Act and the Code have been obtained and this Resolution is effective contingent upon the approval by both the Dinwiddie Authority and the Dinwiddie Board.

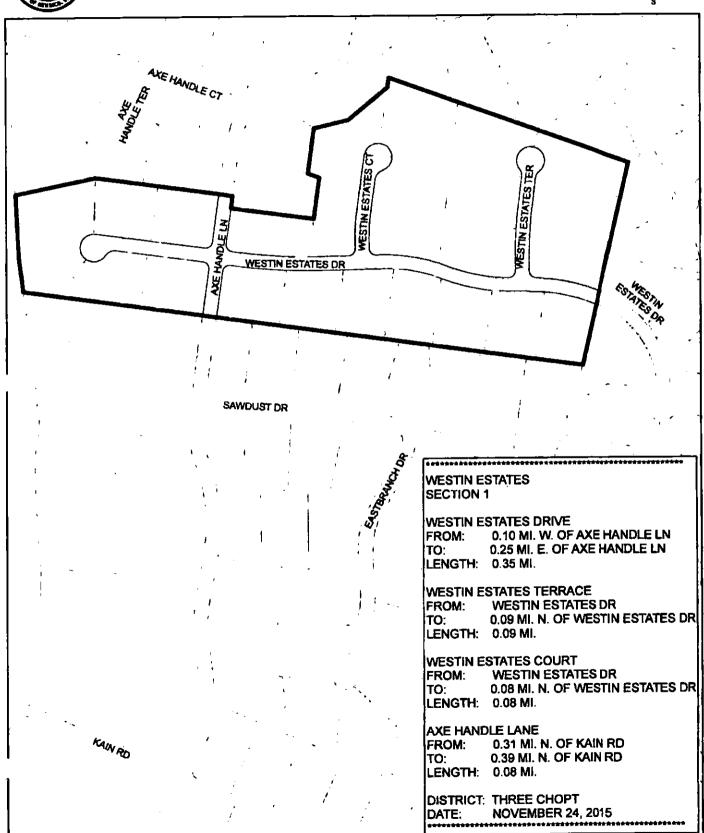

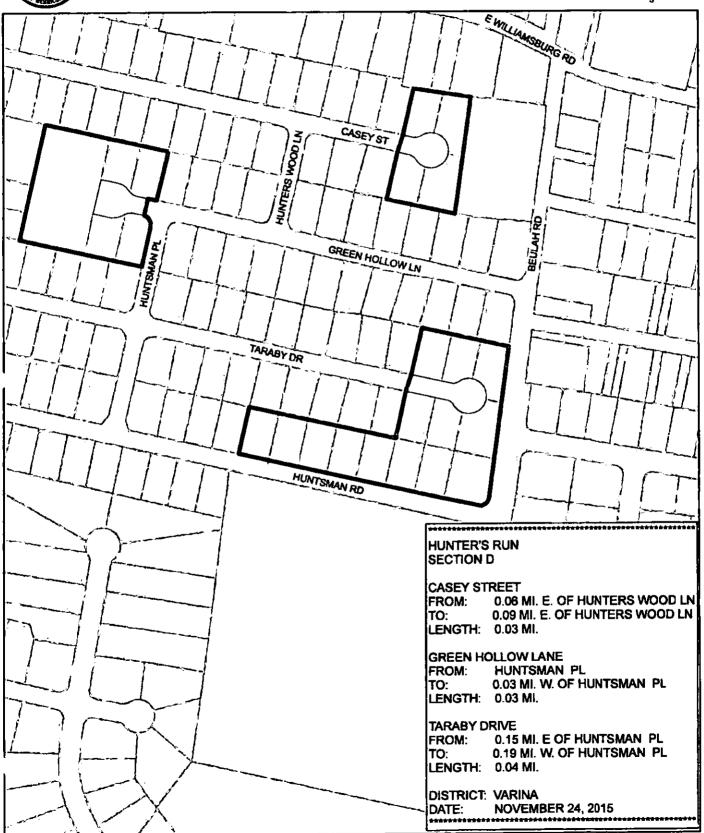
