MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Stafford County Administrator Anthony Romanello was introduced as Henrico County's new Deputy County Manager for Administration. Mr. Romanello previously served as Deputy County Administrator of Stafford and Town Manager of West Point. He also held several positions with the City of Richmond, including Deputy Director of Human Services Administration, Deputy Director of Administration of Public Health, and Assistant to the City Manager. A graduate of Hermitage High School, Mr. Romanello earned his Bachelor's degree in History and American Government from the University of Virginia and a Master's degree in Public Administration from Virginia Commonwealth University.

Supreme Court of Virginia Chief Justice Donald W. Lemmon has invited Senior Assistant County Attorney Rhysa South to join the faculty for the Virginia State Bar Harry L. Carrico Professionalism Course. All newly licensed Virginia lawyers must take this course within one year of their admission to the bar. The faculty is selected from among Virginia's best judges and lawyers. Ms. South will join the faculty for a three-year term, beginning in October and running through October 2019.

Since fall 2012, the County has hosted 206 interns in 18 of its agencies, which have provided valuable work experience while using the interns' talents and skills to make numerous contributions to Henrico County and its citizens. The 56 interns who are working for the County this summer represent 8 high schools and 19 colleges. Debbie Lumpkin, Human Resources Analyst and Internship Coordinator, introduced two students who gave remarks on their internship experiences – Annie Zhang, who attends Maggie L. Walker Governor's School and is working in Libbie Mill Library, and Devin Belle, who attends Virginia Commonwealth University and is working in the Planning Department. Ms. Lumpkin shared a video testimonial from a third student, Ian Spangler, who was unable to be present. Mr. Spangler attended the University of Mary Washington and is working in the Planning Department. Mary Clay Watt, who attends Christopher Newport University and is working in the Department of Public Relations & Media Services, created the video.
