COUNTY OF HENRICO, VIRGINIA BOARD OF SUPERVISORS REGULAR MEETING June 28, 2016

The Henrico County Board of Supervisors convened a regular meeting on Tuesday, June 28, 2016, at 7:00 p.m. in the Board Room, Administration Building, Henrico County Government Center, Parham and Hungary Spring Roads, Henrico County, Virginia.

Mr. Nelson called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m. and led the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

Pastor Pat Langston, Minister for the Glen Allen Church of Christ, delivered the invocation.

MANAGER'S COMMENTS

In just hours, the severe thunderstorms Henrico County encountered on the night of Thursday, June 16 caused weeks' worth of storm recovery efforts. The County's Police Communications Center received more than 1,000 calls within the first 48 hours of the storm; 88 traffic lights were

without power for days; Henrico's number of citizens and businesses without power was equivalent to the number of outages that occurred during Hurricanes Isabel and Gaston; the Department of Public Works has processed 5,753 orders for debris pickup; and approximately \$2.2 million in damages has been assessed on properties located in Henrico. The County's recovery process began before the storm was finished. The Emergency Operations Center was activated the night of the storm; debris and water relief efforts were in place the following morning; 300 trees were removed from rights-of-way; and all of the County's public safety agencies were working overtime for days to protect and assist the community in the recovery. Mr. Vithoulkas publicly thanked Anna McRay, Deputy Coordinator of Emergency Management, who was on vacation not present. Additionally, he thanked the following agencies, which were represented by their department heads, for superior performance in the County's recovery efforts: the Divisions of Fire, Police, and Recreation and Parks; the Sheriff's Office; and the Departments of Building Construction and Inspections, General Services, Public Utilities, and Public Works. At Mr. Vithoulkas' request, Fire Chief Tony McDowell provided comments on behalf of all the agencies that were directly involved in the County's response efforts.

Henrico County Television (HCTV) producer Gene Byard has won an Emmy Award from the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences for his program, "Ringing the Bell: Police and Fire Chaplains in Henrico County." The 17-minute feature focuses on the volunteer ministers who provide pastoral care and spiritual support to the first responders and residents of Henrico. While this Emmy marks the first won by Mr. Byard, the department has been nominated 13 times and has won a total of six Emmy awards in the past ten years. This is particularly significant given that the academy does not distinguish between government and forprofit, private sector, big budget, small budget, or no budget productions. Mr. Vithoulkas congratulated Mr. Byard and HCTV for this outstanding achievement and for putting Henrico County in the national spotlight. Joining Mr. Byard for this recognition were Public Relations & Media Services Director Tamra McKinney and Assistant Director Ben Sheppard.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' COMMENTS

On behalf of the Board, Mr. Nelson thanked Chief McDowell, Police Chief Humberto Cardounel, General Services Director John Neal, Public Works Director Steve Yob, Recreation and Parks Director Neil Luther, and Sheriff Mike Wade for doing a tremendous job leading the troops in the aftermath of the storm. Mrs. O'Bannon offered a special thanks to the Department of Public Works for fielding calls from citizens and quickly removing trees from County rights-of-way. Mr. Branin gave special recognition to the Division of Recreation and Parks for clearing storm debris and repairing storm damage at Short Pump Park while preparing for the park's grand opening on June 25.

Mr. Nelson recognized the following Boy Scouts from Troop 501, sponsored by Laurel Hill United Methodist Church, who were observing the meeting to fulfill rank requirements: Ivan Bryant (Scout), Raven Earp (Second Class), Christopher Hess (Tenderfoot), Joseph Shaw (First Class), Mason Story (Star), Seth Story (Second Class), and Robert Wash (First Class). He also recognized Parker Gregory from Troop 776, sponsored by the Knights of Columbus/Columbian Center, who was observing the meeting to fulfill requirements for the First Class rank.

Mark Strickler, Director of Community Revitalization, narrated a brief slide presentation on the FY 2016-17 consolidated plan for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME), and Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG) programs. He noted a net increase in the U.S. Housing and Urban Development's allocation over the previous year despite a decrease in the CDBG allocation. Mr. Strickler pointed out staff was recommending funding for 23 of the 25 requests received. He identified the sources and proposed uses of CDBG, HOME, and ESG program funds for FY 2016-17. Mr. Strickler responded to questions from Mr. Glover and Mrs. O'Bannon regarding the process for allocating and administering the County's entitlements.

Mr. Branin commented that he met with the Innsbrook Owners Association Board of Directors one month ago and experienced the excitement, teamwork, and energy to move Innsbrook forward into the future.

