MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Henrico County has always hired student employees for the summer but did not have a formal internship program until the fall of 2012. Since that time, 132 interns have gained valuable work experience while using their talents and skills to make numerous contributions to the County and its citizens. The internship program is unique because it allows the County to partner with Henrico County Public Schools as well as colleges and universities, and the County also makes sure it is a valuable opportunity for students and is tied directly to their learning goals. This program was recently honored by the National Association of Counties for a Best in Category Achievement Award that Mr. Thornton received personally. Vithoulkas highlighted projects that interns are working on within the Departments of Building Inspections, Finance, and General Services; the Divisions of Fire and Police; and the Community Corrections Program. He noted the County Manager's Office has employed two interns this summer who have worked on some truly remarkable projects. The County has appreciated the many contributions of its interns, and Mr. Vithoulkas offered a personal thank you to them. He also thanked Debbie Lumpkin, Human Resources Analyst and Internship Coordinator, for her Herculean efforts with the internship program under the direction of Paula Reid, Director of Human Resources. Mr. Vithoulkas recognized General Services Department intern Madeleine Leon and Information Technology Department intern Tyler Daig, who shared remarks about their internship experiences. Ms. Leon is a student at Virginia Tech and Mr. Daig attends Mary Washington College. Mr. Thornton remarked that the internship program has proven its worth and the interns are the County's future leaders. On behalf of the Board, he thanked the interns for enriching the County while enriching their own experiences, which he characterized as a win-win situation.