- (3) A traffic impact study prepared by an individual or firm qualified to conduct traffic engineering studies in a manner and form acceptable to the county traffic engineer.
- (4) Fiscal impact of the proposed project, such as estimated tax revenues to be generated versus the cost of public improvements to be financed by the county or otherwise. Such study shall be prepared by an individual or firm qualified to conduct fiscal impact analysis in a manner and form acceptable to the director of finance, director of public works, director of planning, or their designees.
- (5) Impact of construction and permanent changes in land use upon surrounding property, such as aesthetics, vegetation, stormwater drainage, and noise, air or water pollution.
- (6) Employment opportunities to be generated by the project.
- (7) Impact of the project on cultural and historic sites.
- 2. That Section 24-34 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained, as follows:
 - **Sec. 24-34. Development standards.** The development standards set out below shall be in lieu of the standards required elsewhere in this chapter:
 - (a) Minimum area. A project must contain at least 20 acres unless the project is located within the Innsbrook Redevelopment overlay district as described in section 24-92.4 and contains

(a) Purpose. The purpose of the Innsbrook Redevelopment overlay district is to enhance and provide flexibility for redevelopment projects within the overlay district by:

- (1) Using different minimum area requirements for Urban Mixed Use projects in accordance with section 24-34(a),
- (2) Encouraging use of development policies adopted with the Innsbrook Area Study contained in the 2026 Land Use Plan adopted by the board of supervisors on September 14, 2010,
- (3) Protecting landowners from possible adverse impacts of adjoining development, and

- (c) Building height. Building heights shall be limited as follows:
 - (1) Buildings within 150 feet of a one-family dwelling existing on June 28, 2016, shall not exceed 45 feet in height except as provided in section 24-95(a)(1).
 - (2) Buildings more than 150 feet and up to 300 feet from a one-family dwelling existing on June 28, 2016, shall not exceed 80 feet in height except as provided in section 24-95(a)(1).
- (d) Internal circulation. Properties within the overlay district shall provide vehicular and pedestrian circulation between adjacent properties unless otherwise approved by the director of planning due to design considerations such as utility conflicts, steep topography, or other factors. Copies of applicable cross access agreements shall be provided at the request of the director of planning.
- (e) Development standards. Implementation of the development policies adopted with the Innsbrook Area Study is strongly encouraged.
- 4. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect on and after its passage as provided by law.

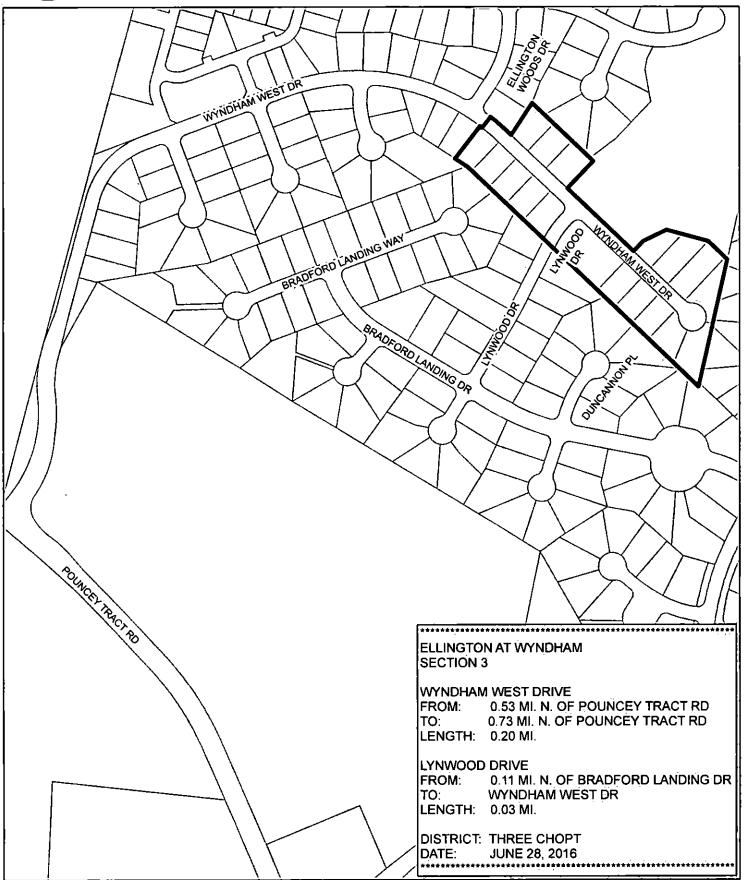
